- Designating the week of May 19 through 25, 2013, as "Emergency
- Medical Services Week" and May 22, 2013, as "Emergency 2
- Medical Services for Children (EMSC) Day," with the theme, "EMS: One Mission, One Team," in Pennsylvania.

- WHEREAS, Emergency medical services are a vital public 5

- ready to provide lifesaving care to those in need 24 hours a 8
- day, seven days a week; and
- WHEREAS, Access to quality emergency care dramatically 10
- improves the survival and recovery rate of those who experience 11
- sudden illness or injury; and 12
- 13 WHEREAS, The emergency medical services system consists of
- 14 emergency physicians, emergency nurses, rescue personnel,
- emergency medical technicians, paramedics, prehospital nurses, 15
- air medical personnel, emergency responders, first responders, 16
- ambulance attendants, emergency vehicle operators, firefighters, 17

- 1 police officers, educators, dispatchers, administrators and
- 2 others; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The members of emergency medical services teams,
- 4 whether career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of
- 5 specialized training and continuing education to enhance their
- 6 lifesaving skills; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The needs of children are different from the needs
- 8 of adults in medical emergencies; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Emergency Medical Services for Children Program
- 10 (EMSC) promotes the high-level emergency care given by emergency
- 11 medical services providers with pediatric emergency skills; and
- 12 WHEREAS, EMSC assists in the implementation of training for
- 13 use of advanced technical equipment and services in preparation
- 14 to save the life of a child; and
- WHEREAS, Emergency medical services providers are unceasingly
- 16 prepared to respond to children who access the system and return
- 17 them to an optimum level of health; and
- WHEREAS, EMSC works with physicians, nurses, social workers,
- 19 psychologists, rescue personnel, emergency medical technicians,
- 20 paramedics, prehospital nurses, air medical personnel, emergency
- 21 medical responders, emergency vehicle operators, firefighters,
- 22 police officers, educators, dispatchers, administrators and
- 23 others to identify and address the issues surrounding the
- 24 provision of optimal pediatric care; and
- 25 WHEREAS, EMSC assists in the development of training programs
- 26 and guidelines for emergency care providers so that children
- 27 with special health care needs receive timely and appropriate
- 28 care;
- 29 WHEREAS, It is appropriate to recognize the value and the
- 30 accomplishments of emergency medical services providers and EMSC

- 1 by designating "Emergency Medical Services Week" and "Emergency
- 2 Medical Services for Children (EMSC) Day"; therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of May 19
- 4 through 25, 2013, as "Emergency Medical Services Week" and May
- 5 22, 2013, as "Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC)
- 6 Day," with the theme, "EMS: One Mission, One Team," in
- 7 Pennsylvania and encourage the community to observe this week
- 8 with appropriate programs, ceremonies and activities.
