## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of November 2014 as "Adoption Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Every child deserves a loving, nurturing permanent
- 4 home where they can feel cared for, safe and supported; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The family is the foundation of any society and
- 6 children need permanent love, care and protection of a family to
- 7 grow into healthy and productive adults; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Adoption provides children with a lifetime of
- 9 emotional and legal connections to a family; and
- 10 WHEREAS, As of 2012, there were 1,924 children in this
- 11 Commonwealth waiting to be adopted; and
- 12 WHEREAS, For children waiting to be adopted in this
- 13 Commonwealth, the average length of stay in care is more than
- 14 three years; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Older children are not as likely to be adopted as
- 16 younger children; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The average age of Pennsylvania's adopted children
- 2 is about six years of age, with research showing that for youth
- 3 over nine years of age, the likelihood of being adopted
- 4 significantly drops; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The collaboration of both public and private
- 6 adoption agencies should be recognized for their commitment to
- 7 the needs of children throughout this Commonwealth; therefore be
- 8 it
