A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing February 2015 as "National Children's Dental Health Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Each February, the American Dental Association (ADA)
4	sponsors "National Children's Dental Health Month" to raise
5	awareness about the importance of children's oral and dental
6	health; and
7	WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
8	Prevention (CDC), tooth decay, although preventable, is one of
9	the most chronic diseases among children; and
10	WHEREAS, Data from the CDC's 2009-2010 National Health and
11	Nutrition Examination Survey revealed that 14% of children three
12	to five years of age had untreated dental cavities or tooth
13	decay, known as dental caries; and
14	WHEREAS, The survey also revealed that 17% of children six to
15	nine years of age had untreated dental caries and 11% of

1 adolescents 13 to 15 years of age had untreated dental caries; 2 and

3 WHEREAS, The CDC further found that children three to nine 4 years of age living at or below 100% of the Federal poverty 5 level had a significantly higher incidence of untreated dental 6 caries compared to children living above the poverty level; and 7 WHEREAS, The CDC estimates that 80% of children in the United 8 States have experienced tooth decay; and

9 WHEREAS, In January, the Action for Dental Health Act of 2015 10 (H.R.539) was introduced in the United States House of Representatives to authorize the CDC to award oral health grants 11 to support volunteer dental projects and collaborative 12 13 initiatives to, among other things, improve oral health 14 education and dental disease prevention and improve essential oral health care for lower income individuals; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Good health, both physical and mental, is enhanced through sound oral and dental health habits, which are learned 17

WHEREAS, Tooth decay frequently results in pain, weight loss and poor speech and appearance, all of which greatly reduces a child's ability to learn and succeed academically and socially;

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23 WHEREAS, The continued progress and economic prosperity of 24 this Commonwealth is, in large part, dependent upon the total 25 good health of its children; and

26 WHEREAS, It is in the public interest of this Commonwealth to 27 educate, assess, promote and improve good oral and dental health 28 among all children; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize
February 2015 as "National Children's Dental Health Month" to

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1 increase public awareness of the importance of good oral and 2 dental health of all children; and be it further RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives strongly support 3 the efforts of all institutions, agencies and entities, both 4 public and private, entrusted with the health of the residents 5 of this Commonwealth in observing February 2015 with appropriate 6 educational activities and programs designed to recognize 7 "National Children's Dental Health Month" and the ADA's 2015 8 theme, "Defeat Monster Mouth." 9
