A RESOLUTION

Designating April 7 through 14, 2013, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust" in Pennsylvania. 1 2 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945 six million Jews were murdered in 3 4 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic pogrom of genocide, 5 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and 6 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always 7 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such 8 horrors are never repeated and should continually rededicate 9 themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and 10 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain 11 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and should recognize that 12 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and 13 WHEREAS, April 8, 2013, also recognized as 26 Nisan 5773 in 14 the Hebrew calendar, has been designated internationally as a 15 Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known as Yom Hashoah; and 16
