## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of February 15 through 21, 2015, as "Court Reporting and Captioning Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, For millennia, individuals have wanted the spoken
- 4 word translated into text to record history and, to accomplish
- 5 this task, have relied on scribes; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The profession of scribe was born with the rise of
- 7 civilization; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In Ancient Egypt, scribes were considered to be the
- 9 literate elite, recording laws and other important documents
- 10 and, since that time, have served as impartial witnesses to
- 11 history; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Scribes were present with our nation's founding
- 13 fathers as the Declaration of Independence and Bill of Rights
- 14 were drafted; and
- 15 WHEREAS, President Lincoln entrusted scribes to record the

- 1 Emancipation Proclamation; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Since the advent of shorthand machines, these
- 3 scribes have been known as court reporters and have played a
- 4 permanent and invaluable role in courtrooms across our country;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Court reporters work in the General Assembly
- 7 preserving members' words and actions; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Court reporters and captioners are responsible for
- 9 the closed-captioning seen scrolling across television screens,
- 10 at sporting stadiums and in other community and education
- 11 settings, bring information to millions of deaf and hearing-
- 12 impaired Americans every day; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Court reporters and captioners translate the spoken
- 14 word into text and preserve our history; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Whether called the scribes of yesterday or the court
- 16 reporters and captioners of today, the individuals who preserve
- 17 our nation's history are truly the guardians of the record;
- 18 therefore be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 20 week of February 15 through 21, 2015, as "Court Reporting and
- 21 Captioning Week" in Pennsylvania and call on the people of this
- 22 Commonwealth to observe the week with appropriate programs,
- 23 ceremonies and educational activities.
