A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, changing and adding provisions
- relating to selection of justices and judges.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby resolves as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following integrated amendments to the
- 7 Constitution of Pennsylvania are proposed in accordance with
- 8 Article XI:
- 9 (1) That section 8(b) of Article IV be amended to read:
- 10 § 8. Appointing power.
- 11 * * *
- 12 (b) [The] Except as provided in Article V, the Governor
- 13 shall fill vacancies in offices to which he appoints by
- 14 nominating to the Senate a proper person to fill the vacancy
- 15 within 90 days of the first day of the vacancy and not
- 16 thereafter. The Senate shall act on each executive nomination
- 17 within 25 legislative days of its submission. If the Senate has
- 18 not voted upon a nomination within 15 legislative days following
- 19 such submission, any five members of the Senate may, in writing,

- 1 request the presiding officer of the Senate to place the
- 2 nomination before the entire Senate body whereby the nomination
- 3 must be voted upon prior to the expiration of five legislative
- 4 days or 25 legislative days following submission by the
- 5 Governor, whichever occurs first. If the nomination is made
- 6 during a recess or after adjournment sine die, the Senate shall
- 7 act upon it within 25 legislative days after its return or
- 8 reconvening. If the Senate for any reason fails to act upon a
- 9 nomination submitted to it within the required 25 legislative
- 10 days, the nominee shall take office as if the appointment had
- 11 been consented to by the Senate. [The] Except as provided in
- 12 Article V, the Governor shall in a similar manner fill vacancies
- 13 in the offices of Auditor General, State Treasurer, [justice,
- 14 judge, justice of the peace] judge, magisterial district judge
- 15 and in any other elective office he is authorized to fill. In
- 16 the case of a vacancy in an elective office, a person shall be
- 17 elected to the office on the next election day appropriate to
- 18 the office unless the first day of the vacancy is within two
- 19 calendar months immediately preceding the election day in which
- 20 case the election shall be held on the second succeeding
- 21 election day appropriate to the office.
- 22 * * *
- 23 (2) That section 13 of Article V be amended to read:
- 24 § 13. [Election of justices,] Selection of justices, judges and
- 25 [justices of the peace] <u>magisterial district judges</u>;
- vacancies.
- 27 (a) [Justices, judges] <u>Judges</u>, other than judges of the
- 28 Superior Court and the Commonwealth Court, and [justices of the
- 29 peace] magisterial district judges shall be elected at the
- 30 municipal election next preceding the commencement of their

- 1 respective terms of office by the electors of the [Commonwealth
- 2 or the] respective districts in which they are to serve.
- 3 (b) A vacancy in the office of [justice, judge or justice of
- 4 the peace] judge, other than judge of the Superior Court and the
- 5 Commonwealth Court, or magisterial district judge shall be
- 6 filled by appointment by the Governor. The appointment shall be
- 7 with the advice and consent of two-thirds of the members elected
- 8 to the Senate, except in the case of [justices of the peace]
- 9 magisterial district judges which shall be by a majority. The
- 10 person so appointed shall serve for a term ending on the first
- 11 Monday of January following the next municipal election more
- 12 than ten months after the vacancy occurs or for the remainder of
- 13 the unexpired term whichever is less.[, except in the case of
- 14 persons selected as additional judges to the Superior Court,
- 15 where the General Assembly may stagger and fix the length of the
- 16 initial terms of such additional judges by reference to any of
- 17 the first, second and third municipal elections more than ten
- 18 months after the additional judges are selected.] The manner by
- 19 which any additional judges are selected shall be provided by
- 20 this section for the filling of vacancies in judicial offices.
- 21 (b.1) The Governor shall appoint each justice of the Supreme
- 22 <u>Court and judge of the Superior Court and the Commonwealth Court</u>
- 23 to the initial term of that justice or judge. The Governor shall
- 24 nominate to the Senate individuals for appointment exclusively
- 25 from the list of individuals recommended for appointment by the
- 26 Appellate Court Nominating Commission described under section
- 27 14(a), and the appointment shall be with the advice and consent
- 28 of a majority of the members elected to the Senate. Within 30
- 29 days after receiving a list of recommendations from the
- 30 commission, the Governor shall nominate to the Senate one person

- 1 from the list to fill the vacancy for which the list was
- 2 <u>submitted</u>. The Senate shall act on each nomination of a justice
- 3 of the Supreme Court or judge of the Superior Court and the
- 4 <u>Commonwealth Court within 15 legislative days after receiving</u>
- 5 the nomination from the Governor and shall notify the Governor
- 6 of the action it took within 24 hours of taking it. If the
- 7 <u>nomination is made during a recess or after adjournment sine</u>
- 8 <u>die, the Senate shall act upon it within 15 legislative days</u>
- 9 after its return or reconvening and notify the Governor as
- 10 provided in this subsection. If the Senate for any reason fails
- 11 to act upon a nomination submitted to it within the required
- 12 <u>number of days after submission by the Governor, the nominee</u>
- 13 shall take office as if the appointment had been consented to by
- 14 the Senate. The Governor shall make a substitute nomination from
- 15 the commission's list within 30 days after receiving
- 16 <u>notification from the Senate of the rejection of a prior</u>
- 17 nominee, and the Senate shall act upon the nomination in the
- 18 manner prescribed in this subsection. If the Senate rejects a
- 19 total of three nominations made for a specific vacancy, the
- 20 commission shall appoint any other person on the list and the
- 21 appointee shall take office upon notification of the appointment
- 22 by the commission and neither the Governor nor the Senate shall
- 23 participate further in the appointment process for that vacancy.
- 24 (b.2) A vacancy in the office of justice of the Supreme
- 25 Court or judge of the Superior Court or the Commonwealth Court
- 26 shall be filled by the procedure provided in section 13(b.1).
- 27 Additional judges to the Superior Court and the Commonwealth
- 28 Court shall be selected as provided in section 13(b.1).
- 29 (c) The provisions of section 13(b) and (b.2) shall not
- 30 apply [either] in the case of a vacancy to be filled by

- 1 retention election as provided in section 15(b)[, or]. Section
- 2 13(b) shall not apply in the case of a vacancy created by
- 3 failure of a [justice or] judge to file a declaration for
- 4 retention election as provided in section 15(b). In the case of
- 5 a vacancy occurring at the expiration of an appointive term
- 6 under section 13(b), the vacancy shall be filled by election as
- 7 provided in section 13(a).
- 8 [(d) At the primary election in 1969, the electors of the
- 9 Commonwealth may elect to have the justices and judges of the
- 10 Supreme, Superior, Commonwealth and all other statewide courts
- 11 appointed by the Governor from a list of persons qualified for
- 12 the offices submitted to him by the Judicial Qualifications
- 13 Commission. If a majority vote of those voting on the question
- 14 is in favor of this method of appointment, then whenever any
- 15 vacancy occurs thereafter for any reason in such court, the
- 16 Governor shall fill the vacancy by appointment in the manner
- 17 prescribed in this subsection. Such appointment shall not
- 18 require the consent of the Senate.]
- 19 (e) Each justice or judge of the Superior Court or the
- 20 Commonwealth Court appointed by the Governor under section
- 21 [13(d)] 13(b.1) or (b.2) shall hold office for an initial term
- 22 ending the first Monday of January following the next municipal
- 23 election more than [24] months following the appointment.
- 24 (3) That section 14 of Article V be amended to read:
- 25 § 14. [Judicial Qualifications] Appellate Court Nominating
- 26 Commission.
- [(a) Should the method of judicial selection be adopted as
- 28 provided in section 13 (d), there shall be a Judicial
- 29 Qualifications Commission, composed of four non-lawyer electors
- 30 appointed by the Governor and three non-judge members of the bar

- 1 of the Supreme Court appointed by the Supreme Court. No more
- 2 than four members shall be of the same political party. The
- 3 members of the commission shall serve for terms of seven years,
- 4 with one member being selected each year. The commission shall
- 5 consider all names submitted to it and recommend to the Governor
- 6 not fewer than ten nor more than 20 of those qualified for each
- 7 vacancy to be filled.
- 8 (b) During his term, no member shall hold a public office or
- 9 public appointment for which he receives compensation, nor shall
- 10 he hold office in a political party or political organization.
- 11 (c) A vacancy on the commission shall be filled by the
- 12 appointing authority for the balance of the term.]
- 13 <u>(a) There shall be established an independent commission</u>
- 14 <u>within the Executive Department known as the Appellate Court</u>
- 15 Nominating Commission. The commission shall consist of 15
- 16 Pennsylvania residents who are 18 years of age or older. Seven
- 17 members shall be public members, who shall be selected as
- 18 provided by law. Four members shall be appointed by the Governor
- 19 and four members shall be appointed by the General Assembly. The
- 20 members appointed by the General Assembly must be attorneys and
- 21 shall be appointed as follows: one each shall be appointed by
- 22 the President pro tempore of the Senate, the Minority Leader of
- 23 the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
- 24 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 25 (b) The General Assembly shall provide for the nomination of
- 26 public members by groups located in Pennsylvania and shall
- 27 <u>further provide for the selection of public members from</u>
- 28 <u>individuals nominated by those groups. No one holding elective</u>
- 29 or appointive public office or designees or appointees of anyone
- 30 holding elective or appointive public office shall participate

- 1 <u>in the nomination or appointment of public members, provided</u>
- 2 that the Secretary of the Commonwealth may be designated to
- 3 <u>facilitate the process of nomination and appointment of public</u>
- 4 members. Each of the members appointed by the General Assembly
- 5 shall be members of the bar of the Supreme Court who are not
- 6 justices, judges or magisterial district judges. The members
- 7 appointed under this subsection shall be residents of at least
- 8 four different counties at the time of appointment and during
- 9 their terms. If a member becomes a resident of a county of that
- 10 of another member appointed by the General Assembly, the member
- 11 <u>shall forfeit his or her membership and the General Assembly</u>
- 12 <u>shall appoint another member under this subsection.</u>
- (c) Two of the members appointed by the Governor shall be
- 14 <u>lawyers who are licensed to practice law by the Supreme Court</u>
- 15 and who are not justices, judges or magisterial district judges.
- 16 The other two members appointed by the Governor shall not be
- 17 attorneys licensed to practice law by the Supreme Court and
- 18 shall not be justices, judges or magisterial district judges.
- 19 The members appointed by the Governor shall be residents of at
- 20 least four different counties. No more than two of the members
- 21 appointed by the Governor shall be registered in the same
- 22 political party.
- 23 (d) Each member of the commission shall have been a resident
- 24 of this Commonwealth for one year prior to that member's
- 25 appointment and shall reside in this Commonwealth during that
- 26 member's term. In making appointments to the commission, each
- 27 <u>nominating or appointing authority shall take into consideration</u>
- 28 that the commission should include men and women as well as
- 29 individuals from the civic, labor and business communities and
- 30 individuals who come from racially and ethnically diverse

- 1 backgrounds and who reflect the geographic diversity of this
- 2 Commonwealth.
- 3 (e) Each member shall be appointed for a four-year term,
- 4 except that the initial appointments shall have staggered terms
- 5 as provided by law. Each member shall serve only until the end
- 6 of that member's term. A member who has served a full term shall
- 7 <u>not be permitted to serve on the commission during the next</u>
- 8 succeeding term. An appointment of two years or less, whether by
- 9 <u>initial appointment or by appointment to fill an unexpired term</u>,
- 10 shall not be deemed a full term. A vacancy shall be filled for
- 11 the remainder of the term to which the member was appointed in
- 12 the same manner as the vacating member was appointed, except
- 13 that the General Assembly may provide for a different manner for
- 14 <u>filling the vacancy of a public member.</u>
- 15 (f) No member, during the member's term, shall hold office
- 16 in any political party or political organization or hold elected
- 17 or appointed public office, compensated or uncompensated, except
- 18 that members may serve as part-time solicitors to units of local
- 19 government. Neither any employee of the unified judicial system
- 20 nor any lobbyist shall be eligible for appointment to the
- 21 commission. Members shall not be compensated for their services
- 22 as members of the commission, but shall be reimbursed for
- 23 expenses necessarily incurred in the discharge of their official
- 24 duties in accordance with Commonwealth policy in effect for the
- 25 Executive Department. Members of the General Assembly shall not
- 26 be eligible for appointment to the commission for a period of
- 27 one year following their service in the General Assembly.
- 28 Members of the judiciary shall not be eligible for appointment
- 29 to the commission for a period of one year following their
- 30 service on the judiciary. Governors and Lieutenant Governors

- 1 shall not be eligible for appointment to the commission for a
- 2 period of one year following their service as Governor or
- 3 Lieutenant Governor.
- 4 (g) The General Assembly may provide for additional
- 5 qualifications of members of the commission, not inconsistent
- 6 with this article, as it deems appropriate in furthering the
- 7 purposes of this article.
- 8 (h) The General Assembly shall provide for the manner of
- 9 operation of the commission, except that the commission shall
- 10 establish its own rules of procedure and shall be given
- 11 <u>authority to operate independently consistent with the</u>
- 12 provisions of this article.
- (i) Whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of justice of
- 14 the Supreme Court or judge of the Superior Court or the
- 15 Commonwealth Court, the commission shall publicly announce the
- 16 <u>vacancy and solicit applications. When it is known that a</u>
- 17 vacancy on the Supreme Court, the Superior Court or the
- 18 Commonwealth Court will occur in the future on a date certain,
- 19 the selection process shall begin no later than 90 days prior to
- 20 that date. From the applications received, the commission shall
- 21 agree, by the affirmative votes from at least eight of the
- 22 members, on a list of five individuals most qualified to hold
- 23 the office and shall submit the list to the Governor. Only one
- 24 list may be supplied by the commission for each vacancy. In
- 25 making their selection, the members shall consider each
- 26 applicant's qualifications and each person whose name is
- 27 <u>submitted to the Governor shall:</u>
- 28 (1) be a licensed member of the bar of the Supreme Court in
- 29 good standing;
- 30 (2) for an aggregate of at least ten years preceding the

- 1 person's selection, have either practiced law, served as judge
- 2 of a court or courts of record in this Commonwealth, served as a
- 3 judge of a Federal court or been engaged in a law-related
- 4 <u>occupation; and</u>
- 5 (3) have demonstrated integrity, judicial temperament,
- 6 professional competence and experience and commitment to the
- 7 community.
- 8 The commission shall consider that each of the appellate courts
- 9 should include both men and women who come from racially and
- 10 ethnically diverse backgrounds and who reflect the geographic
- 11 <u>diversity of this Commonwealth.</u>
- 12 (j) The General Assembly may provide for other procedural
- 13 provisions relating to the nomination of justices and judges,
- 14 not inconsistent with this article, as it may deem necessary to
- 15 carry out the purposes of this article.
- 16 (k) The commission shall be provided with staff and its
- 17 budget administered as provided by law. The budget request for
- 18 the commission shall be made by the Governor as a separate item
- 19 in the Governor's budget submitted pursuant to section 12(a) of
- 20 Article VIII.
- 21 (4) That section 15 of Article V be amended to read:
- 22 § 15. Tenure of justices, judges and [justices of the peace]
- 23 magisterial district judges.
- 24 (a) [The] Except as provided in section 13(e), the regular
- 25 term of office of justices and judges shall be ten years and the
- 26 regular term of office for judges of the municipal court and
- 27 traffic court in the City of Philadelphia and of [justices of
- 28 the peace] <u>magisterial district judges</u> shall be six years. The
- 29 tenure of any justice or judge shall not be affected by changes
- 30 in judicial districts or by reduction in the number of judges.

- 1 (b) A justice or judge [elected under section 13(a),] of the
- 2 <u>Superior Court or the Commonwealth Court</u> appointed under section
- 3 [13(d)] <u>13(b.1) or (b.2)</u> or retained under this section 15(b) <u>or</u>
- 4 <u>a judge elected under section 13(a) or retained under this</u>
- 5 <u>section 15(b)</u> may file a declaration of candidacy for retention
- 6 election with the officer of the Commonwealth who under law
- 7 shall have supervision over elections on or before the first
- 8 Monday of January of the year preceding the year in which [his]
- 9 the term of office of the justice or judge expires. If no
- 10 declaration is filed, a vacancy shall exist upon the expiration
- 11 of the term of office of such justice or judge, to be filled by
- 12 [election under section 13(a) or by appointment under section
- 13 (d) if applicable] appointment under section 13(b.1) or by
- 14 <u>election under section 13(a)</u>. If a justice or judge files a
- 15 declaration, [his name] the name of the justice or judge shall
- 16 be submitted to the electors without party designation, on a
- 17 separate judicial ballot or in a separate column on voting
- 18 machines, at the municipal election immediately preceding the
- 19 expiration of the term of office of the justice or judge, to
- 20 determine only the question whether [he] the justice or judge
- 21 shall be retained in office. If a majority is against retention,
- 22 a vacancy shall exist upon the expiration of [his] the term of
- 23 office of that justice or judge, to be filled by appointment
- 24 under section 13(b) or [under section 13(d) if applicable]
- 25 <u>(b.2)</u>. If a majority favors retention, the justice or judge
- 26 shall serve for the regular term of office provided herein,
- 27 unless sooner removed or retired. At the expiration of each term
- 28 a justice or judge shall be eligible for retention as provided
- 29 herein, subject only to the retirement provisions of this
- 30 article.

- 1 (c) The provisions of section 15(b) shall not apply to
- 2 magisterial district justices.
- 3 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 4 Assembly of these proposed constitutional amendments, the
- 5 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 6 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 7 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 8 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 9 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 10 passage of these proposed constitutional amendments.
- 11 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of these
- 12 proposed constitutional amendments, the Secretary of the
- 13 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 14 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 15 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 16 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 17 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 18 these proposed constitutional amendments. The Secretary of the
- 19 Commonwealth shall submit the proposed constitutional amendments
- 20 under section 1 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth
- 21 as a single ballot question at the first primary, general or
- 22 municipal election which meets the requirements of and is in
- 23 conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of
- 24 Pennsylvania and which occurs at least three months after the
- 25 proposed constitutional amendments are passed by the General
- 26 Assembly.
