## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for Veterans Alternative Punishment Program; and making an appropriation.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

5	<u>§ 4001. Scope of chapter.</u>
6	This chapter authorizes the Veterans Alternative Punishment
7	Program.
8	<u>§ 4002. Declaration of policy.</u>
9	(Reserved).
10	<u>§ 4003. Definitions.</u>
11	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
12	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
15	"Eligible inmate." A veteran sentenced to a term of
16	confinement under the jurisdiction of the Department of
17	Corrections who is considered eligible under the regulations
18	promulgated by the department.
19	"Program." The Veterans Alternative Punishment Program which
20	shall be referred to as the Pennsylvania Conservation Battalion.
21	"Program leader." A veteran who was commissioned during the
22	veteran's service.
23	"Program staff." A veteran who was not a commissioned
24	officer during the veteran's service.
25	"Veteran." A Pennsylvania resident who has served in the
26	United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or
27	National Guard and was discharged or released from the service
28	under conditions other than dishonorable.
29	<u>§ 4004. Veterans Alternative Punishment Program.</u>
30	(a) EstablishmentThere is established in the department
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1	the Veterans Alternative Punishment Program which shall be
2	referred to as the Pennsylvania Conservation Battalion.
3	(b) Scope of programThe program shall be phased in in
4	accordance with section 4007 (relating to phase-in of program)
5	to include 1,500 eligible inmates selected in accordance with
6	section 4006 (relating to selection of participants). The 1,500
7	eligible inmates shall be in three groups of 500 with each group
8	<u>of 500 led by a program leader.</u>
9	(c) Voluntary programThe program shall be voluntary for
10	eligible inmates and no punishment or benefits may be offered in
11	exchange for an eligible inmate's participation or
12	nonparticipation. An inmate may apply for the program or the
13	program may be offered to an eligible inmate.
14	(d) ConditionsApplicants may not participate in the
15	program unless they agree to be bound by all the terms and
16	conditions and sign a memorandum of understanding.
17	(e) Qualifications to participateSatisfaction of the
18	qualifications set forth in this section and in the regulations
19	established by the department to participate does not mean that
20	an inmate will automatically be permitted to participate in the
21	program.
22	(f) ActivitiesThe eligible inmates who participate in the
23	program will reside outside of the State correctional facility
24	and participate in activities including building, constructing,
25	maintaining or repairing conservation facilities and trails.
26	(g) Expulsion from program
27	(1) An inmate's participation in the program may be
28	suspended or revoked for administrative or disciplinary
29	reasons.
30	(2) The department shall develop regulations consistent

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1 with this subsection.

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2	§ 4005. Leaders and staff of program.
3	Each group of 500 shall be organized into four companies of
4	125 eligible inmates who are admitted into the program and shall
5	be led by a program leader and staff, who will be hired by the
6	department from qualified applicants. Each leader and all staff
7	members shall be required to do the following:
8	(1) Attend a training program designed by the
9	department. The training program shall be at minimum a four-
10	week intensive program.
11	(2) Conduct the program within the guidelines and
12	regulations established by the department and commission.
13	<u>§ 4006. Selection of participants.</u>
14	(a) Primary candidatesThe primary eligible inmates for
15	the program shall be veteran inmates serving an individual or
16	aggregate minimum sentence of confinement in a State
17	<u>correctional facility.</u>
18	(b) AssessmentPrior to being selected for the program, an
19	inmate must undergo an assessment performed by the department.
20	(c) IneligibilityIn addition to any other conditions
21	imposed as part of the selection process, inmates may not:
22	(1) Be subject to the deadly weapon-used enhancement
23	under the sentencing guidelines.
24	(2) Have been convicted or adjudicated delinguent of a
25	crime requiring registration under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch.97
26	Subchapter H (relating to registration of sex offenders).
27	(3) Have a conviction within the past 10 years of any:
28	(i) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to murder).
29	(ii) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2503 (relating to voluntary
30	<pre>manslaughter).</pre>

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1	(iii) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2506 (relating to drug delivery
2	resulting in death).
3	(iv) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2901(a) (relating to kidnapping).
4	(v) 18 Pa.C.S. § 3301(a)(1)(i) (relating to arson
5	and related offenses).
6	<u>§ 4007. Phase-in of program.</u>
7	(a) First yearBy June 30, 2017, the department and
8	commission shall:
9	(1) Set guidelines and regulations on the program
10	established in this chapter.
11	(2) Create a training program for program leaders and
12	select at least one program leader who has been hired and has
13	completed all requirements set by the department and
14	commission.
15	(3) Create a training program for all staff members who
16	will be working on the program and have trained the first
17	group of staff members.
18	(4) Select a group of 500 eligible inmates who will
19	participate in the program in lieu of completing prison
20	sentences in a State correctional facility.
21	(5) Implement the program with the first group of 500
22	eligible inmates.
23	(b) Second yearBy June 30, 2018, the department shall:
24	(1) Have at least two program leaders on staff who are
25	fully trained and have completed all requirements set by the
26	department and commission.
27	(2) Have sufficient trained staff members to implement
28	the second group of the program.
29	(3) Select a second group of 500 eligible inmates to
30	participate in the program.

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1	(4) Implement the program for the second group of 500
2	eligible inmates.
3	(c) Third yearBy June 30, 2019, the department shall:
4	(1) Have three program leaders on staff who are fully
5	trained and have completed all requirements set by the
6	department and commission.
7	(2) Select a third group of 500 eligible inmates to
8	participate in the program.
9	(3) Implement the program for the third group of 500
10	inmates.
11	<u>§ 4008. Completion of program.</u>
12	<u>Upon certification by the department of the inmate's</u>
13	successful completion of the program, the Pennsylvania Board of
14	Probation and Parole shall immediately release the inmate on
15	parole, notwithstanding any minimum sentence imposed in the
16	case. The parolee will be subject to intensive supervision for a
17	period of time determined by the board, after which the parolee
18	will be subject to the usual parole supervision. For all other
19	purposes, the parole of the inmate shall be as provided by
20	<u>Chapter 61 (relating to Pennsylvania Board of Probation and</u>
21	<u>Parole).</u>
22	<u>§ 4009. Appeals.</u>
23	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to enlarge or
24	limit the right of an inmate to appeal the inmate's sentence.
25	<u>§ 4010. Evaluation.</u>
26	The department and the commission shall monitor and evaluate
27	the program to ensure that the programmatic objectives are met.
28	<u>§ 4011. Appropriation.</u>
29	Each year, the sum of \$6,000,000 shall be transferred to the
30	department from the General Fund for the purposes of carrying

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- 1 out this chapter. In the first year, an additional sum of
- 2 \$4,000,000 shall be transferred to the department from the
- 3 General Fund for equipment, supplies and housing for the
- 4 purposes of carrying out this chapter.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
