15	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
16	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
17	<pre>context clearly indicates otherwise:</pre>
18	"Commonwealth agency." As defined in 71 Pa.C.S. § 4102

- 1 <u>"Public safety official." An individual referred to in 18</u>
- 2 Pa.C.S. § 2702(c) (relating to aggravated assault), except
- 3 paragraphs (22), (26), (27), (28), (29), (30), (31), (32), (33)
- 4 and (36). The term includes any person who is determined to be a
- 5 <u>law enforcement officer for purposes of the act of February 14,</u>
- 6 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.
- 7 § 202. Confidentiality request.
- 8 (a) Written request.--
- 9 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, upon
- 10 <u>receiving a written request from a public safety official, a</u>
- 11 <u>political subdivision or a Commonwealth agency may not</u>
- 12 <u>disclose the home address, personal telephone number or e-</u>
- 13 <u>mail address of the public safety official or his or her</u>
- spouse, child or parent.
- 15 (2) A written request under paragraph (1) must be signed
- by the public safety official and must include the name and
- 17 address of the public safety official and the name of any
- 18 spouse, child or parent for whom confidentiality is
- 19 requested.
- 20 <u>(b) Penalty.--</u>
- 21 (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), a person who
- knowingly discloses information protected from disclosure
- 23 <u>under subsection (a) commits a summary offense.</u>
- 24 (2) A person who commits a second or subsequent
- violation of this section, or a first offense if the intent
- of the person was to cause substantial harm or serious
- 27 <u>inconvenience</u>, constitutes a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 28 (c) Rules and regulations. -- The Attorney General shall
- 29 promulgate rules and regulations necessary to carry out this
- 30 section.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
