INTRODUCED AND ADOPTED, MARCH 20, 2013

A RESOLUTION

1 Designating April 7 through 14, 2013, as "Days of Remembrance of
2 the Victims of the Holocaust" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945 six million Jews were murdered in
4 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic pogrom of genocide,
5 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and

6 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always
7 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such
8 horrors are never repeated and should continually rededicate
9 themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and

10 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain
11 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and should recognize that
12 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and

13 WHEREAS, April 8, 2013, also recognized as 26 Nisan 5773 in
14 the Hebrew calendar, has been designated internationally as a
15 Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known as
16 Yom Hashoah; and

1 WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the people of this
2 Commonwealth to join in the international commemoration;
3 therefore be it

4 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate April 7 through 14, 2013,
5 as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust" in
6 Pennsylvania, in memory of the victims of the Holocaust in the
7 hope that we may strive to overcome prejudice and inhumanity
8 through education, vigilance and resistance.
