## A RESOLUTION

- Designating November 13, 2013, as "Pennsylvania Career Development Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, In today's economy, all students must graduate high
- 4 school well informed of the vast array of career choices
- 5 available to them, and knowing how to pursue their aspirations
- 6 in order to successfully participate in Pennsylvania's
- 7 workforce; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Education has adopted
- 9 Career Education and Work Standards that require all high school
- 10 graduates to demonstrate their competency in the areas of career
- 11 awareness and preparation, career acquisition (getting a job),
- 12 career retention and advancement and entrepreneurship as a
- 13 requirement for graduation; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Research predicts that within the next ten years,
- 15 63% of all jobs in the nation will require some postsecondary
- 16 education and that 90% of new jobs in growing industries with
- 17 high wages will require some postsecondary education; and

- 1 WHEREAS, There is a gap between students' aspirations to
- 2 pursue postsecondary education or training and their
- 3 preparedness for such opportunities; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Students who graduate from high school having
- 5 experienced meaningful career planning and development have the
- 6 knowledge, skills and attitudes sought by employers, are
- 7 qualified for high-paying, in-demand jobs, and are better
- 8 prepared to contribute to a stable, world class work force for
- 9 Pennsylvania; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Underserved groups, such as minorities, students
- 11 with low socioeconomic status, those who are the first in their
- 12 families to attend college, those who have physical and academic
- 13 challenges, and those seeking careers that do not require a four
- 14 year college degree often require additional support; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The Capital Region Partnership for Career
- 16 Development collaborates with many businesses, organizations and
- 17 State agencies to provide students with career exploration
- 18 experiences, programs and resources that help them become
- 19 knowledgeable about traditional, nontraditional and emerging
- 20 postsecondary educational opportunities and career paths; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Schools and educators need support from the Capital
- 22 Region Partnership for Career Development and other
- 23 organizations to maintain adequate and effective career
- 24 development programs, as well as support for employer networking
- 25 and teacher training to expand their knowledge of evolving
- 26 career opportunities for students; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The Capital Region Partnership for Career
- 28 Development recognizes the critical need for schools, employers,
- 29 postsecondary institutions and various community and government
- 30 agencies to collaborate on workforce development to ensure

- 1 career success for the youth of Pennsylvania; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate of Pennsylvania designate November
- 3 13, 2013, as "Pennsylvania Career Development Day" in
- 4 Pennsylvania.
