A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of September 14 through 20, 2014, as "InfantSEE Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Early detection of vision problems is the best way
4	to treat and prevent vision impairment; and
5	WHEREAS, Member optometrists of the American Optometric
6	Association and the Vision Care Institute of Johnson & Johnson
7	Vision Care, Inc., have partnered to create "InfantSEE," a
8	public health program to provide a one-time, no-cost eye
9	assessment for infants who are six to twelve months old; and
10	WHEREAS, Undetected vision problems can lead to permanent
11	vision impairment, contribute to a decrease in a child's quality
12	of life and may lead to developmental and behavioral
13	difficulties which impede classroom learning as well as increase
14	the costs to society; and
15	WHEREAS, Even if no eye or vision problems are apparent, the
16	American Optometric Association recommends scheduling a baby's
17	first eye assessment at six months of age; and

1 WHEREAS, One in ten children are at risk from undiagnosed eye 2 and vision problems and one in 30 children will be affected by 3 amblyopia, a leading cause of vision loss in people younger than 4 45 years of age; therefore be it

5 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of September 14 6 through 20, 2014, as "InfantSEE Week" in Pennsylvania.
