A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the week of May 10 through 16, 2015, as "National  
2 Nursing Home Week" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, The men and women now residing in Pennsylvania's  
4 more than 700 nursing homes fought our wars, labored in our  
5 factories and planted the seeds that built our strong  
6 communities; and

7 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania nursing homes, on average, are more  
8 than 91% occupied; and

9 WHEREAS, More than 81,000 nursing home residents are a living  
10 testament to our history and a special treasure to our  
11 Commonwealth; and

12 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth residing in  
13 nursing homes have contributed immeasurably to the heritage,

1 success and growth of our communities; and

2 WHEREAS, Nursing homes across this Commonwealth are holding  
3 events in observance of "Nursing Home Week" guided by this  
4 year's national theme of "Bring on the Fiesta!"; and

5 WHEREAS, "Nursing Home Week" begins on Mother's Day, May 10,  
6 and ends on May 16, 2015; therefore be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the  
8 week of May 10 through 16, 2015, as "National Nursing Home Week"  
9 in Pennsylvania; and be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge citizens of  
11 this Commonwealth to honor the elderly and disabled residents of
