AN ACT

1 Designating the bridge carrying U.S. Route 222 Business over the
2 Schuylkill River, Riverfront Drive and Norfolk Southern
3 Railroad in the City of Reading, Berks County, commonly
4 referred to as the Bingaman Street Bridge, as the 65th U.S.
5 Infantry Regiment, Borinqueneers Memorial Bridge.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. 65th U.S. Infantry Regiment, Borinqueneers
9 Memorial Bridge.

10 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds as follows:

11 (1) "The Borinqueneers" were the only all-Hispanic unit
12 in the history of the United States Army.

13 (2) "The Borinqueneers" is a nickname for the 65th
14 Infantry Regiment of the 3rd Division in the United States
15 Army, an all-volunteer Puerto Rican unit. The name was
16 derived from the name borinquen meaning "land of the brave
17 lord."

1 (3) The unit was founded in 1899 and remained a vital
2 part of the United States Armed Forces until 1956.

3 (4) "The Borinqueneers" displayed valiant and
4 meritorious service in World War I, World War II and the
5 Korean War.

6 (5) More than 62,000 Puerto Ricans joined the military
7 during World War II and more than 43,000 Puerto Ricans served
8 in the Korean War.

9 (6) While in Korea, "the Borinqueneers" served in nine
10 separate military campaigns, where hundreds of men gave their
11 lives in service to their country.

12 (7) In 1959, the regiment was allotted to the Puerto
13 Rico Army National Guard, where the 1st Battalion, 65th
14 Infantry still serves.

15 (8) Since inception of the unit, more than 20,000 Puerto
16 Ricans have served as "Borinqueneers," but their
17 contributions and sacrifices have gone largely unnoticed by
18 the country at large.

19 (9) While defending the United States, these brave
20 soldiers have earned 628 Bronze Stars, 258 Silver Stars, 10
21 Distinguished Service Crosses and more than 2,700 Purple
22 Hearts.

23 (b) Designation.--The bridge carrying U.S. Route 222
24 Business over the Schuylkill River, Riverfront Drive and Norfolk
25 Southern Railroad in the City of Reading, Berks County, commonly
26 referred to as the Bingaman Street Bridge, is hereby designated
27 the 65th U.S. Infantry Regiment, Borinqueneers Memorial Bridge.

28 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
29 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
30 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
