## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further defining "emergency vehicle."
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. The definition of "emergency vehicle" in section
7	102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes,
8	amended October 14, 2014 (P.L.2491, No.140), is amended to read:
9	§ 102. Definitions.
10	Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
11	provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
12	provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
13	used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
14	indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

16	"Emergency vehicle." A State or county emergency management
17	vehicle, fire department vehicle, police vehicle, sheriff
18	vehicle, ambulance, advanced life support squad vehicle, basic

life support squad vehicle, emergency canteen support service 1 2 organization vehicle, blood delivery vehicle, human organ 3 delivery vehicle, hazardous material response vehicle, armed forces emergency vehicle, one vehicle operated by a coroner or 4 chief county medical examiner and one vehicle operated by a 5 6 chief deputy coroner or deputy chief county medical examiner 7 used for answering emergency calls, a vehicle owned by or leased 8 to a regional emergency medical services council that is used as 9 authorized by the Department of Health to respond to an actual 10 or potential disaster, mass casualty situation or substantial 11 threat to public health, a vehicle owned by a county or regional 12 police association and operated by a police officer that is used 13 for police transport or victim extraction, any vehicle operated 14 by a special agent, special agent supervisor, narcotics agent or 15 narcotics agent supervisor while performing official duties as 16 employees of the Office of Attorney General, any vehicle owned and operated by the Philadelphia Parking Authority established 17 18 in accordance with 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 55 (relating to parking 19 authorities) and used in the enforcement of 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 57 20 (relating to taxicabs and limousines in first class cities), any 21 vehicle owned and operated by the Salvation Army and used for <u>emergency disaster services</u> or any other vehicle designated by 22 23 the State Police under section 6106 (relating to designation of 24 emergency vehicles by Pennsylvania State Police), or a privately 25 owned vehicle used in answering an emergency call when used by 26 any of the following:

(1) A police chief and assistant chief.

(2) A fire chief, assistant chief and, when a fire
company has three or more fire vehicles, a second or third
assistant chief.

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- 1 (3) A fire police captain and fire police lieutenant. (4) An ambulance corps commander and assistant 2 3 commander. 4 (5) A river rescue commander and assistant commander. A county emergency management coordinator. 5 (6) (7) A fire marshal. 6 (8) A rescue service chief and assistant chief. 7 (9) The chief or operations director of a county 8 9 hazardous materials response team. 10 \* \* \*
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
