A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing 2014 as the "Year of the Veteran" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 WHEREAS, Philadelphia is the birthplace of the United States
- 3 Army, United States Navy and United States Marine Corps,
- 4 establishing a link between Pennsylvania and those who have
- 5 served our country dating back to pre-Revolutionary War times;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Veterans from past wars and peace time, as well as
- 8 those currently returning to this Commonwealth from overseas
- 9 military duty, are part of the foundation of our community
- 10 having served our country by putting themselves in harm's way
- 11 and, in some cases, making the ultimate sacrifice in order to
- 12 protect us and preserve our liberties; and
- 13 WHEREAS, There are nearly 1 million veterans living in this
- 14 Commonwealth with service spanning World War II until the
- 15 present, men and women, of all races, religions, ethnicities,

- 2 WHEREAS, A new generation of veterans, including many female
- 3 veterans, are returning from service and choosing to live, work
- 4 and further their educations in this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Many veterans face challenges in living to their
- 6 fullest potential because of the injuries, both mental and
- 7 physical, suffered during their service; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Veterans offer this Commonwealth a talented and
