## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 31, 1945 (P.L.1198, No.418), entitled, as amended, "An Act providing for the conservation and 1
- 2
- improvement of land affected in connection with surface 3
- mining; regulating such mining; providing for the
- establishment of an Emergency Bond Fund for anthracite deep 5
- mine operators; and providing penalties," establishing the 6
- Aggregate Advisory Board.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 18 of the act of May 31, 1945 (P.L.1198, 10
- 11 No.418), known as the Surface Mining Conservation and
- 12 Reclamation Act, is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 13 Section 18. Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation
- 14 Fund; Remining Environmental Enhancement Fund; Remining
- Financial Assurance Fund; Department Authority for Awarding of 15
- Grants.--\* \* \* 16
- 17 (q.1) There is hereby created an Aggregate Advisory Board to
- 18 assist the secretary to expend the funds for the purposes
- provided by section 17 of the act of December 19, 1984 19
- (P.L.1093, No.219), known as the "Noncoal Surface Mining 20

- 1 Conservation and Reclamation Act," and to advise the secretary
- 2 <u>on all matters pertaining to surface mining, as defined in</u>
- 3 section 3 of the "Noncoal Surface Mining Conservation and
- 4 Reclamation Act," which shall include, but not be limited to
- 5 <u>experimental practices</u>, alternate methods of backfilling,
- 6 <u>obligations for preexisting pollution liability</u>, alteration of
- 7 reclamation plans, reclamation fees and bonding rates and
- 8 methods. The board shall function as follows:
- 9 <u>(1) The board shall be comprised of the secretary; three</u>
- 10 (3) aggregate surface mining operators; four (4) public
- 11 members from the Citizens Advisory Council, who shall be
- appointed by the council; one (1) member from the County
- 13 <u>Conservation Districts, who shall be appointed by the State</u>
- 14 <u>Conservation Commission; four (4) members of the General</u>
- Assembly, two (2) from the Senate, one (1) member from the
- 16 majority party and one (1) member from the minority party,
- 17 who shall be appointed by the President pro tempore, and two
- 18 (2) from the House of Representatives, one (1) from the
- 19 <u>majority party and one (1) from the minority party, who shall</u>
- 20 be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 21 (2) The secretary shall chair the Aggregate Advisory
- 22 Board and appoint the members from the aggregate industry.
- 23 (3) All members shall be appointed for a term of two (2)
- years, except that one-half of the initial members shall
- 25 serve for three (3) years.
- 26 (4) All actions of the board shall be by majority vote.
- The board shall meet upon the call of the secretary, but not
- less than quarterly, to carry out its duties under this act.
- 29 The board shall select from among its members a chairperson
- 30 and such other SUCH officers as it deems appropriate.

- 1 (5) The board shall prepare an annual report on its
- 2 <u>activities and submit the report to the Senate Environmental</u>
- 3 Resources and Energy Committee and the House Environmental\_
- 4 <u>Resources and Energy Committee.</u>

- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
