AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for rural regional community college for underserved counties.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
11	article to read:
12	ARTICLE XIX-G
13	RURAL REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE
14	FOR UNDERSERVED COUNTIES
15	Section 1901-G. Scope of article.
16	This article provides for the establishment of a rural
17	regional community college in a multicounty rural area that is
18	underserved by comprehensive community college education and
19	work force development.
20	Section 1902-G. Definitions.

1	The following words and phrases when used in this article
2	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
3	context clearly indicates otherwise:
4	"Annual." A 12-month period coterminous with the
5	Commonwealth's fiscal year beginning July 1 and ending June 30.
6	"Board of trustees." The board of trustees of a rural
7	regional community college established under this article.
8	"County." Any county in this Commonwealth.
9	"Certified public accountant." A member of the American
10	Institute of Certified Public Accountants who has a minimum of
11	five years' verifiable experience in performing audits of
12	government funds for nonprofit organizations with a comparable
13	<u>or larger annual budget.</u>
14	"MIDDLE STATES." THE MIDDLE STATES ASSOCIATION OF COLLEGES <
15	AND SCHOOLS.
16	"PARTNER INSTITUTION." ONE OR MORE MIDDLE STATES-ACCREDITED
17	INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION.
18	"Rural regional community college." A public institution
19	which is established in a rural area and operated in accordance
20	with the provisions of this article as a nonprofit organization
21	which provides up to a two-year, postsecondary education not to
22	exceed the level of an associate of arts or sciences degree and
23	which is active in work force development.
24	"Rural regional community college plan" or "plan." A plan
25	for the establishment and operation of a rural regional
26	community college under this article.
27	"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth
28	or such person as the secretary may designate to act on behalf
29	of the secretary with regard to any of the duties and
30	prerogatives imposed by this article.

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1	"State Board." The State Board of Education.
2	Section 1903-G. Designations by the secretary.
3	<u>(a) Duties of secretary</u>
4	(1) Within 30 days of the effective date of this
5	section, the secretary shall designate an established
6	nonprofit organization as defined under section 501(c)(3) of
7	the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26
8	U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)), which organization represents a rural
9	multicounty region underserved by a comprehensive community
10	college program, including work force development, to assist
11	the secretary with the designation under paragraph (2).
12	(2) Within 30 days of the designation under paragraph
13	(1), the secretary shall, in consultation with the nonprofit
14	organization, designate contiguous counties or parts of
15	contiguous counties to be served by establishment of a rural
16	regional community college.
17	(b) ChangesNo sooner than four years after the effective
18	date of this section, the secretary, with approval of the board
19	of trustees, may add counties or parts of counties to be served
20	by the rural regional community college.
21	Section 1904-G. Designation; board of trustees.
22	Within 60 days of the secretary's designation under section
23	1903-G(a)(2), a board of trustees shall be appointed to
24	establish a rural regional community college. The board of
25	trustees shall consist of not fewer than seven members nor more
26	than 15 members appointed by the secretary in consultation and
27	jointly with the nonprofit organization designated under section
28	<u>1903-G(a)(1). The following shall apply to the board of trustees</u>
29	established under this section:
30	(1) Members of the board of trustees shall be

1	representative of the area designated under section 1903-G(a)
2	(2) and may include school administrators, community
3	education council officials, business leaders and government
4	officials.
5	(2) Members of the board of trustees shall be appointed
6	for terms of three years each, except that those persons
7	initially appointed shall draw lots to determine which
8	trustees shall serve for a term of three years, which
9	trustees shall serve for a term of two years and which
10	trustees shall serve for a term of one year. Thereafter, all
11	members shall be appointed for terms of three years each.
12	(3) Vacancies on the board shall be filled by the
13	existing board. A trustee may succeed himself, provided that
14	no member shall serve for longer than ten years.
15	(4) The secretary shall convene an initial meeting of
16	the board of trustees within 60 30 days of the secretary's <
17	designation APPOINTMENT OF A BOARD OF TRUSTEES under this <
18	section. After the initial meeting, the board of trustees
19	shall meet at such times each year as the board of trustees
20	determines to be necessary to satisfy the requirements of
21	this article.
22	(5) The board of trustees shall adopt standing operating
23	rules and procedures, by laws and articles of incorporation.
24	(6) The board of trustees shall establish an advisory
25	<pre>committee COUNCIL of presidents, or their designee DESIGNEES, <</pre>
26	from institutions with postsecondary education programs
27	within the region designated under section 1903-G(a)(2). The
28	advisory council shall meet quarterly to discuss employer and
29	work force needs, new educational offerings and general
30	coordination of service and facilities. One advisory council

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1	member representing a community college and one advisory
2	council member that is a president of a college or university
3	shall serve as co-chairs.
4	(7) The board of trustees shall choose from among its
5	members a chairman, vice chairman and secretary.
6	(8) A majority of the members of the board of trustees
7	<u>shall constitute a quorum.</u>
8	(9) Trustees shall serve without compensation, except
9	that they shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary
10	expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
11	<u>Section 1905-G. Establishment.</u>
12	(a) General ruleWithin one year of its initial meeting,
13	the board of trustees appointed under section 1904-G shall
14	submit to the secretary a proposed rural regional community
15	college plan in such form and containing such information as the
16	secretary may require. In addition to other information which
17	may be required by the secretary, the plan shall include the
18	<u>following:</u>
19	(1) A designation of the name of the proposed rural
20	regional community college which shall be the "Regional
21	Community College of " or "
22	Regional Community College."
23	(2) A survey of the educational, vocational and
24	occupational needs of the area and the means by which the
25	proposed rural regional community college will meet those
26	needs, re-engage high school dropouts to earn their secondary
27	credentials and postsecondary credentials or industry
28	certification, reduce unemployment and improve the employable
29	skills of residents of the area to be served by the rural
30	regional community college.

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1	(3) An operating and financial plan for the proposed
2	rural regional community college, including a plan for the
3	capital needs and expenses of the proposed rural regional
4	community college.
5	(4) A plan by which the rural regional community college
6	shall seek accreditation by an accrediting association which
7	is recognized by the United States Department of Education.
8	(b) Submission of planWithin 60 days of the submission of
9	the rural regional community college plan to the secretary, the
10	secretary shall issue an approval or rejection of the plan. A
11	rejection of the plan shall be accompanied by a written
12	statement of the reasons for the rejection of the plan. If the
13	plan is rejected, the board of trustees shall submit a revised
14	plan to the secretary within 60 days of the plan's rejection.
15	(c) Plan approvalUpon the approval of the plan by the
16	secretary, the rural regional community college shall be
17	considered established.
18	Section 1906-G. Powers and duties of board of trustees.
19	(a) General ruleThe board of trustees appointed under
20	section 1904-G shall administer and supervise the affairs of the
21	rural regional community college established under this article.
22	Subject to any other law and to any regulations promulgated by
23	the State Board pertaining to rural regional community colleges,
24	the board of trustees shall have the following powers and
25	<u>duties:</u>
26	(1) To advance the mission of the rural regional
27	community college in service to residents of the region
28	designated under section 1903-G(a)(2).
29	(2) To appoint and fix the salary of a president of the
30	rural regional community college.

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1	(3) To appoint and fix the salary of a chief financial
2	officer of the rural regional community college.
3	(4) To hold, rent, lease, sell, purchase and improve
4	land, buildings, furnishings, equipment, materials, books and
5	supplies.
6	(5) To enter into contracts for services with community
7	education councils, schools, colleges or universities, or
8	with school districts or municipalities, and other applicable
9	or appropriate agencies and organizations, to effectuate the
10	purposes of this article.
11	(6) To accept and receive gifts of real and personal
12	property and Federal, State and local moneys, loans and
13	grants, and to expend the same.
14	(7) To make policies providing for the admission and
15	expulsion of students, the courses of instruction, the
16	tuition and fees to be charged and for all matters related to
17	the government and administration of the rural regional
18	community college, provided that policies related to
19	admission, tuition and fees give preference to residents of
20	the area designated by the secretary pursuant to section
21	<u>1903-G(a)(2).</u>
22	(8) To submit to the secretary for approval proposed
23	amendments to the rural regional community college plan.
24	(9) To enter into contracts for services to high schools
25	located in the area designated by the secretary under section
26	1903-G to provide SERVICES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, <
27	area vocational-technical education services.
28	(10) To approve an annual budget to be submitted to the
29	secretary for funding.
30	(11) To exercise such other powers and perform such

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1	other duties as are necessary to effectuate the purposes of
2	this article.
3	(b) Duties of boardThe board of trustees shall enter into
4	contracts, hold property and take other actions in the name of
5	the rural regional community college.
6	<u>(c) Initial partnership</u>
7	(1) The board of trustees shall select initially a
8	Middle States accredited institution of higher education as a <
9	partner institution to develop and offer accredited courses
10	and programs of study at the approved sites of operation.
11	(2) The partner institution shall select programs in <
12	consultation and ONLY WITH approval of the board of trustees <
13	and consistent with its THE PARTNER INSTITUTION'S <
14	accreditation and shall be responsible for staffing and
15	evaluation and provision of other support services as may be
16	required for students.
17	(3) The board of trustees may contract with other
18	colleges to provide curricula not available through the
19	partner institution.
20	(4) As the rural regional community college is able to
21	operate on its own, a transition plan and budget shall be
22	included in the contract BETWEEN THE RURAL REGIONAL COMMUNITY <
23	COLLEGE AND THE PARTNER INSTITUTION to efficiently expedite
24	the transition for its partner institution or institutions. <
25	(5) Nothing in this article shall be construed to
26	preclude the board of trustees from contracting for specific
27	services or programs following the transition from the
28	initial operating partner institution. <
29	Section 1907-G. Officers of rural regional community college.
30	(a) PresidentThe president shall be the chief executive

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1	and administrative officer of the rural regional community
2	college and shall perform all duties which the board of trustees
3	may prescribe. The president shall have the right to attend
4	meetings of the board of trustees and to be heard on all matters
5	before it, but shall have no right to vote on any matter.
6	(b) Chief financial officerThe chief financial officer of
7	the rural regional community college shall give a proper bond in
8	such amount and with such corporate surety as is approved by the
9	board of trustees. The chief financial officer shall file the
10	bond with the board of trustees. The account of the chief
11	financial officer shall be audited biannually by a certified
12	public accountant or other qualified public accountant selected
13	by the board of trustees.
14	Section 1908-G. Students.
15	Any individual may apply for admission to the rural regional
16	community college established under this article, provided that
17	preference in admissions, tuition and fees may be given to
18	residents of the multicounty area designated by the secretary
19	pursuant to section 1903-G(a)(2). In considering applicants for
20	admission, the rural regional community college shall not
21	discriminate on the basis of race, color, gender, marital
22	<u>status, ethnic group or religion.</u>
23	Section 1909-G. Tuition.
24	The tuition and fees charged by the rural regional community
25	college shall be an amount determined by the board of trustees,
26	in accordance with the budget submitted to the secretary. The
27	board of trustees shall annually establish a separate schedule
28	of tuition and fees for students that reside inside the region
29	DESIGNATED UNDER SECTION 1903-G(A)(2) and students that reside <
30	outside the SAID region designated under section 1903-G(a)(2). <
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1	Section 1910-G. Dissolution and transition of rural regional
2	community college.
3	The rural regional community college established under this
4	article may not be dissolved without the approval of the
5	secretary. Upon dissolution of the rural regional community
6	college, the Commonwealth shall assume all assets and
7	liabilities of the rural regional community college, except that
8	such assets that are the property of any partner institution
9	that may be operating for and within the rural regional
10	community college shall remain the property of the PARTNER <
11	institution.
12	Section 1911-G. Degrees.
13	The rural regional community college established under this
14	article may award any type of diploma, technical or career
15	training certificate or degree not to exceed the level of an
16	associate of arts or sciences degree. As long as the Middle_ <
17	States accredited PARTNER institution provides the accredited <
18	curricula and courses under contract to the rural regional
19	community college, the requirements of the accrediting agency
20	shall pertain to the designation GRANTING of such awards. <
21	Section 1912-G. Funding.
22	The rural regional community college established under this
23	article shall be funded by tuition and fees established by the
24	board of trustees, and may accept appropriations from the
25	General Assembly, grants from the Federal Government, grants
26	from the Commonwealth, grants from private foundations or any
27	combination thereof.
28	Section 1913-G. Financial aid.
29	Students enrolled in the rural regional community college
30	established under this article shall be eligible for financial
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1	aid to the extent permitted under Federal and State law.
2	Section 1914-G. Regulations.
3	The State Board may promulgate regulations pursuant to the
4	act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory
5	Review Act, as necessary to implement this article.
6	<u>Section 1915-G. Reports.</u>
7	The Legislative Budget and Finance Committee shall prepare
8	and submit to the General Assembly written interim and final
9	reports evaluating the operation of this article. The interim
10	report shall be submitted by June 30, 2018, and the final report
11	shall be submitted by June 30, 2022. Each report shall include,
12	but may not be limited to, the following:
13	(1) A review of the success of the rural regional
14	community college established under this article in
15	satisfying the goals set forth in the rural regional
16	community college plan approved by the secretary and in
17	satisfying the needs of the multicounty area the rural
18	regional community college was established to serve.
19	(2) Demographic and program data, including the
20	following:
21	(i) Numbers of full-time and part-time faculty and
22	student enrollments, in total and within curricular
23	areas.
24	(ii) Dual enrollment participation.
25	(iii) Credit hours taught by faculty.
26	(iv) Distance learning courses offered.
27	(v) Articulation agreements with higher education
28	institutions.
29	(vi) Lists of courses with fewer than 20 students.
30	(vii) Lists of courses with more than 50 students.

1	Where available, student data shall be disaggregated by
2	categories, including gender, race and age.
3	(3) Student progress and achievement measures, including
4	the following:
5	(i) Retention rates related to student goals.
6	(ii) Graduation and completion rates after two,
7	three and four years.
8	(iii) Passing rates on certification and licensure
9	<u>examinations.</u>
10	<u>(iv) Number of students employed within one year of</u>
11	program completion.
12	(v) Placement into additional education or
13	employment in the student's field of study.
14	Where available, data shall be disaggregated by categories,
15	including gender, race and age.
16	(4) Economic and work force development measures,
17	including:
18	(i) Employer satisfaction.
19	(ii) Customized job training offerings.
20	<u>(iii) Employment status.</u>
21	(iv) Numbers of businesses and organizations served.
22	(5) Recommendations for future legislation.
23	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
