## AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in rules of the road in general, further 2 prohibiting text-based communications; and prohibiting 3 certain calls on hand-held mobile telephones. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Section 3316(b) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 8 § 3316. Prohibiting text-based communications. \* \* \* 10 11 [(Reserved).] Records.--A record of any violation of 12 this section shall appear on the driving history record or motor 13 vehicle record of any person who commits the violation and the record of the violation shall be available to any motor vehicle 14 15 insurer. \* \* \* 16
- 17 Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 18 § 3317. Prohibiting calls on hand-held mobile telephones.
- 19 (a) Prohibitions.--

Ι	(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, no
2	person shall operate a motor vehicle on a highway or
3	trafficway in this Commonwealth while using a hand-held
4	mobile telephone to engage in a call while such vehicle is in
5	motion.
6	(2) No person under 18 years of age shall use any hand-
7	held mobile telephone, including one with a hands-free
8	accessory while operating a moving motor vehicle on a highway
9	or trafficway in this Commonwealth.
10	(b) Presumption
11	(1) An operator of a motor vehicle who holds a hand-held
12	mobile telephone to or in the immediate proximity of the
13	operator's ear while the motor vehicle is in motion is
14	presumed to be engaging in a call within the meaning of this
15	section.
16	(2) The presumption established by this subsection is
17	rebuttable by evidence which shows that the operator was not
18	engaged in a call.
19	(3) The provisions of this subsection shall not be
20	construed as authorizing the seizure or forfeiture of a hand-
21	held mobile telephone or a mobile electronic device, unless
22	otherwise provided by law.
23	(c) Nonapplicability Subsection (a) shall not apply to:
24	(1) The use of a hand-held mobile telephone for the sole
25	purpose of communicating with any of the following regarding
26	an emergency situation:
27	(i) an emergency response operator;
28	(ii) a hospital, physician's office or health
29	clinic;
30	(iii) an ambulance company;

Τ	<u>(1V) a fire department; or </u>
2	(v) a police department.
3	(2) Any of the following persons while in the
4	performance of their official duties and within the scope of
5	<pre>their employment:</pre>
6	(i) a law enforcement officer;
7	(ii) a firefighter or an operator of an ambulance or
8	authorized emergency vehicle; or
9	(iii) a member of the armed forces of the United
10	States while operating a military vehicle.
11	(3) The use of a hand-held radio by a person with an
12	amateur radio station license issued by the Federal
13	Communications Commission.
14	(4) The use of a hands-free mobile telephone.
15	(d) PenaltyA person who violates subsection (a) commits a
16	summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay
17	a fine of \$100 for the first violation, \$200 for a second
18	violation and \$300 for a third or subsequent violation.
19	(e) Records A record of any violation of this section
20	shall appear on the driving history record or motor vehicle
21	record of any person who commits the violation and the record of
22	the violation shall be available to any motor vehicle insurer.
23	(f) Preemption of local ordinances In accordance with
24	section 6101 (relating to applicability and uniformity of
25	title), this section supersedes and preempts all ordinances of
26	any municipality with regard to the use of a hand-held mobile
27	telephone by the operator of a motor vehicle.
28	(g) Definitions As used in this section, the following
29	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
30	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 1 "Engage in a call." Talking into or listening on a hand-held
- 2 mobile telephone. The term does not include holding a hand-held
- 3 mobile telephone to activate, deactivate or initiate a function
- 4 <u>of such telephone.</u>
- 5 "Hands-free accessory." An attachment, add-on, built-in
- 6 <u>feature or addition to a mobile telephone, whether or not</u>
- 7 permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used allows
- 8 the vehicle operator to maintain both hands on the steering
- 9 wheel.
- 10 "Hands-free mobile telephone." A hand-held mobile telephone
- 11 that has an internal feature or function or that is equipped
- 12 <u>with an attachment or addition, whether or not permanently part</u>
- 13 of such hand-held mobile telephone, by which a user engages in a
- 14 call without the use of either hand, whether or not the use of
- 15 <u>either hand is necessary to activate, deactivate or initiate a</u>
- 16 function of such telephone.
- 17 <u>"Hand-held mobile telephone." A mobile telephone with which</u>
- 18 <u>a user engages in a call using at least one hand.</u>
- 19 "Immediate proximity." The distance that permits an operator
- 20 of a hand-held mobile telephone to hear telecommunications
- 21 transmitted over such hand-held mobile telephone, but does not
- 22 require physical contact with the operator's ear.
- 23 "Mobile electronic device." Any hand-held or other portable
- 24 electronic equipment capable of providing data communication
- 25 between two or more persons, including a text messaging device,
- 26 a paging device, a personal digital assistant, a laptop
- 27 computer, equipment that is capable of playing a video game or a
- 28 digital video disk or equipment on which digital photographs are
- 29 taken or transmitted, or any combination thereof. The term does
- 30 not include any audio equipment or equipment installed in a

- 1 motor vehicle for the purpose of providing navigation, emergency
- 2 assistance to the operator of such motor vehicle or video
- 3 entertainment to the passengers in the rear seats of such motor
- 4 vehicle.
- 5 "Mobile telephone." A cellular, analog, wireless or digital
- 6 <u>telephone capable of sending or receiving telephone</u>
- 7 communications without an access line for service.
- 8 "Using" or "use." Holding a hand-held mobile telephone to or
- 9 in the immediate proximity of the user's ear.
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
