A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life of World War II veteran Harry Weiland, Sr., 2 and extending condolences to his family.
- 3 WHEREAS, Harry Danks "Hack" Weiland, Sr., a World War II
- 4 veteran, died August 21, 2014, at 89 years of age; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mr. Weiland was born October 12, 1924, in Indiana,
- 6 Pennsylvania, and attended Pitcairn High School; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Mr. Weiland enlisted in the United States Army in
- 8 1943 and served in the infantry during World War II; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Weiland was selected to be a member of the newly
- 10 formed Alamo Scouts, an elite special forces unit that was the
- 11 precursor of today's Army Green Berets; and
- 12 WHEREAS, As an Alamo Scout, Mr. Weiland performed dozens of
- 13 secret raids and reconnaissance missions behind enemy lines; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mr. Weiland earned numerous medals for his
- 2 distinguished service, including the Expert Infantry Badge,
- 3 Special Forces Tab, Silver Star with Oakleaf and the Bronze Star
- 4 with Oakleaf plus V for Valor; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mr. Weiland was eventually inducted into the
- 6 Soldiers and Sailors Hall of Valor; and
- WHEREAS, After the war, Mr. Weiland returned to Murrysville,
- 8 Pennsylvania, with his wife, whom he married in 1940, where they
- 9 built a home and raised two sons; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Weilands were married for 64 years, spending 58
- 11 of those years in Murrysville; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Mr. Weiland spent his life serving his community,
- 13 both in military service and in numerous community
- 14 organizations; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the life of
- 16 World War II veteran Harry Weiland, Sr., and extend condolences
- 17 to his family.
