11	(f) PedalcyclesNo part of this section shall be construed
12	to restrict the operation of a pedalcycle used by a police
13	officer or a bike medic during the course of performing official
14	duties.

16	(i) DefinitionAs used in this section, the term "bike
17	medic" means an individual who:

1	(1) operates a pedalcycle that is equipped to provide	<
2	medical, rescue or disaster services in response to a medical	=
3	emergency or traumatic injury or in search and rescue	
4	operations conducted by the individual; AND IS CERTIFIED BY	<
5	THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AS AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

7	(2) is a member of an emergency medical service provider	_<
8	recognized SERVICES AGENCY LICENSED by the Department of	<

10	EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER, AS APPLICABLE;	
11	(3) has attained the minimum certification of first	<
12	responder or emergency medical technician;

15	a nationally recognized organization or certifying body;
