5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 5539. Statute of repose in product liability actions.
10	(a) General ruleExcept as provided in subsection (b), a
11	civil action or proceeding brought against any person or
12	business entity to recover damages for death, for injury to
13	persons or property or for economic loss allegedly resulting
14	from a defective product must be commenced within 15 years of
15	any of the following:
16	(1) The date of delivery of the product to the first
17	purchaser or lessee who is not engaged in the business of
18	selling or leasing the product.
19	(2) The date of completion of the replacement or

1	addition of a new component, system, subassembly or other
2	part which was added to the product and which is alleged to
3	have caused death, injury to persons or property or economic
4	loss.
5	(b) ExceptionSubsection (a) does not apply to any of the
6	<u>following:</u>
7	(1) An action brought under a written warranty which
8	would be enforceable under law but for the operation of this
9	section.
10	(2) An action against a manufacturer, seller or
11	distributor of the product or the manufacturer, seller or
12	<u>distributor of any new component, system, subassembly or</u>
13	other part of the product alleging a physical illness the
14	evidence of which did not appear within 15 years of the first
15	exposure to the product.
16	(c) ApplicabilityThis section shall apply to any claim or
17	action brought by a plaintiff for harm caused by a product,
18	irrespective of the theory underlying the claim, other than an
19	action for harm caused by breach of an express warranty.
20	(d) LimitationIf an injury or wrongful death occurs more
21	than 13 years and within 15 years after delivery of the product
22	as described in subsection (a)(1) or the date of completion of
23	the replacement or addition of a new component as described in
24	subsection (a)(2), a civil action or proceeding within the scope
25	of subsection (a) may be commenced within the time otherwise
26	limited by this subchapter, but not later than 17 years after
27	the events described in subsection (a)(1) and (2).
28	Section 2. This act shall apply to all actions filed after
29	the effective date of this section.
30	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
