AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Veterans' Housing Assistance Program; and 2 making appropriations.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be shall be known and may be cited as the
- 7 Preventing Veterans' Homelessness Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency.
- 13 "Costs associated with rental." The total costs of rent and
- 14 utilities, per month, for a residential rental unit.
- 15 "Department." The Department of Military and Veterans
- 16 Affairs of the Commonwealth.
- 17 "Financial assistance." The rental voucher established under

- 1 section 5(a).
- 2 "Homeless veteran." A veteran identified and determined by
- 3 the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs to be homeless
- 4 or at imminent risk of becoming homeless according to guidelines
- 5 established by the department.
- 6 "Housing ombudsman." An individual designated by the
- 7 Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency to carry out the duties and
- 8 responsibilities under section 3(c)(1).
- 9 "Program." The Veterans' Housing Assistance Program
- 10 established under section 3.
- "Veteran." An individual who served on active duty in the
- 12 United States Armed Forces, including any of the following:
- 13 (1) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
- 14 discharged or released from the service under honorable
- 15 conditions.
- 16 (2) A reservist or member of the National Guard who
- 17 completed an initial term of enlistment or qualifying period
- 18 of service.
- 19 (3) A reservist or member of the National Guard who was
- 20 disabled in the line of duty during training.
- 21 Section 3. Veterans' Housing Assistance Program.
- 22 (a) Establishment. -- There is established a Veterans' Housing
- 23 Assistance Program which shall be administered by the agency in
- 24 coordination with the department.
- 25 (b) Duties of department. -- The department shall do all of
- 26 the following:
- 27 (1) Implement a program to identify homeless veterans
- for purposes of enrolling them in the program.
- 29 (2) Coordinate with the agency to ensure that homeless
- 30 veterans are provided the opportunity to receive assistance

- from the agency's housing ombudsman or financial assistance
- 2 from the agency.
- 3 (3) Establish guidelines to assist with the
- 4 implementation of this act.
- 5 (c) Duties of agency. -- The agency shall do all of the
- 6 following:
- 7 (1) Establish a housing ombudsman or contract with a
- 8 nonprofit organization to provide housing location,
- 9 relocation and stabilization services to homeless veterans,
- including negotiating lease agreements with public agencies
- or private landlords on behalf of a homeless veteran.
- 12 (2) Provide or contract with a third party to provide
- credit counseling services to homeless veterans to resolve
- 14 personal credit issues that may have resulted in a negative
- 15 credit report.
- 16 (3) Award financial assistance to eligible homeless
- 17 veterans determined to be in need of financial assistance to
- 18 obtain housing.
- 19 (4) Establish guidelines to assist with the
- 20 implementation of this act.
- 21 Section 4. Enrollment.
- 22 (a) Procedure. -- A veteran may enroll in the program by
- 23 filing an application with the department or the agency. A
- 24 veteran shall be eliqible for enrollment if the veteran meets
- 25 all of the following:
- 26 (1) Is homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless
- 27 as defined in departmental guidelines established under
- section 3.
- 29 (2) Cannot obtain adequate housing without the
- 30 assistance of the department and the agency.

- 1 (b) Conditions. -- The department may require an eligible
- 2 veteran to engage in or complete any of the following activities
- 3 as a condition of acceptance into the program:
- 4 (1) Mental health counseling, including treatment and
- 5 recovery support.
- 6 (2) Substance abuse treatment and recovery support,
- 7 including counseling, treatment planning, recovery coaching
- 8 and relapse prevention.
- 9 (3) Integrated, coordinated treatment for co-occurring
- 10 disorders.
- 11 (4) Health education, including referrals for medical
- 12 and dental care.
- 13 (5) Services or activities designed to promote self-
- 14 sufficiency, including:
- 15 (i) Job training.
- 16 (ii) Assistance in seeking employment.
- 17 (iii) Job placement services, including job
- 18 readiness, literacy and skills training.
- 19 (iv) Credit counseling services and remediation.
- 20 (v) Benefits advocacy.
- 21 (vi) Money management.
- 22 (vii) Parental skills and family support programs.
- 23 (viii) Other self-help programs deemed necessary by
- the department.
- 25 Section 5. Financial assistance.
- 26 (a) Rental voucher. -- The agency may award financial
- 27 assistance in accordance with section 3(c) to any veteran deemed
- 28 to be in need of the assistance based on the veteran's personal
- 29 finances. Financial assistance shall be awarded to an eliqible
- 30 veteran in the form of a housing rental voucher payable to the

- 1 lessor named in any leasing document executed between the
- 2 veteran and a landlord.
- 3 (b) Amount.--The monthly amount of the rental voucher may
- 4 not exceed the costs associated with the rental or \$1,000,
- 5 whichever is less.
- 6 (c) Term.--Financial assistance shall be awarded to a
- 7 veteran for the term of the lease executed between the veteran
- 8 and the lessor or for 12 months from the effective date of the
- 9 lease, whichever is less.
- 10 Section 6. Renewal.
- 11 A veteran receiving financial assistance under section 5 may
- 12 seek an extension of the term of the financial assistance by
- 13 filing an application with the department. In determining
- 14 whether to extend the term of the financial assistance, the
- 15 department shall consider the following concerning the
- 16 veteran's:
- 17 (1) Employment status.
- 18 (2) Personal finances.
- 19 (3) Compliance with conditions of enrollment placed on
- the veteran under section 4(b).
- 21 Section 7. Cooperation.
- The department and the agency may cooperate with the United
- 23 States Department of Veterans Affairs or local public housing
- 24 authorities to carry out the provisions of this act. At the
- 25 discretion of the department and the agency, the cooperation may
- 26 include coordinating the program with any existing Federal
- 27 program that provides funding for housing for homeless veterans,
- 28 including the United States Department of Housing and Urban
- 29 Development and Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH)
- 30 program.

- 1 Section 8. Appropriations.
- 2 (a) Agency.--The sum of \$12,500,000 is appropriated from the
- 3 General Fund to the agency for the period of July 1, 2014, to
- 4 June 30, 2015, for purposes of providing financial assistance to
- 5 homeless veterans and carrying out the agency's responsibilities
- 6 under this act. Not more than \$500,000 of the funds appropriated
- 7 under this section may be used for administrative costs incurred
- 8 by the agency to carry out this act.
- 9 (b) Department.--The sum of \$500,000 is appropriated from
- 10 the General Fund to the department for the period of July 1,
- 11 2014, to June 30, 2015, for purposes of carrying out the
- 12 department's responsibilities under this act.
- 13 Section 20. Effective date.
- 14 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
