1 2 3 4 5 6	Recognizing the week of January 13 through 19, 2013 FEBRUARY 10 THROUGH 16, 2014, as "Emerald View Park Trail Week" in this Commonwealth to honor Mount Washington Community Development Corporation's Emerald View Park Program for demonstrating how people in a community can work together to improve the quality of life in their neighborhoods.
7	WHEREAS, Citizens, community members and lawmakers in this
8	Commonwealth have the responsibility to preserve, nurture and
9	protect our environment; and
10	WHEREAS, Community development fosters safer and more livable
11	neighborhoods, which creates a higher demand for real estate and
12	attracts people as well as small businesses; and
13	WHEREAS, Intersecting problems and hyper-localizing capital
14	solves multiple neighborhood issues; and
15	WHEREAS, The Mount Washington and Duquesne Heights
16	neighborhoods of Pittsburgh saw the potential in their
17	underutilized community parks and greenways and attempted to

capture that value through the creation of the Emerald View
Park; and

3 WHEREAS, The ultimate goal of the project is to create and connect 20 miles of trail, encircling the two communities and 4 connecting the historical parks of Grandview, Olympia and 5 6 Dilworth with the Duquesne Heights Greenway; and 7 WHEREAS, Those involved in the Emerald View Park project as 8 volunteers or otherwise have removed 250,000 pounds of waste, which created approximately six miles of new trails and 9 10 refurbished another four miles of the community that had dated 11 back to the 1930s; and

12 WHEREAS, The Emerald View Park Trail Corps program offers a 13 unique opportunity for employment by training workers in a very 14 unique skill set for trail construction and conservation in 15 difficult terrain where machinery cannot be used and it pays its 16 workers a living wage with benefits; and

17 WHEREAS, The park has become a marquee location in the 18 community, as seen in the increased sale prices of nearby 19 houses, the opening of new businesses in the community and as 20 demonstrated by the recognition of the Mount Washington Community Development Corporation as a Champion in Action in the 21 neighborhood revitalization category by Citizens Bank and 22 23 program partners WPXI-TV, Trib Total Media and Pittsburgh Cares 24 for all the collaborative and other work in the park's 25 development; therefore be it
