## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled, 1 as amended, "An act relating to the finances of the State 2 government; providing for the settlement, assessment, 3 collection, and lien of taxes, bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the collection and recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, including escheated property and the 7 proceeds of its sale, the custody and disbursement or other 8 9 disposition of funds and securities belonging to or in the possession of the Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims 10 against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and 11 appeals to the courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to 12 the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth 13 and all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting 14 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 15 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 16 17 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of 18 19 section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 20 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 21 22 department, board, commission, and officer of the State 23 government, every political subdivision of the State, and certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, 24 association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or 25 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 26 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 27 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 28 29 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 30 Commonwealth," in general budget implementation, providing for appropriations during budget impasse. 31

This act shall be referred to as the Budget Continuation Act.

- 1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 2 hereby enacts as follows:
- 3 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known
- 4 as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a subarticle to read:
- 5 SUBARTICLE G
- 6 BUDGET CONTINUATION
- 7 <u>Section 1799.10-E. Definitions.</u>
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this subarticle
- 9 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 "Budget impasse." A period when the Commonwealth has not
- 12 <u>enacted a general appropriation act for the fiscal year, which</u>
- 13 has been passed by the General Assembly and signed by the
- 14 Governor, on or before July 1 for that fiscal year.
- 15 <u>Section 1799.11-E. Appropriations during budget impasse.</u>
- 16 (a) Appropriations. -- Unless prohibited by Federal law and
- 17 except as provided under subsection (b), during a budget
- 18 impasse, the same amount of money appropriated for a line item
- 19 in the general appropriation act for the prior fiscal year shall
- 20 be appropriated for the current fiscal year.
- 21 (b) Exceptions. -- The provisions of subsection (a) shall not
- 22 apply to the following:
- 23 (1) Appropriations for any of the following:
- 24 <u>(i) The Office of the Governor.</u>
- 25 <u>(ii) The Office of the Lieutenant Governor.</u>
- 26 <u>(iii) The Senate.</u>
- 27 <u>(iv) The House of Representatives.</u>
- 28 (2) Appropriations, other than those specified under
- 29 <u>subsection (a), enacted for the current fiscal year.</u>
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
