Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in detainers and 2 extradition, providing for coordination with Department of 3 Homeland Security. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. The heading of Subchapter D of Chapter 91 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to 8 read: 10 SUBCHAPTER D 11 [EXCHANGE OF OFFENDERS UNDER TREATY] 12 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS 13 Section 2. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read: 14 § 9172. Coordination with Department of Homeland Security. 15 (a) Voluntary notification of release. -- When the Department 16 of Homeland Security issues a Form I-247N (Request for Voluntary 17 Notification of Release of Suspected Priority Alien) in which it requests that a State or local law enforcement agency notify the 18

- 1 Department of Homeland Security of the pending release from
- 2 <u>custody of an individual, the State or local law enforcement</u>
- 3 agency shall notify the Department of Homeland Security not less
- 4 than 48 hours prior to the individual's release.
- 5 (b) Request for voluntary action. -- Upon the Department of
- 6 Homeland Security issuing a Form I-247D (Immigration Detainer -
- 7 Request for Voluntary Action) to a State or local law
- 8 enforcement agency requesting the agency maintain custody of an
- 9 <u>individual for a period not to exceed 48 hours beyond the time</u>
- 10 that the individual would have otherwise been released from
- 11 <u>custody</u>, the State or local law enforcement agency shall
- 12 <u>maintain custody of the individual for a period of not more than</u>
- 13 48 hours in order to permit the Department of Homeland Security
- 14 to assume custody of the individual, regardless of whether the
- 15 individual is eligible for bail.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
