AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An 1 act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; 2 providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further 3 providing for definitions, for the licensing agency and its functions, for powers and functions of board, for 5 qualifications for license, for procedures for licensing, for reciprocity and for reinstatement of license; providing 7 for nomenclature; and further providing for penalties, for 8 license renewal and records and fees and for unlawful practice. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. The definition of "provisional licensed social 14 worker" in section 3 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, 15 No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family 16 Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, amended December 21, 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), is amended and the section is amended 17 by adding definitions to read: 18
- 19 Section 3. Definitions.
- 20 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 21

- 1 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 * * *
- 3 "Licensed bachelor social worker." A social worker who holds
- 4 <u>a current bachelor's level license under this act.</u>
- 5 * * *
- 6 "Practice of bachelor social work." A licensed bachelor
- 7 <u>social worker providing generalist, nonclinical social work</u>
- 8 services as an employee functioning under the direction of
- 9 <u>an individual who is regulated by the Commonwealth or holds</u>
- 10 a professional license issued by the Commonwealth, or an
- 11 individual employed by an agency that is regulated by the
- 12 Commonwealth. The term includes performing any of the following
- 13 functions:
- 14 (1) Providing social work case management services of a
- 15 generalist, nonclinical nature as an employee of an agency or
- 16 <u>a health care facility.</u>
- 17 (2) Providing consultation on generalist, nonclinical
- issues to individuals, groups, members of other professional
- 19 disciplines, agencies, health care facilities or
- 20 institutions.
- 21 (3) Obtaining information from agency clients or
- 22 applicants for services to determine their social work
- 23 service needs or the availability of appropriate resources.
- 24 (4) Assisting individuals or groups in identifying and
- 25 making use of resources and social work services which are
- available to resolve day-to-day problems, including, but not
- 27 limited to, all of the following:
- 28 (i) Employment and housing.
- 29 (ii) Health care and child care.
- 30 (iii) Financial assistance.

- 2 ["Provisional licensed social worker." A social worker who
- 3 holds a current provisional license under this act.]
- 4 * * *
- 5 <u>"Social work services."</u> Services provided by a professional
- 6 <u>holding a bachelor's degree or master's degree issued by an</u>
- 7 <u>accredited school or program of social work or social welfare</u>
- 8 that demonstrates competency in professional social work.
- 9 Section 2. Sections 5(1) and 6(2) and (3) of the act,
- 10 amended December 21, 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), are amended to
- 11 read:
- 12 Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family
- 13 Therapists and Professional Counselors.
- 14 * * *
- 15 (1) Operating procedures. -- The board shall meet within 30
- 16 days after the appointment of its new members and set up
- 17 operating procedures and develop application forms for licensing
- 18 clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists and
- 19 professional counselors. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 20 board to circulate these forms and educate the public to the
- 21 requirements of licensing in order to hold oneself out as a
- 22 <u>licensed bachelor social worker</u>, licensed social worker,
- 23 licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family
- 24 therapist or licensed professional counselor within the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- 26 Section 6. Powers and functions of board.
- 27 The board shall have the following powers:
- 28 * * *
- 29 (2) To adopt and, from time to time, revise such rules
- 30 and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect the

- 1 provisions of this act. Such regulations may include, but
- 2 shall not be limited to, standards of professional practice
- and conduct for <u>licensed bachelor social workers</u>, licensed
- 4 social workers, licensed clinical social workers, licensed
- 5 marriage and family therapists and licensed professional
- 6 counselors in Pennsylvania.
- 7 (3) To examine for, deny, approve, issue, revoke,
- 8 suspend or renew licenses of <u>bachelor social workers</u>, social
- 9 workers, clinical social workers, marriage and family
- 10 therapists and professional counselors pursuant to this act
- and to conduct hearings in connection therewith.

- 13 Section 3. Section 7(b) of the act, amended December 21,
- 14 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), is amended and the section is amended
- 15 by adding a subsection to read:
- 16 Section 7. Qualifications for license.
- 17 * * *
- 18 [(b) Provisional social work license. -- An applicant shall be
- 19 qualified for a provisional license to hold oneself out as a
- 20 social worker with a provisional license, provided he or she
- 21 submits proof satisfactory to the board that:
- 22 (1) He or she is of good moral character.
- 23 (2) He or she has received a bachelor's degree in social
- 24 work from an accredited school of social work or social
- 25 welfare and has three years' experience under the supervision
- of a social worker who has graduated with a master's degree
- from an accredited school of social work or social welfare.
- 28 (3) He or she offers proof of current enrollment in a
- 29 master's degree program at an accredited school of social
- 30 work or social welfare.

- 1 (4) He or she passed an examination duly adopted by the board.
- 3 (5) His or her application has been accompanied by the application fee.
- 5 (6) He or she has not been convicted of a felony under 6 The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, or 7 of an offense under the laws of another jurisdiction, which, 8 if committed in this Commonwealth, would be a felony under 9 The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, 10 unless:
- 11 (i) at least ten years have elapsed from the date of conviction;
 - (ii) the applicant satisfactorily demonstrates to the board that he or she has made significant progress in personal rehabilitation since the conviction, such that licensure of the applicant should not be expected to create a substantial risk of harm to the health and safety of his or her clients or the public or a substantial risk of further criminal violations; and
- 20 (iii) the applicant otherwise satisfies the 21 qualifications contained in or authorized by this act.
- 22 As used in this paragraph, the term "convicted" shall include
- a judgment, an admission of guilt or a plea of nolo
- contendere.

- 26 (q) Bachelor social work license. -- An applicant shall be
- 27 <u>qualified for a license to hold oneself out as a licensed</u>
- 28 <u>bachelor social worker if the applicant submits proof</u>
- 29 satisfactory to the board that:
- 30 (1) He or she is of good moral character.

1	(2) He or she has received a bachelor's degree from an
2	accredited school of social work or social welfare.
3	(3) He or she has passed an examination duly adopted by
4	the board.
5	(4) His or her application has been accompanied by the
6	application fee.
7	(5) He or she has not been convicted of a felony under
8	The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, or
9	of an offense under the laws of another jurisdiction, which,
10	if committed in this Commonwealth, would be a felony under
11	The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act,
12	unless:
13	(i) at least ten years have elapsed from the date of

29	December 21, 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), are amended to read:
30	Section 8. Procedures for licensing.

- 1 * * *
- 2 (b) Issuance of license. -- The board shall issue to each
- 3 person who meets the licensure requirements of this act a
- 4 certificate setting forth that such person is licensed to hold
- 5 himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, a
- 6 licensed social worker, [a provisional social worker,] a
- 7 licensed clinical social worker, a licensed marriage and family
- 8 therapist or a licensed professional counselor.
- 9 Section 10. Reciprocity.
- 10 The board shall have the power to grant a reciprocal license
- 11 to an applicant who is licensed or certified as a <u>bachelor</u>
- 12 <u>social worker</u>, social worker, clinical social worker, marriage
- 13 and family therapist or professional counselor in another state
- 14 and has demonstrated qualifications which equal or exceed those
- 15 required pursuant to this act in the determination of the board,
- 16 provided that no license shall be granted under this section to
- 17 an applicant unless the state in which the applicant is licensed
- 18 affords reciprocal treatment to persons who are residents of
- 19 this Commonwealth and who are licensed pursuant to this act.
- 20 Section 12. Reinstatement of license.
- 21 Unless ordered to do so by Commonwealth Court or an appeal
- 22 therefrom, the board shall not reinstate the license of a person
- 23 to practice as a <u>bachelor social worker</u>, social worker, clinical
- 24 social worker, marriage and family therapist or professional
- 25 counselor pursuant to this act, which has been revoked. Any
- 26 person whose license has been revoked may apply for
- 27 reinstatement, after a period of at least five years, but must
- 28 meet all of the licensing qualifications of this act, including
- 29 the examination requirement, if he or she desires to practice as
- 30 a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social worker,

- 1 marriage and family therapist or professional counselor pursuant
- 2 to this act at any time after such revocation.
- 3 Section 5. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 4 <u>Section 16.4. Restrictions on use of title "Licensed Bachelor</u>
- 5 <u>Social Worker."</u>
- 6 Only individuals who have received licenses as licensed
- 7 bachelor social workers under this act may style themselves as
- 8 <u>licensed bachelor social workers and use the letters "L.B.S.W."</u>
- 9 <u>in connection with their names, and it shall be unlawful for an</u>
- 10 <u>individual to style himself or herself as a licensed bachelor</u>
- 11 social worker or use any words or symbols indicating or
- 12 tending to indicate that the individual is a licensed bachelor
- 13 social worker without holding a license in good standing under
- 14 this act.
- 15 Section 6. Section 17(b) of the act is amended to read:
- 16 Section 17. Penalties.
- 17 * * *
- 18 (b) Civil penalty.--In addition to any other civil remedy or
- 19 criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote
- 20 of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized
- 21 membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the
- 22 majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a
- 23 minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil
- 24 penalty of up to \$1,000 on any current licensee who violates any
- 25 provision of this act or on any person who holds himself or
- 26 herself out as a <u>licensed bachelor social worker</u>, licensed
- 27 social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed
- 28 marriage and family therapist or licensed professional counselor
- 29 without being so licensed pursuant to this act. The board shall
- 30 levy this penalty only after affording the accused party the

- 1 opportunity for a hearing, as provided in Title 2 of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to administrative
- 3 law and procedure).

- 5 Section 7. Sections 18(b) and (c) and 20(a) of the act,
- 6 amended December 21, 1998 (P.L.1017, No.136), are amended to
- 7 read:
- 8 Section 18. License renewal; records and fees.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (b) Records. -- A record of all persons licensed to practice
- 11 as <u>bachelor social workers</u>, social workers, clinical social
- 12 workers, marriage and family therapists and professional
- 13 counselors in Pennsylvania shall be kept in the office of the
- 14 board and shall be open to public inspection and copying upon
- 15 payment of a nominal fee for copying the record.
- 16 (c) Fees.--
- 17 (1) All fees required pursuant to this act shall be
- 18 fixed by the board by regulation and shall be subject to the
- 19 act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the
- 20 Regulatory Review Act. If the revenues raised by fees, fines
- 21 and civil penalties imposed pursuant to this act are not
- 22 sufficient to meet expenditures over a two-year period, the
- 23 board shall increase those fees by regulation so that the
- 24 projected revenues will meet or exceed projected
- 25 expenditures.
- 26 (2) If the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
- 27 Affairs determines that the fees established by the board
- pursuant to paragraph (1) are inadequate to meet the minimum
- enforcement efforts required by this act, then the bureau,
- 30 after consultation with the board and subject to the

- 1 Regulatory Review Act, shall increase the fees by regulation
- 2 in an amount so that adequate revenues are raised to meet the
- 3 required enforcement effort.
- 4 (3) The application fee to apply for a bachelor
- 5 <u>social work license shall be \$40 with a renewal fee of \$75.</u>
- 6 Fees specific to the bachelor social work license shall be
- 7 <u>fixed by the board in regulation and shall be subject to the</u>
- 8 <u>Regulatory Review Act.</u>
- 9 Section 20. Unlawful practice.
- 10 (a) Unlawful practice prohibited.--It shall be unlawful for
- 11 any person to hold himself or herself out as a <u>licensed bachelor</u>
- 12 <u>social worker</u>, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social
- 13 worker, marriage and family therapist and professional counselor
- 14 without possessing a valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended
- 15 license issued under this act.
- 16 * * *
- 17 Section 8. The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
- 18 Family Therapists and Professional Counselors shall add licensed
- 19 bachelor social workers to the licensees who must comply with
- 20 regulations governing codes of ethical practice and standards of
- 21 conduct.
- 22 Section 9. The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
- 23 Family Therapists and Professional Counselors shall promulgate
- 24 regulations to carry out this act within 180 days of the
- 25 effective date of this section.
- 26 Section 10. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
