- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
 Statutes, in preliminary provisions, further providing for
 the definition of "emergency service responder" and providing
 for the definitions of "electric cooperative personnel" and
- ror the definitions of "electric cooperative personner" and "electric utility personnel"; and, in rules of the road in
- general, further providing for duty of driver in emergency

- 10 Section 1. The definition of "emergency service responder"
- 11 in section 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 12 Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph and the section is
- 13 amended by adding definitions to read:
- 14 § 102. Definitions.
- 15 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 16 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
- 17 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
- 18 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly

- 1 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

- 3 "Electric cooperative personnel." Individuals who:
- 4 (1) work as employees or contractors of an electric
- 5 <u>cooperative;</u>
- 6 (2) provide disaster emergency-related services,
- 7 <u>including repair, renovation, installation, construction and</u>
- 8 <u>activities related to damaged, impaired or destroyed</u>
- 9 infrastructure; and
- 10 (3) perform services under paragraph (2) within the
- first 72 hours after a declared emergency or until the
- 12 <u>expiration of a declared emergency</u>, whichever is later.

- "Electric utility personnel." Individuals who:
- 15 (1) work as employees or contractors of an electric
- 16 utility;
- 17 (2) provide disaster emergency-related services,
- 18 including repair, renovation, installation, construction and
- 19 activities related to damaged, impaired or destroyed
- 20 infrastructure; and
- 21 (3) perform services under paragraph (2) within the
- first 72 hours after a declared emergency or until the
- 23 <u>expiration of a declared emergency</u>, whichever is later.

- 25 "Emergency service responder." An individual acting in an
- 26 official capacity as any of the following:

- 1 Section 2. Section 3327(f) of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 2 § 3327. Duty of driver in emergency response areas.
- 3 * * *
- 4 (f) Definition.--As used in this section, the [term
- 5 "emergency response area" means the] <u>following words and phrases</u>
- 6 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
- 7 "Emergency response area." Any of the following:
- 8 <u>(1) The</u> area in which emergency service responders
- 9 render emergency assistance to individuals on or near a
- 10 roadway or a police officer is conducting a traffic stop or
- 11 systematic check of vehicles or controlling or directing
- traffic as long as the emergency vehicle is making use of
- visual signals meeting the requirements of Subchapter D of
- 14 Chapter 45.
- 15 (2) The area in which electric cooperative personnel or
- 16 electric utility personnel provide disaster emergency-related
- 17 services within the first 72 hours after a declared emergency
- or until the expiration of a declared emergency, whichever is
- 19 later, as long as the electric cooperative personnel or
- 20 electric utility personnel vehicle is making use of visual
- 21 signals as authorized under section 4572(b) (relating to
- visual signals on authorized vehicles).
