## AN ACT

- 25 (a) General rule. -- A Pennsylvania National Guard member is
- 26 eligible to receive a public service educational grant under
- 27 this [chapter] <u>subchapter</u> if the member meets all of the
- 28 following eligibility criteria:
- 29 (1) The member is a qualified resident of this
- 30 Commonwealth.

- 1 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c) and
- 2 section 3206(b) (relating to limitations), the member is a
- 3 member in good standing and has been a satisfactory
- 4 participant in Pennsylvania National Guard activities for a
- 5 minimum service period established by the Adjutant General.

- 2 course of study within two years of medical discharge or
- 3 within two years of the effective date of this subsection,
- 4 such course of study having a completion date of not more

- 6 members discharged for medical disability on or after the
- 7 effective date of this subsection or of not more than six
- 8 years following the effective date of this subsection for
- 9 members discharged for a medical disability after September

- 19 (a) General rule. -- From the funds appropriated
- 20 [specifically] for the purposes of this [chapter] subchapter,
- 21 grants shall be provided to eligible members for the purpose of
- 22 pursuing approved programs of education.

- 24 § 3205. Amount of grants.
- 25 (a) Full-time student assistance grants. -- Grants awarded
- 26 under this [chapter] <u>subchapter</u> to full-time students shall be
- 27 determined by the agency without regard to financial need and
- 28 shall not exceed for each academic year the lesser of:
- 29 (1) the tuition of the approved institution of higher
- 30 learning for the approved program of education in which the

- 17 (a) General rule. -- An eligible member who fails to meet the
- 18 requirements of this [chapter] <u>subchapter</u> as a result of
- 19 participation in this program or to meet other requirements
- 20 established by the Adjutant General or the agency is liable to
- 21 the Commonwealth for repayment of all grant payments made. The
- 22 Adjutant General shall notify the agency if an eligible member
- 23 fails to complete the service obligation, and the promissory
- 24 note under section 3204(b) (relating to grants) shall be payment
- 25 in full upon demand by the agency on a schedule as the agency
- 26 may determine.

- 24 established in this subchapter.

- The Military Physician Incentive Program is established
- 27 <u>within the department to provide educational stipends to</u>
- 28 eliqible <del>Pennsylvania National Guard members</del> MILITARY RESIDENT <--
- 29 PHYSICIANS in accordance with the provisions of this subchapter.
- 30 § 3213. Military resident physician stipend.

- 1 (a) General rule. -- A military resident physician is eliqible
- 2 to receive a stipend of \$15,000 per year for up to four years of
- 3 <u>medical residency if the member meets all of the eligibility</u>
- 4 <u>requirements under subsection (b).</u>
- 5 (b) Requirements. -- In order to qualify for the military
- 6 <u>resident physician stipend</u>, a military resident physician must
- 7 meet all of the following:
- 8 (1) Be assigned to an appropriate medical position in
- 9 <u>the Pennsylvania National Guard.</u>
- 10 (2) Agree to serve as a military physician in the
- 11 Pennsylvania National Guard after completion of residency for
- 12 <u>one year for each annual stipend received. This service</u>
- obligation shall be concurrent with any other military
- service obligation of the applicant.
- 15 (c) Receipt of stipend. -- Stipends will be paid to an
- 16 <u>eligible military resident physician whose application for the</u>
- 17 stipend is approved at the completion of each year of residency.
- 18 (d) Adjustments. -- If the Adjutant General determines that
- 19 the amount available for the program in any year will be
- 20 insufficient to provide stipends in the amount described in this
- 21 section to all applicants, he may place a cap on the number of
- 22 military resident physicians eligible to receive stipends or may
- 23 adjust the amount of the annual stipend.

- 4 Any recipient of a stipend or other incentive payment under
- 5 this subchapter shall sign, as part of the application for the
- 6 <u>incentive payment</u>, a promissory note in a form prescribed by the
- 7 Adjutant General by which the recipient promises to repay all
- 8 amounts received if the recipient fails to complete the service
- 9 <u>obligation required by this subchapter or to meet other</u>
- 10 requirements established by the Adjutant General.

- 12 (a) General rule. -- A recipient of a stipend or other
- 13 <u>incentive payment under this subchapter who fails to complete</u>
- 14 his service obligation or to meet other requirements established
- 15 by the Adjutant General is liable to the Commonwealth for
- 16 repayment of all incentive payments made. The Adjutant General
- 17 shall notify the department if the recipient fails to complete
- 18 the service obligation, and the promissory note under section
- 19 3215 (relating to promissory note) shall be called to secure
- 20 payment in full upon demand on a schedule as the department may
- 21 determine.
- 22 (b) Forgiveness of recoupment. -- The Adjutant General may
- 23 forgive recoupment of all or part of a recipient's stipend or
- 24 other incentive payment if the Adjutant General determines that
- 25 his failure to fulfill the service obligation was the result of
- 26 his death, discharge because of disability incurred in line of
- 27 duty, discharge because of a medical determination that he is
- 28 medically unfit for duty when the medical condition is outside
- 29 <u>his control and is not due to his misconduct, mandatory</u>
- 30 discharge, release or retirement for age or years of service, or

- 1 discharge, release, transfer or retirement because of other
- 2 compelling circumstances outside his control.
- 3 § 3217. Adjustment of stipend amounts.
- 4 Beginning on January 1, 2016, and every two years thereafter,
- 5 the Adjutant General may adjust, by notice published in the
- 6 Pennsylvania Bulletin, the amounts of the stipends set forth in
- 7 this subchapter by an amount equal to the change in the
- 8 applicable Consumer Price Index in the preceding two years
- 9 provided that the Adjutant General finds sufficient funds are
- 10 appropriated and available to pay for the adjusted stipends.
