1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.723, No.230), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to counties of the second class and second class A; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," further providing for vacancy in the office of county commissioner.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 501 of the act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.723,
9	No.230), known as the Second Class County Code, is amended to
10	read:
11	Section 501. Election[; Vacancies][(a)] Three county
12	commissioners shall be elected in the county in the year one
13	thousand nine hundred and fifty-five and every fourth year
14	thereafter. In the election of commissioners, each qualified
15	elector shall vote for no more than two persons. The three
16	persons having the highest number of votes shall be elected.
17	[(b) Any vacancy in the office of county commissioners shall
18	be filled for the balance of the unexpired term by the court of
19	common pleas of the county, by the appointment of an elector of

1	the county who voted for the commissioner whose place is to be	
2	filled.]	
3	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:	
4	Section 501.1. Vacancies(a) If any vacancy shall occur	
5	in the office of county commissioner by death, resignation,	
6	removal from the county or by failure to take the required oath	
7	or to give bond as provided by law or ordinance, or in any other	
8	manner, the following shall apply:	
9	(1) The two remaining commissioners shall direct the chief	
10	clerk to request that the county committee of the political	
11	party or political body of the vacated commissioner at the time	
12	the vacated commissioner was elected submit a list of three	
13	names to be chosen through a conference process or any other	
14	process as provided in the bylaws of the political party or	
15	political body. The committee shall submit the names within	
16	thirty (30) days of the vacancy and may rank them in order of	
17	preference. The names provided in accordance with this paragraph	
18	shall constitute the exclusive candidates for appointment to	
19	fill the vacancy by the two remaining commissioners, the vacancy	
20	board and the court. As used in this paragraph, the terms	
21	"political party" or "political body" shall have the meanings	
22	given to them in section 801 of the act of June 3, 1937	
23	(P.L.1333, No.320), known as the "Pennsylvania Election Code."	
24	(2) The two remaining county commissioners shall appoint a	
25	successor within forty-five (45) days after the vacancy occurs.	
26	If the two remaining county commissioners fail to make the	
27	appointment within forty-five (45) days, the appointment shall	
28	be made by the vacancy board within fifteen (15) days after the	
29	expiration of the forty-five (45) day period. The vacancy board	
30	shall consist of the two remaining county commissioners and the	
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1	one elector of the county, who shall be appointed by the county		
2	commissioners at the board's first meeting each calendar year or		
3	as soon after that is practical and who shall act as chairperson		
4	of the vacancy board. If the vacancy board fails to fill the		
5	position within fifteen (15) days after the expiration of the		
6	forty-five (45) day period, the chairperson or, if there is a		
7	vacancy in the position of chairperson, the remaining members of		
8	the vacancy board shall petition the court of common pleas to		
9	fill the vacancy.		
10	(3) If two or more vacancies exist in the office of county		
11	commissioner, the court of common pleas shall fill the vacancies		
12	upon presentation of a petition signed by not less than fifteen		
13	electors of the county. Upon receipt of the petition, the court		
14	shall request names from the appropriate county committee as		
15	provided under paragraph (1).		
16	(b) If a county committee has not provided names in		
17	accordance with subsection (a), or if the commissioner whose		
18	office is vacant is not a member of a political party or a		
19	political body, any successor qualified under subsection (c) may		
20	be appointed to fill the vacancy.		
21	(c) A successor appointed to fill a vacancy in accordance		
22	with this section shall:		
23	(1) Be at least eighteen years of age, a citizen of the		
24	United States and a resident of the county.		
25	(2) Have resided within the county for one year next		
26	preceding the successor's appointment.		
27	(3) Be a registered elector of the county and a member of		
28	the same political party or political body as the commissioner		
29	whose place is to be filled at the time the commissioner was		
30	elected. If the commissioner vacating office was independent of		
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1	any political affiliation or was affiliated with any political
2	organization other than a political party or political body, the
3	successor shall be of the same affiliation if an available
4	candidate is otherwise qualified under this subsection.
5	(4) Hold the office for the balance of the unexpired term.
6	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
