AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, further providing for Alcohol, Chemical and Tobacco Abuse Program.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 1547 of the act of March 10, 1949
- 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 12 amended December 19, 1990 (P.L.1362, No.211), is amended to
- 13 read:
- 14 Section 1547. Alcohol, Chemical [and], Tobacco, Prescription
- 15 <u>Drug and Controlled Substance Misuse and</u> Abuse Program. -- (a)
- 16 Beginning with school year 1991-1992 and each year thereafter,
- 17 each public school and charter school student shall receive
- 18 mandatory instruction in alcohol, chemical and tobacco abuse in
- 19 every year in every grade from kindergarten through grade
- 20 twelve. Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, the

- 1 <u>instruction mandated under this subsection shall include</u>
- 2 instruction in the misuse and abuse of prescription drugs and
- 3 controlled substances listed on the schedules of controlled
- 4 <u>substances under section 4 of the act of April 14, 1972</u>
- 5 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled Substance, Drug,
- 6 Device and Cosmetic Act," which have a potential for misuse or
- 7 <u>abuse.</u> The instruction shall be integrated within the health
- 8 course of study required in accordance with the State Board of
- 9 Education regulations. In grades where health is offered,
- 10 instruction may also be integrated into other appropriate
- 11 courses of study. In grades where health is not offered,
- 12 instruction shall be integrated into an appropriate curriculum
- 13 requirement as listed in 22 Pa. Code § 5.4(b).
- 14 (1) This instruction:
- 15 (i) Shall be age appropriate.
- 16 (ii) Shall be sequential in method of study.
- 17 (iii) Shall discourage the use of alcohol, tobacco [and
- 18 controlled substances.], prescription drugs and controlled
- 19 <u>substances listed on the schedules of controlled substances</u>
- 20 under section 4 of "The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and
- 21 Cosmetic Act," which have a potential for misuse or abuse.
- 22 (iv) Shall communicate that the use and possession of
- 23 illicit drugs and the improper use of legally obtained drugs [is
- 24 wrong.], including prescription drugs, is a violation of law
- 25 subject to criminal prosecution and may result in addiction.
- 26 (v) Shall include instruction in prescription drug misuse
- 27 and abuse, including information on the connection between
- 28 prescription drug misuse and abuse and addiction to illicit
- 29 drugs, such as heroin.
- 30 (vi) Shall include prevention strategies designed to prevent

- 1 <u>early experimentation and use of controlled substances and</u>
- 2 prescription drugs.
- 3 (2) School districts may utilize any appropriate public or
- 4 private materials, personnel and other resources in developing
- 5 and implementing this program of instruction. The Department of
- 6 [Health, Office of] Drug and Alcohol Programs[,] shall make
- 7 available information about appropriate curriculum materials
- 8 upon request of a school district or charter school. In
- 9 developing its alcohol, chemical [and], tobacco, controlled
- 10 <u>substance and prescription drug misuse and</u> abuse instructional
- 11 program, each school district and charter school shall consult
- 12 with the single county authority designated by the Department of
- 13 [Health] <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs</u> to provide drug and alcohol
- 14 services in the school district's area.
- 15 (b) Each school district and charter school is hereby
- 16 authorized to develop and offer programs relating to alcohol,
- 17 chemical [and], tobacco, controlled substance and prescription
- 18 <u>drug misuse and</u> abuse for parents of students enrolled in [the
- 19 public schools] a public school or a charter school. If a school
- 20 district does develop such programs, they shall be developed in
- 21 consultation with the single county authority designated by the
- 22 Department of [Health] <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs</u> to provide drug
- 23 and alcohol services in the school district's area. Such
- 24 programs shall be offered at no cost to parents.
- 25 (c) The Secretary of Education, in consultation with the
- 26 Secretary of [Health] <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs</u>, shall develop
- 27 curriculum guidelines for instruction on alcohol, chemical
- 28 [and], tobacco, controlled substance and prescription drug
- 29 misuse and abuse and the laws governing their use and misuse.
- 30 These guidelines shall encourage the inclusion of the following

- 1 elements where appropriate in the instruction:
- 2 (1) Detailed factual information regarding the
- 3 physiological, psychological, sociological and legal aspects of
- 4 substance abuse.
- 5 (2) Detailed information regarding the availability of help
- 6 and assistance for students and their families with alcohol,
- 7 chemical and tobacco dependency problems.
- 8 (3) The goals of quality education as set forth in 22 Pa.
- 9 Code § 5.13(f).
- 10 (4) Skills needed to evaluate advertisements for and media
- 11 portrayals of alcohol, chemical and tobacco products and the
- 12 <u>advertisement and marketing of prescription drugs</u>.
- 13 (5) Detailed instruction on the need for and the role of
- 14 lawful authority and law-abiding behavior, including interaction
- 15 with members of the legal and justice community.
- 16 (6) Detailed instruction on the misuse and abuse of
- 17 prescription drugs, including opioid analgesics and other
- 18 controlled substances approved for medical use that have the
- 19 potential for misuse or abuse.
- 20 (7) Detailed factual information on the availability and use
- 21 of opioid antagonists and opioid abuse prevention and treatment.
- 22 (d) (1) Beginning with the 1991-1992 school year and each
- 23 year thereafter, the Secretary of Education, in consultation
- 24 with the Secretary of [Health] Drug and Alcohol Programs, shall
- 25 make available[,] to all school districts, including charter
- 26 schools in such school districts, and intermediate units, in-
- 27 service training programs based upon the instruction
- 28 requirements established in subsection (a) and the curriculum
- 29 guidelines established in subsection (c). The programs shall
- 30 provide preparation for the teaching of mandated instruction in

- 1 alcohol, chemical and tobacco abuse. The in-service programs may
- 2 utilize the single county authorities designated by the
- 3 Department of [Health] <u>Drug and Alcohol Programs</u> or such other
- 4 institutions, agencies or persons as the Secretary of Education,
- 5 in consultation with the Secretary of Drug and Alcohol Programs,
- 6 deems appropriate.
- 7 (2) Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year and each school
- 8 year thereafter, the in-service training programs made available
- 9 to school districts, including charter schools in such school
- 10 districts, and intermediate units in accordance with paragraph
- 11 (1) shall include information necessary to prepare for the
- 12 <u>teaching of mandated instruction in illicit drugs, risks of</u>
- 13 <u>addiction and the misuse and abuse of prescription drugs</u>,
- 14 including opioid analgesics and other controlled substances
- 15 approved for medical use that have a potential for misuse or
- 16 abuse.
- 17 (e) <u>(1)</u> Beginning with the 1991-1992 school year, each
- 18 school district shall provide, as part of its in-service
- 19 training, programs on alcohol, drugs, tobacco and dangerous
- 20 controlled substances for all instructors whose teaching
- 21 responsibilities include courses of study in which mandated
- 22 instruction concerning alcohol, chemical and tobacco abuse is
- 23 integrated. To comply with this requirement, a school district
- 24 may utilize the programs made available by the Department of
- 25 Education or use other alternative programs.
- 26 (2) Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, the in-service
- 27 training programs provided by each school district pursuant to
- 28 paragraph (1) shall incorporate instruction on prescription
- 29 drugs, including opioid analgesics and other controlled
- 30 substances approved for medical use that have a potential for

- 1 <u>misuse and abuse. The Department of Education, in consultation</u>
- 2 with the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, shall develop
- 3 the curriculum guidelines based on the instruction requirements
- 4 <u>established in subsection (a)(1)(iii) and (v) and the curriculum</u>
- 5 <u>guidelines established in subsection (c)(4), (6) and (7). A</u>
- 6 school district may utilize programs made available by the
- 7 Department of Education, the Department of Drug and Alcohol
- 8 Programs, the Federal Government or any other alternative
- 9 program as approved by the Secretary of Education, in
- 10 consultation with the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs.
- 11 (f) The governing board of each intermediate unit in which a
- 12 nonpublic school is located shall have the authority and the
- 13 duty to loan to all students attending nonpublic schools within
- 14 the intermediate unit all educational materials developed by
- 15 either the Department of Education or the Department of [Health]
- 16 Drug and Alcohol Programs, pursuant to this act for the
- 17 instruction of public school students and charter school
- 18 <u>students</u> on the nature and effects of drugs, alcohol, tobacco
- 19 [and dangerous], prescription drugs and controlled substances[.]
- 20 listed on the schedules of controlled substances under section 4
- 21 of "The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act,"
- 22 which have a potential for misuse or abuse. Local school boards
- 23 need not expend funds which are not provided by either the
- 24 Federal or State Government for drug education programs for the
- 25 use or loan of these materials. A nonpublic school may utilize
- 26 the in-service training programs made available by the
- 27 Department of Education through the intermediate unit.
- 28 (g) On or before June 1, [1991] <u>2017</u>, the Secretary of
- 29 Education shall recommend to the General Assembly a plan to
- 30 require and assist each school district to establish and

- 1 maintain a program to provide appropriate counseling and support
- 2 services to students who experience problems related to the use
- 3 of drugs, alcohol [and dangerous], prescription drugs and
- 4 controlled substances[.] <u>listed on the schedules of controlled</u>
- 5 <u>substances under section 4 of "The Controlled Substance, Drug,</u>
- 6 Device and Cosmetic Act," which have a potential for misuse or
- 7 <u>abuse</u>.
- 8 (h) On or before June 1, [1992] <u>2018</u>, the Secretary of
- 9 Education shall report to the General Assembly concerning the
- 10 [1991-1992] <u>2017-2018</u> school year activities of the Department
- 11 of Education pertaining to the provisions of this section and
- 12 concerning proposed [1992-1993] 2018-2019 school year activities
- 13 of the Department of Education pertaining to this section.
- 14 (i) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and
- 15 regulations necessary for the implementation of this section.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
