2 appreciating its contributions to the art and culture of this
3 Commonwealth and the world.

4 WHEREAS, In 1983, The Hooters, an internationally famous rock
5 band from Philadelphia, released its first album, *Amore*, which
6 sold more than 100,000 copies; and

7 WHEREAS, The band's first major label release, *Nervous Night*,
8 sold more than 2.5 million copies; and

9 WHEREAS, The band, known for its live performances, was the
10 opening act of Live Aid, joined Pink Floyd's Roger Waters for
11 his performances of "The Wall" and played the famed Amnesty
12 International Concerts; and

13 WHEREAS, The band has collaborated with artists such as Taj
14 Mahal, Mick Jagger, Willie Nelson and Jon Bon Jovi; and

15 WHEREAS, The Hooters hit songs include "And We Danced," "Day
16 by Day," "Where Do the Children Go," "All You Zombies,"
17 "Fightin' on the Same Side," "Satellite" and "500 Miles"; and

18 WHEREAS, The band has also written for and performed with

1 artists such as Cyndi Lauper, Joan Osborne and Ricky Martin,
2 including international hits "Time After Time" and "What if God
3 Was One of Us"; and

4 WHEREAS, The Hooters consists of Eric Bazilian, Rob Hyman,
5 David Uosikkinen, John Lilley and Fran Smith Jr; and

6 WHEREAS, Even after 30 years, the band is still recording
7 music and members of the band still live in and around
8 Philadelphia; therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the Senate congratulate The Hooters on 30
10 years of success and appreciate its contributions to the art and
11 culture of this Commonwealth and the world.
