## AN ACT

Amending Title 25 (Elections) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in voter registration, further providing for 2 methods of voter registration, providing for electronic voter registration application and further providing for preparation and distribution of applications; in changes in 3 5 records, further providing for change of enrollment of 6 political party and for altering registration; and conferring powers and imposing duties on the Department of State. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 1321 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania 11 12 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 13 § 1321. Methods of voter registration. An individual qualified to register to vote under section 14 15 1301(a) (relating to qualifications to register) may apply to 16 register as follows: 17 (5) Under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter 18 registration application). 19

- 1 Section 2. Title 25 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 § 1325.1. Electronic voter registration application.
- 3 <u>(a) General rule.--An application to register to vote or to</u>
- 4 <u>change party enrollment or name or address on a current</u>
- 5 registration may be submitted by electronic voter registration
- 6 application on the Internet website of the department in the
- 7 manner provided under this section.
- 8 (b) Establishment. -- An electronic voter application shall be
- 9 <u>established and implemented by the department within 90 days of</u>
- 10 the effective date of this section provided that electronic
- 11 voter application may not be in use until the secretary, the
- 12 <u>Department of Transportation and each commission have developed</u>
- 13 <u>a process and the infrastructure necessary to implement this</u>
- 14 <u>section</u>. The electronic voter registration application shall
- 15 comply with the requirements under section 1327 (relating to
- 16 preparation and distribution of applications). The applicant
- 17 shall enter the data requested on the electronic voter
- 18 registration and affirmatively attest to the truth of the
- 19 <u>information provided in the application</u>. For voter registration
- 20 purposes, the applicant shall assent to the use of the signature
- 21 from the applicant's driver's license or State identification
- 22 card. For each electronic application, the secretary shall
- 23 obtain an electronic copy of the applicant's signature from the
- 24 applicant's driver's license or the applicant's identification
- 25 card issued by the Department of Transportation under 75 Pa.C.S.
- 26 § 1510(b) (relating to issuance and content of driver's license)
- 27 and transfer the application to the SURE system. If the
- 28 secretary determines that a signature is not in the database of
- 29 the Department of Transportation, the secretary shall print and
- 30 mail the completed voter registration application to the

- 1 applicant with instructions to sign and mail the application to
- 2 the appropriate commission within five days.
- 3 (c) Duties of secretary. -- The secretary shall:
- 4 (1) promulgate regulations necessary to establish,
- 5 <u>implement and administer the electronic voter registration</u>
- 6 <u>application; and</u>
- 7 (2) employ security measures to ensure the accuracy and
- 8 <u>integrity of voter registration applications submitted</u>
- 9 electronically under this section.
- 10 (d) Time. -- Registration under this section may be made at
- 11 any time. If an electronic voter registration application is
- 12 <u>submitted later than 30 days before the election, the</u>
- 13 application shall be retained until the beginning of the next
- 14 period during which registration can be made.
- 15 Section 3. Sections 1327(a)(3) and (4) and (b)(3), 1503 and
- 16 1704(a) of Title 25 are amended to read:
- 17 § 1327. Preparation and distribution of applications.
- 18 (a) Form.--
- 19 \* \* \*
- 20 (3) Any person who assists in the completion of the
- 21 registration application shall sign or, in the case of
- 22 registration under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic
- 23 <u>voter registration application), electronically sign</u> the
- 24 application and indicate the person's address. In the case of
- 25 those registering under sections 1323 (relating to
- application with driver's license application) and 1325
- 27 (relating to government agencies), the person providing
- assistance shall insert the person's initials or employee or
- agent identification number on a separate or detachable
- 30 portion of the application or computer data file.

1 A voter registration application, except a registration application under section 1325.1, shall be 3 printed on stock of good quality and shall be of suitable uniform size. [Nothing in this part shall prohibit the design and use of an electronic voter registration application which includes the applicant's digitized or electronic signature.] 7 The registration application, including a registration application under section 1325.1, shall contain the following information; however, the information may be provided on a separate form for voter registration made under section 1323 or 1325:

- Notice that a registered elector does not need to reregister unless the registered elector has moved.
- Instructions on how to fill out and submit the application and notification of when the application must be submitted to a voter registration office or, for registration under section 1325.1, electronically in order to be registered for the ensuing election.
- Notice that the applicant must be a citizen of the United States for at least one month prior to the next election and a resident of this Commonwealth and the election district for at least 30 days and must be at least 18 years of age by the day of the next ensuing election and has not been confined in a penal institution for a conviction of a felony within the last five years. The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b).
- Notice that political party enrollment is mandatory to vote in a primary election of a political party.

- 1 Notice that the commission will mail by nonforwardable mail to the applicant a voter's identification card upon acceptance of the application and that the applicant should contact the commission if the identification card is not received within 14 days from the date the application is sent to the registration office.
  - (vi) Notice that registration is not complete until the application is processed and accepted by the commission.
  - A warning to the applicant that making a false (vii) registration or furnishing false information is perjury. The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b).
  - (viii) Instructions to Federal or State employees who wish to retain voting residence in county of last residence to so indicate on the application.
  - (ix) Notice that, if an individual declines to register to vote, the fact that the individual has declined to register will remain confidential and will be used only for voter registration purposes. The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b).
  - Notice that, if an individual does register to vote, the office at which the individual submits a voter registration application will remain confidential and will be used for voter registration purposes only. The notices required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration in subsection (b).

(3) The registration declaration shall contain the	
printed name [and signature of the applicant and the date of	
signing], date of signing and, except for applicants	
submitting a registration under section 1325.1, the signature	
of the applicant. An applicant unable to sign the voter	
registration application shall make a mark before a person of	
the applicant's choice other than the applicant's employer or	
an agent of the applicant's union. The person shall insert	
the person's name, address and telephone number. If the	
person is an employee or agent of the Department of	
Transportation or another agency as provided under section	
1325 and is assisting the applicant in an official capacity,	
the employee or agent shall insert the initials and	
identification number of the employee or agent. In the case	
of applicants registering under section 1323 or 1325, the	
person providing assistance shall insert initials or employee	
or agent identification number on a separate or detachable	
portion of the application or computer data file. In the case	
of an applicant registering under section 1325.1, the	
applicant shall be required to verify the applicant's	
identity by:	
(i) providing the last four digits of the	
applicant's Social Security number; and	
(ii) the applicant's driver's license number or the	
applicant's identification number issued by the	
Department of Transportation under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510(b)	
(relating to igguance and content of driver!s license)	

In the case of an applicant submitting an electronic

- 1 <u>voter registration application to change party enrollment or</u>
- 2 name or address on a current registration, the applicant may
- 3 also verify identity by providing the applicant's voter
- 4 <u>identification number issued by the Department of</u>
- 5 Transportation under section 206(b) of the act of June 3,
- 6 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election
- 7 Code.
- 8 \* \* \*
- 9 § 1503. Change of enrollment of political party.
- 10 By the deadline for registration, a registered elector who
- 11 desires to change the enrollment of political designation or
- 12 who, although registered, has not previously enrolled as a
- 13 member of a party may appear before a commissioner, registrar or
- 14 clerk or may submit an application by mail under section 1324
- 15 (relating to application by mail) [and state in a signed] or
- 16 electronically under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic
- 17 <u>voter registration application</u>). The elector may state in a
- 18 signed or, in the case of an application submitted under section
- 19 <u>1325.1</u>, <u>verified</u> writing the political party in which the
- 20 registered elector desires to be enrolled. If the signature or
- 21 verification information of the elector is verified by
- 22 comparison with the registered elector's signature or
- 23 <u>verification information</u> as it appears on file with the
- 24 commission, the commissioner, registrar or clerk shall make the
- 25 change in its registration records. [If] <u>In cases other than</u>
- 26 submission of an application under section 1325.1, if supported
- 27 by other evidence of identity, a mark may be made in lieu of a
- 28 signature by a registered elector who is unable to write. The
- 29 mark must be made in the presence of a witness who must sign the
- 30 registration application. For applications submitted under

- 1 <u>section 1325.1</u>, an elector may verify identity by:
- 2 (1) providing the last four digits of the elector's
- 3 <u>Social Security number; and</u>
- 4 (2) the elector's driver's license number, the elector's
- 5 <u>identification number issued by the Department of</u>
- 6 Transportation under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510(b) (relating to
- 7 <u>issuance and content of driver's license</u>) or the applicant's
- 8 <u>voter identification number issued by the Department of</u>
- 9 <u>Transportation under section 206(b) of the act of June 3,</u>
- 10 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election
- 11 Code.
- 12 § 1704. Altering registration.
- 13 (a) Prohibition. -- No registrar, commissioner, clerk or
- 14 assistant [or], commission employee or individual may do any of
- 15 the following:
- 16 (1) Intentionally insert or permit to be inserted an
- entry in a registration record without a proper application
- 18 under this part or without requiring the proper evidence of
- 19 the right of the applicant to be registered.
- 20 (2) Intentionally materially alter a registration record
- 21 after the entries have been made unless the alteration is in
- accordance with this part. This paragraph does not apply to
- an alteration pursuant to an order of a court of common pleas
- 24 or of a commission.
- 25 (3) Intentionally submit false information regarding a
- 26 change of party enrollment or name or address on a
- 27 <u>registration record of another individual under section</u>
- 28 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter registration
- 29 <u>application</u>).

1 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
