AN ACT

- Establishing the Pennsylvania Grade Crude Development Advisory Council; and providing for duties of the Pennsylvania Grade
- 3 Development and Advisory Council and the Department of
- 4 Environmental Protection and for administrative support.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
- 9 Grade Crude Development Advisory Council Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in the section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Council." The Pennsylvania Grade Crude Development Advisory
- 15 Council.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
- 17 the Commonwealth.
- 18 Section 3. Pennsylvania Grade Crude Development Advisory
- 19 Council.

- 1 (a) Establishment.--There is established the Pennsylvania
- 2 Grade Crude Development Advisory Council.
- 3 (b) Composition.--The council shall consist of the following
- 4 members:
- 5 (1) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development
- 6 or the secretary's designee.
- 7 (2) The Secretary of Environmental Protection or the
- 8 secretary's designee.
- 9 (3) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President
- 10 pro tempore of the Senate.
- 11 (4) Two members of the House of Representatives
- appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 13 (5) The following members appointed by the Governor:
- 14 (i) Two representatives of the Pennsylvania
- 15 Independent Petroleum Producers.
- 16 (ii) Two representatives of the Pennsylvania
- 17 Independent Oil and Gas Association.
- 18 (iii) Two representatives of the Pennsylvania Grade
- 19 Crude Oil Coalition.
- 20 (iv) Two representatives of refineries of
- 21 Pennsylvania grade crude oil.
- (v) One representative of a nonprofit corporation,
- which has the purpose of promoting the history and
- economic benefits of the conventional oil and gas
- industry in this Commonwealth.
- 26 (vi) One representative of academia who is a
- geologist with an expertise in petroleum geology.
- 28 (vii) One representative of academia who is a
- 29 hydrologist.
- 30 (c) Chairperson.—The council shall elect a chairperson from

- 1 among its members.
- 2 (d) Meetings. -- The council shall meet upon the call of the
- 3 chairperson, but not less than semiannually. A simple majority
- 4 of the members shall constitute a quorum.
- 5 (e) Terms.--
- 6 (1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2), the
- 7 legislative members of the council shall serve two-year terms
- 8 commencing with the first Tuesday in January of odd-numbered
- 9 years and may be reappointed upon reelection to office.
- 10 (2) Of the initial members appointed by the President
- 11 pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
- 12 Representatives, members shall serve until the first Tuesday
- in January of the first odd-numbered year after the end of
- 14 the year during which this section takes effect.
- 15 (3) Of the initial members appointed by the Governor:
- 16 (i) Four members shall serve initial terms of one
- 17 year.
- 18 (ii) Four members shall serve initial terms of two
- 19 years.
- 20 (iii) Three members shall serve initial terms of
- three years.
- 22 (4) After the initial terms, individuals appointed by
- 23 the Governor shall serve for a term of three years.
- 24 (5) Individuals appointed by the Governor may be
- appointed to successive terms.
- 26 (f) Vacancies.--Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder
- 27 of an unexpired term in the same manner as original
- 28 appointments. A member, upon expiration of the term, shall
- 29 continue to hold office until a successor is appointed.
- 30 (g) Quorum. -- A majority of the membership of the council

- 1 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 2 Action may be taken on a matter before the council by a majority
- 3 vote of the full membership of the council.
- 4 (h) Compensation. -- Council members may not receive
- 5 compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for all
- 6 necessary travel and other reasonable expenses incurred in
- 7 connection with the performance of their duties as members.
- 8 Section 4. Study and report.
- 9 (a) Study.--The council shall:
- 10 (1) Examine and make recommendations regarding existing
- 11 technical regulations promulgated under 58 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 12 to oil and gas) and policies implemented by the department
- that impact the conventional oil and gas industry of this
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 (2) Develop a regulatory scheme that provides for
- 16 environmental oversight and enforcement specifically
- 17 applicable to the conventional oil and gas industry.
- 18 (3) Ensure that its study addresses the need to preserve
- 19 the long-term viability of the conventional oil and gas
- 20 industry.
- 21 (b) Report.--The council shall issue a report of its
- 22 findings and recommendations under subsection (a) to all of the
- 23 following:
- 24 (1) The Governor.
- 25 (2) The Secretary of Environmental Protection.
- 26 (3) The President pro tempore of the Senate.
- 27 (4) The Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 28 (5) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 29 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate.
- 30 (6) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.

- 1 (7) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 2 (8) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 3 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the House of
- 4 Representatives.
- 5 (c) Deadline. -- The council shall submit the report under
- 6 subsection (b) within 180 days of the effective date of this
- 7 act.
- 8 Section 5. Duties of council.
- 9 The council shall have the following duties:
- 10 (1) To assist the Secretary of Environmental Protection
- and provide written comments on new departmental policy that
- 12 will impact the conventional oil and gas industry of this
- 13 Commonwealth, including economic consequences.
- 14 (2) To review and comment on the formulation and
- drafting of all technical regulations promulgated under 58
- 16 Pa.C.S. (relating to oil and gas).
- 17 (3) To provide institutional support for the
- conventional oil and gas industry of this Commonwealth by
- ensuring effective cooperation and communication among
- 20 governmental agencies and the academic and research
- 21 community.
- 22 (4) To recommend appropriate measures relating to the
- promotion and development of the conventional oil and gas
- industry of this Commonwealth.
- 25 (5) To develop a plan to increase Pennsylvania grade
- crude oil production to more adequately supply the refineries
- which depend on Pennsylvania grade crude oil.
- 28 (6) To develop a joint working group with the department
- 29 to explore and develop economically viable production water
- 30 management options.

- 1 Section 6. Duties of department.
- 2 The department shall have the following duties:
- 3 (1) To consult with the council on all policies and
- 4 technical regulations promulgated under 58 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 5 to oil and gas).
- 6 (2) To include any written comments of the council
- 7 received before the department's submission of a proposed
- 8 rulemaking package to the Environmental Quality Board, as
- 9 part of its submission to the Environmental Quality Board.
- 10 Section 7. Administrative support.
- 11 The Department of Community and Economic Development shall
- 12 provide administrative support, office space and any other
- 13 technical assistance required by the council to carry out its
- 14 duties under this act.
- 15 Section 8. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect immediately.
