AN ACT Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," providing for rural regional community college pilot program for underserved counties. 5 <--6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 article to read: 11 12 ARTICLE XIX-G 13 RURAL REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE 14 PILOT PROGRAM FOR UNDERSERVED COUNTIES <--15 Section 1901 G. Scope of article. 16 This article provides for a pilot 17 rural regional community college in an 11 county rural area that 18 is underserved by comprehensive community college education and 19 work force development.

1	The following words and phrases when used in this article
2	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
3	<pre>context clearly indicates otherwise:</pre>
4	"Annual." A 12 month period coterminous with the
5	Commonwealth's fiscal year beginning July 1 and ending June 30.
6	"Board of trustees." The board of trustees of a rural
7	regional community college established under this article.
8	"County." Any county in this Commonwealth.
9	"Certified public accountant." A member of the American
10	Institute of Certified Public Accountants who has a minimum of
11	five years' verifiable experience in performing audits of
12	government funds for nonprofit organizations with a comparable
13	or larger annual budget.
14	"Rural regional community college" or "regional rural
15	school." A public institution which is established in a rural
16	area and operated in accordance with the provisions of this
17	article as a nonprofit organization which provides up to a two-
18	year, postsecondary education not to exceed the level of an
19	associate of arts or sciences degree and which is active in work
20	force development.
21	"Rural regional school plan" or "plan." A plan for the
22	establishment and operation of a regional rural school under
23	this article.
24	"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth
25	or such person as the secretary may designate to act on behalf
26	of the secretary with regard to any of the duties and
27	prerogatives imposed by this article.
28	"State Board." The State Board of Education.
29	Section 1903 G. Designation; pilot program and future rural
3.0	regional community colleges.

1	The secretary, within 30 days of the effective date of this
2	article, shall work with an established nonprofit organization
3	as defined under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
4	of 1986 (Public Law 99 514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)) representing
5	a rural multicounty region which is underserved by a
6	comprehensive community college program, including work force
7	development. The Education Consortium of the Upper Allegheny
8	represents an 11 county area and is designated under this
9	section.
L 0	Section 1904 G. Designation; board of trustees.
.1	Within 60 days of the secretary's designation under section
_2	1903 G, a board of trustees shall be appointed to establish the
13	rural regional school required under this article. The board of
4	trustees shall consist of not less than seven members nor more
5	than 11 members appointed by the secretary who are
- 6	representative of the area designated jointly by the secretary
_7	and the nonprofit organization under section 1903-G. The
8 .	following shall apply to the board of trustees established under
9	this section:
20	(1) Members of the board of trustees shall be appointed
21	for terms of three years each, except that those persons
22	initially appointed shall draw lots to determine which
23	trustees shall serve for a term of three years, which
24	trustees shall serve for a term of two years and which
25	trustees shall serve for a term of one year. Thereafter, all
26	members shall be appointed for terms of three years each.
27	(2) Vacancies on the board shall be filled by the
28	existing board. A trustee may succeed himself, provided that
29	no member shall serve for longer than ten years.
30	(3) The secretary shall convene an initial meeting of

Τ	the board of trustees within 90 days of the secretary's
2	designation under this section. After the initial meeting,
3	the board of trustees shall meet at such times each year as
4	the board of trustees determines to be necessary to satisfy
5	the requirements of this article.
6	(4) The board of trustees shall adopt standing operating
7	rules and procedures.
8	(5) The board of trustees shall choose from among its
9	members a chairman, vice chairman and secretary.
10	(6) A majority of the members of the board of trustees
11	shall constitute a quorum.
12	(7) Trustees shall serve without compensation, except
13	that they shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary
14	expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
15	Section 1905-G. Establishment.
16	(a) General rule. Within one year of the effective date of
17	this article, the board of trustees appointed under section
18	1904-G shall submit to the secretary a proposed regional rural
19	school plan in such form and containing such information as the
20	secretary may require. In addition to other information which
21	may be required by the secretary, the plan shall include the
22	<u>following:</u>
23	(1) A designation of the name of the proposed regional
24	technical school, which shall be the "Regional Community
25	College of " or " Regional
26	Community College."
27	(2) A survey of the vocational and occupational needs of
28	the area and the means by which the proposed regional rural
29	school will meet those needs, reduce unemployment and improve
30	the employable skills of residents of the area to be served

1	by the regional rural school.
2	(3) An operating and financial plan for the proposed
3	regional rural school, including a plan for the capital needs
4	and expenses of the proposed regional rural school.
5	(4) A plan by which the regional rural school shall seek
6	accreditation by an accrediting association which is
7	recognized by the United States Department of Education.
8	(b) Submission of plan. Within 30 days of the submission of
9	the regional rural school plan to the secretary, the secretary
10	shall issue an approval or rejection of the plan. A rejection of
11	the plan shall be accompanied by a written statement of the
12	reasons for the rejection of the plan. If the plan is rejected,
13	the board of trustees shall submit a revised plan to the
14	secretary within 60 days of the plan's rejection.
15	(c) Plan approval. Upon the approval of the plan by the
16	secretary, the regional rural school shall be considered
17	<u>established.</u>
18	Section 1906 G. Powers and duties of board of trustees.
19	(a) General rule. The board of trustees appointed under
20	section 1904 G shall administer and supervise the affairs of any
21	regional rural school established under this article. Subject to
22	any other law and to any regulations promulgated by the State
23	Board pertaining to regional rural schools, the board of
24	trustees shall have the following powers and duties:
25	(1) To appoint and fix the salary of a president of the
26	regional rural school.
27	(2) To appoint and fix the salary of a treasurer of the
28	regional rural school.
29	(3) To hold, rent, lease, sell, purchase and improve
30	land, buildings, furnishings, equipment, materials, books and

_	Supplies.
2	(4) To enter into contracts for services with schools,
3	colleges or universities, or with school districts or
4	municipalities, to effectuate the purposes of this article.
5	(5) To accept and receive gifts of real and personal
6	property and Federal, State and local moneys and grants, and
7	to expend the same.
8	(6) To make policies providing for the admission and
9	expulsion of students, the courses of instruction, the
10	tuition and fees to be charged and for all matters related to
11	the government and administration of the regional rural
12	school, provided that policies related to admission, tuition
13	and fees give preference to residents of the 11-county area
14	designated by the secretary pursuant to section 1903 G.
15	(7) To submit to the secretary for approval proposed
16	amendments to the regional rural school plan.

- 13 <u>Section 1908-G. Students.</u>
- 14 Any individual may apply for admission to the regional rural
- 15 school established under this article, provided that preference
- 16 in admissions, tuition and fees may be given to residents of the
- 17 multicounty area designated by the secretary pursuant to section
- 18 1903 G. In considering applicants for admission, the regional
- 19 rural school shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color,
- 20 gender, marital status, ethnic group or religion.
- 21 Section 1909-G. Tuition.
- 22 The tuition charged by each regional rural school shall be an
- 23 amount determined by the board of trustees of the regional rural
- 24 school, in accordance with the budget approved by the secretary
- 25 and with regulations of the State Board. The board of trustees
- 26 shall determine the amount of tuition which will not exceed the
- 27 <u>Pennsylvania in-resident community college average.</u>
- 28 Section 1910 G. Dissolution of regional rural school.
- 29 <u>No regional rural school established under this article shall</u>
- 30 be dissolved without the approval of the secretary. Upon-

- 1 dissolution of the regional rural school, the Commonwealth shall
- 2 assume all assets and liabilities of the regional rural school.
- 3 Section 1911-G. Degrees.
- 4 <u>A regional rural school established under this article may</u>
- 5 award any type of diploma, technical or career training
- 6 certificate or degree not to exceed the level of an associate of
- 7 <u>arts or sciences degree.</u>
- 8 Section 1912 G. Funding.
- 9 <u>A regional rural school established under this article shall</u>
- 10 be funded by an appropriation by the General Assembly, grants
- 11 <u>from the Federal Government, grants from the Commonwealth,</u>
- 12 grants from private foundations or any combination thereof.
- 13 <u>Section 1913-G. Financial aid.</u>
- 14 <u>Students enrolled in a regional rural school established</u>
- 15 <u>under this article shall be eligible for financial aid to the</u>
- 16 <u>extent permitted under Federal and State law.</u>
- 17 Section 1914-G. Regulations.
- 18 The State Board may promulgate final omitted regulations
- 19 pursuant to the act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
- 20 the Regulatory Review Act, as necessary to implement this
- 21 article.
- 22 Section 1915 G. Reports.
- 23 The Legislative Budget and Finance Committee shall prepare
- 24 and submit to the General Assembly written interim and final
- 25 reports evaluating the operation of this article. The interim
- 26 report shall be submitted by June 30, 2018, and the final report
- 27 <u>shall be submitted by June 30, 2022. Each report shall include,</u>
- 28 but may not be limited to, the following:
- 29 (1) A review of the success of the regional rural school
- 30 established under this article in satisfying the goals set

20	(i) Retention rates.
21	(ii) Graduation rates after two, three and four
22	years.
23	(iii) Passing rates on certification and licensure
24	<u>examinations.</u>
25	(iv) Number of students employed within one year of
26	program completion.
27	(v) Placement into additional education or
28	employment in the student's field of study.
29	Where available, data shall be disaggregated by categories,
30	including gender, race and age.

1	(4) Economic and work force development measures,
2	<u>including:</u>
3	(i) Employer satisfaction.
4	(ii) Customized job training offerings.
5	(iii) Employment status.
6	(iv) Numbers of businesses and organizations served.
7	(5) Recommendations for future legislation.
8	Section 1916-G. Expiration.
9	This article shall expire June 30, 2023, unless reenacted
10	prior to that date.
11	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
12	SECTION 1901-G. SCOPE OF ARTICLE.
13	THIS ARTICLE PROVIDES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RURAL
14	REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE IN A MULTICOUNTY RURAL AREA THAT IS
15	UNDERSERVED BY COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY COLLEGE EDUCATION AND
16	WORK FORCE DEVELOPMENT.
17	SECTION 1902-G. DEFINITIONS.
18	THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS ARTICLE
19	SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE
20	CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:
21	"ANNUAL." A 12-MONTH PERIOD COTERMINOUS WITH THE
22	COMMONWEALTH'S FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1 AND ENDING JUNE 30.
23	"BOARD OF TRUSTEES." THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF A RURAL
24	REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.
25	"COUNTY." ANY COUNTY IN THIS COMMONWEALTH.
26	"CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT." A MEMBER OF THE AMERICAN
27	INSTITUTE OF CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS WHO HAS A MINIMUM OF
28	FIVE YEARS' VERIFIABLE EXPERIENCE IN PERFORMING AUDITS OF
29	GOVERNMENT FUNDS FOR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS WITH A COMPARABLE
30	OR LARGER ANNUAL BUDGET.

- 6 WHICH IS ACTIVE IN WORK FORCE DEVELOPMENT.
- 7 "RURAL REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE PLAN" OR "PLAN." A PLAN
- 8 FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF A RURAL REGIONAL
- 9 <u>COMMUNITY COLLEGE UNDER THIS ARTICLE.</u>
- 10 "SECRETARY." THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION OF THE COMMONWEALTH
- 11 OR SUCH PERSON AS THE SECRETARY MAY DESIGNATE TO ACT ON BEHALF
- 12 OF THE SECRETARY WITH REGARD TO ANY OF THE DUTIES AND
- 13 PREROGATIVES IMPOSED BY THIS ARTICLE.
- 14 "STATE BOARD." THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.
- 15 SECTION 1903-G. DESIGNATIONS BY THE SECRETARY.
- 16 (A) DUTIES OF SECRETARY.--
- 17 (1) WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
- 18 SECTION, THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE AN ESTABLISHED
- 19 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION AS DEFINED UNDER SECTION 501(C)(3) OF
- THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986 (PUBLIC LAW 99-514, 26
- 21 U.S.C. § 501(C)(3)), WHICH ORGANIZATION REPRESENTS A RURAL
- 22 MULTICOUNTY REGION UNDERSERVED BY A COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY
- 23 COLLEGE PROGRAM, INCLUDING WORK FORCE DEVELOPMENT, TO ASSIST
- 24 THE SECRETARY WITH THE DESIGNATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (2).
- 25 (2) WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DESIGNATION UNDER PARAGRAPH
- 26 (1), THE SECRETARY SHALL, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE NONPROFIT
- 27 ORGANIZATION, DESIGNATE CONTIGUOUS COUNTIES OR PARTS OF
- 28 CONTIGUOUS COUNTIES TO BE SERVED BY ESTABLISHMENT OF A RURAL
- 29 REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- 30 (B) CHANGES. -- NO SOONER THAN FOUR YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE

- 1 DATE OF THIS SECTION, THE SECRETARY, WITH APPROVAL OF THE BOARD
- 2 OF TRUSTEES, MAY ADD COUNTIES OR PARTS OF COUNTIES TO BE SERVED
- 3 BY THE RURAL REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
- 4 <u>SECTION 1904-G.</u> <u>DESIGNATION; BOARD OF TRUSTEES.</u>
- 5 WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNATION UNDER SECTION
- 6 1903-G(A)(2), A BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL BE APPOINTED TO
- 7 ESTABLISH A RURAL REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE. THE BOARD OF
- 8 TRUSTEES SHALL CONSIST OF NOT FEWER THAN SEVEN MEMBERS NOR MORE
- 9 THAN 15 MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE SECRETARY IN CONSULTATION AND
- 10 JOINTLY WITH THE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION DESIGNATED UNDER SECTION

- 18 (2) MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL BE APPOINTED
- 19 FOR TERMS OF THREE YEARS EACH, EXCEPT THAT THOSE PERSONS
- 20 INITIALLY APPOINTED SHALL DRAW LOTS TO DETERMINE WHICH
- 21 TRUSTEES SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS, WHICH
- 22 TRUSTEES SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS AND WHICH
- TRUSTEES SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM OF ONE YEAR. THEREAFTER, ALL
- 24 MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR TERMS OF THREE YEARS EACH.
- 25 (3) VACANCIES ON THE BOARD SHALL BE FILLED BY THE
- 26 EXISTING BOARD. A TRUSTEE MAY SUCCEED HIMSELF, PROVIDED THAT
- 27 NO MEMBER SHALL SERVE FOR LONGER THAN TEN YEARS.
- 28 (4) THE SECRETARY SHALL CONVENE AN INITIAL MEETING OF
- 29 THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE SECRETARY'S
- 30 <u>DESIGNATION UNDER THIS SECTION. AFTER THE INITIAL MEETING</u>,

- THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL MEET AT SUCH TIMES EACH YEAR AS
- THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES DETERMINES TO BE NECESSARY TO SATISFY
- 3 THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 4 (5) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL ADOPT STANDING OPERATING
- 5 RULES AND PROCEDURES, BY LAWS AND ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.
- 6 (6) THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL ESTABLISH AN ADVISORY
- 7 COMMITTEE OF PRESIDENTS, OR THEIR DESIGNEE, FROM INSTITUTIONS
- 8 <u>WITH POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS WITHIN THE REGION</u>
- 9 <u>DESIGNATED UNDER SECTION 1903-G(A)(2). THE ADVISORY COUNCIL</u>

- 18 (8) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
