7	Section 1. Section 3101(b) of Title 20 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
9	§ 3101. Payments to family and funeral directors.

11	(b) Deposit accountAny bank, savings association, savings
12	and loan association, building and loan association, credit
13	union or other savings organization, at any time after the death
14	of a depositor, member or certificate holder, may pay the amount
15	on deposit or represented by the certificate, when the total
16	standing to the credit of the decedent in that institution does
17	not exceed \$3,500, to the spouse, any child, the father or
18	mother [or] _{L} any sister or brother <u>or any grandchild</u> (preference

being given in the order named) of the deceased depositor, 1 member or certificate holder, provided that a receipted funeral 2 bill or an affidavit, executed by a licensed funeral director 3 which sets forth that satisfactory arrangements for payment of 4 funeral services have been made, is presented. Any bank, 5 association, union or other savings organization making such a 6 7 payment shall be released to the same extent as if payment had 8 been made to a duly appointed personal representative of the decedent and it shall not be required to see to the application 9 10 thereof. Any person to whom payment is made shall be answerable therefor to anyone prejudiced by an improper distribution. 11 * * * 12
