- Making a supplemental appropriation from the General Fund to the
- Department of Education for the purpose of payment of basic education funding to school districts for the fiscal year 3
- July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016. 4
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 6
- Section 1. Appropriation.
- For fiscal year 2015-2016, the sum of \$3,097,540,000 is 8
- hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
- 10 Education for the payment of basic education funding to school
- districts. This appropriation shall be a supplemental 11
- 12 appropriation and shall be in addition to the appropriation
- 13 contained in the act of December 29, 2015 (P.L. , No.10A),
- 14 known as the General Appropriation Act of 2015, vetoed in part.
- 15 Section 2. Deduction of expenditures under temporary
- 16 expenditure symbols and prior law.

- 1 Any money that has been expended under temporary expenditure
- 2 symbols approved by the Office of the Budget and paid after June
- 3 30, 2015, through the date of enactment of this act and has not
- 4 been deducted from the corresponding appropriation in the act of
- 5 December 29, 2015 (P.L. , No.10A), known as the General
- 6 Appropriation Act of 2015, vetoed in part, shall be deducted
- 7 from the corresponding appropriation in this act.
- 8 Section 3. Lapsing of unused funds.
- 9 Except as otherwise provided by law, any portion of the
- 10 appropriation in this act unexpended, uncommitted or
- 11 unencumbered as of June 30, 2016, shall automatically lapse as
- 12 of that date.
- 13 Section 4. Retroactivity.
- 14 This act shall apply retroactively to July 1, 2015.
- 15 Section 5. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect immediately.
