AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), entitled "An act relating to the right to practice medicine 2 and surgery and the right to practice medically related acts; 3 reestablishing the State Board of Medical Education and Licensure as the State Board of Medicine and providing for its composition, powers and duties; providing for the 6 issuance of licenses and certificates and the suspension and 7 revocation of licenses and certificates; providing penalties; 8 and making repeals," further providing for definitions and 9 for prosthetists, orthotists, pedorthists and orthotic 10 fitters. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. The definition of "health care practitioner" in 15 section 2 of the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), 16 known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, is amended and the 17 section is amended by adding a definition to read: 18 Section 2. Definitions.

- 4 "Health care practitioner." [An individual, other than a
- 5 physician assistant, who is authorized to practice some
- 6 component of the healing arts by a license, permit, certificate
- 7 or registration issued by a Commonwealth licensing agency or
- 8 board.] As defined in section 103 of the act of July 19, 1979
- 9 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act.

- 11 "Pharmacist." As defined in section 2(10) of the act of
- 12 September 27, 1961 (P.L.1700, No.699), known as the Pharmacy
- 13 <u>Act.</u>

- 15 Section 2. Section 13.5(d), (f) and (h) of the act, added
- 16 July 5, 2012 (P.L.873, No.90), are amended to read:
- 17 Section 13.5. Prosthetists, orthotists, pedorthists and
- 18 orthotic fitters.

- 20 (d) Exceptions.--
- 21 (1) Nothing in this section shall prohibit students
- 22 enrolled in a prosthetics, orthotics, pedorthics or orthotics
- 23 fitter educational program from performing prosthetics,
- 24 orthotics, pedorthics or orthotic fitting in the course of
- 25 their instruction, provided that a physician or podiatrist is
- readily available for consultations and that a prosthetist,
- 27 orthotist, pedorthist or orthotic fitter, respectively, is on
- site and responsible for the direct supervision of students.
- 29 (2) Nothing in this section shall prohibit an
- individual, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A PHARMACIST,

- 1 <u>PODIATRIST OR PHYSICIAN</u>, from engaging in the practice for
- 2 which that individual is licensed, registered or certified to
- 3 practice or to act within the scope of that license___
- 4 <u>registration</u> or certification held in this Commonwealth.
- 5 (3) Nothing in this act shall prohibit an individual who 6 is employed by the Federal Government from engaging in the 7 practice of a prosthetist, orthotist, pedorthist or orthotic 8 fitter while in the discharge of the employee's official
- 10 (4) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the sale of 11 over-the-counter prostheses, orthoses or pedorthic devices.
- 12 (5) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a

 13 representative of a medical device manufacturer registered

 14 with the United States Food and Drug Administration from

 15 measuring, fitting and adjusting a medical device when the

 16 representative pursuant to a written agreement is supervised

 17 by the physician performing the procedure.

- 20 [+(1)+] Within [two] THREE years after the effective
- 21 date of this section, [an individual may be granted] the
- 22 <u>board shall grant an individual</u> a prosthetic, orthotic,
- 23 pedorthotic or orthotic [fitting] <u>fitter</u> license [by the
- 24 board] if the individual [does all of the following] <u>complies</u>
- 25 ON OR BEFORE MARCH 31, 2015, with subsection (a)(1), (5),
- 26 (6), (7) and (8) and:
- 27 [(i) Complies with subsection (a)(1), (5), (6) and 28 (7).
- 29 (ii) Meets the following:
- 30 (A) For prosthetists, a combination of at least

1	four years of education, training and/or work
2	experience, consisting of:
3	(I) a bachelor's degree with a major in
4	prosthetics or orthotics and prosthetics;
5	(II) an associate's degree in prosthetics or
6	orthotics and prosthetics or two or more years of
7	education, training and/or work experience in the
8	field of prosthetics; and
9	(III) a minimum of two years or 3,800 hours
10	of experience in providing direct patient care
11	services.
12	(B) For orthotists, a combination of at least
13	four years of education, training and/or work
14	experience, consisting of:
15	(I) a bachelor's degree with a major in
16	orthotics or orthotics and prosthetics;
17	(II) an associate's degree in orthotics or
18	orthotics and prosthetics or two or more years of
19	education, training and/or work experience in the
20	field of orthotics; and
21	(III) a minimum of two years or 3,800 hours
22	of experience in providing direct patient care
23	services.
24	(C) For pedorthists, a successfully completed
25	board-approved, entry-level pedorthic education
26	program and a minimum of 1,000 hours of supervised
27	patient fitting experience.
28	(D) For orthotic fitters, a successfully
29	completed board-approved, entry-level education
30	program specific to orthotic fitting and a minimum of

1	1,000 hours of documented patient care.	
2	(iii) Complies with the following:	
3	(A) holds a valid national certification from an	
4	organization approved by the board as a prosthetist,	
5	orthotist, pedorthist or orthotic fitter; and	
6	(B) has been in active, continuous practice for	
7	the three years immediately preceding the effective	
8	date of this section.	
9	(2) This subsection shall expire 730 days from the	
10	effective date of this subsection.]	
11	(1) For a prosthetic or orthotic license, an individual	<
12	who holds a national certification as a prosthetist or an	
13	orthotist issued by a national organization approved by the

(1)26 (2) Thoraco-lumbo-sacral orthoses. 27 Lumbo-sacral orthoses. (3) 28 (4) Knee orthoses. 29 Ankle foot orthoses. (5)

(6) Foot orthoses.

- 14 Section 2. Notwithstanding section 3 of the act of July 5,

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- 15 2012 (P.L.873, No.90), entitled "An act amending the act of
- 16 December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), entitled 'An act relating
- 17 to the right to practice medicine and surgery and the right to
- 18 practice medically related acts; reestablishing the State Board
- 19 of Medical Education and Licensure as the State Board of
- 20 Medicine and providing for its composition, powers and duties;
- 21 providing for the issuance of licenses and certificates and the
- 22 suspension and revocation of licenses and certificates;
- 23 providing penalties; and making repeals, 'adding definitions;
- 24 and providing for licensure of prosthetists, orthotists,
- 25 pedorthists and orthotic fitters," the State Board of Medicine
- 26 shall promulgate regulations to implement section 13.5 of the
- 27 act within 12 months of the effective date of this section.
- 28 Section 13.5 of the act shall not be enforceable by the State
- 29 Board of Medicine until the publication of final regulations
- 30 under this section.

1 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
