- 4 WHEREAS, Ms. Kathleen Carey, business writer for the Delaware
- 5 County Daily Times, was awarded the first Barbara Rahke
- 6 Community Ally Award by United Steelworkers Local 10-1 on
- 7 December 8, 2012; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Barbara Rahke Community Ally Award is awarded
- 9 for an exemplary achievement in the field of labor issues; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The award is named for Barbara Rahke, executive
- 11 director of Philiaposh, a nonprofit organization that educates
- 12 workers about job safety; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Ms. Carey received the award for her coverage of the
- 14 possible closing of three local refineries in the Delaware
- 15 County area; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Over 15 months, Ms. Carey wrote numerous stories

- 1 detailing the struggle to save the refineries and thousands of
- 2 local jobs after Sunoco announced that it planned to leave the
- 3 refining business; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Ms. Carey covered the story until the historic
- 5 announcement of a deal between Sunoco and the Carlyle Group to
- 6 create Philadelphia Energy Solutions to operate the South
- 7 Philadelphia refinery; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Ms. Carey's stories were crucial because they told
- 9 not only the business story, but also the story of the plight of
- 10 numerous families in the region whose livelihoods depend on the
- 11 local refineries; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Speaking of Ms. Carey's work, Delaware County Daily
- 13 Times Editor Phil Heron stated, "Kathleen's work is what
- 14 community journalism is all about... I could not be more proud of
- 15 Kathleen or the work the newspaper did on these stories."; and
- 16 WHEREAS, It is fitting to recognize an individual who has
- 17 made such a positive impact on her community; therefore be it
