AN ACT

- Establishing the Pennsylvania Grade Crude Development Advisory 1
- Council; and providing for duties of the Pennsylvania Grade 2
- Crude Development Advisory Council and the Department of 3
- Environmental Protection and for administrative support.
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania 8
- Grade Crude Development Advisory Council Act.
- Section 2. Definitions. 10
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- have the meanings given to them in the section unless the 12
- context clearly indicates otherwise: 13
- 14 "Council." The Pennsylvania Grade Crude Development Advisory
- 15 Council.
- "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of 16
- 17 the Commonwealth.
- 18 Section 3. Pennsylvania Grade Crude Development Advisory

- 1 Council.
- 2 (a) Establishment.--There is established the Pennsylvania
- 3 Grade Crude Development Advisory Council.
- 4 (b) Composition. -- The council shall consist of the following
- 5 members:
- 6 (1) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development
- 7 or the secretary's designee.
- 8 (2) The Secretary of Environmental Protection or the
- 9 secretary's designee.
- 10 (3) One member of the Senate appointed by the President
- 11 pro tempore of the Senate.
- 12 (4) One member of the Senate appointed by the Minority
- 13 Leader of the Senate.
- 14 (5) One member of the House of Representatives appointed
- by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 16 (6) One member of the House of Representatives appointed
- by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 18 (7) The following members appointed by the Governor:
- 19 (i) Two representatives of the Pennsylvania
- 20 Independent Petroleum Producers.
- 21 (ii) Two representatives of the Pennsylvania
- 22 Independent Oil and Gas Association.
- 23 (iii) Two representatives of the Pennsylvania Grade
- 24 Crude Oil Coalition.
- 25 (iv) Two representatives of refineries of
- Pennsylvania grade crude oil.
- (v) One representative of a nonprofit corporation,
- which has the purpose of promoting the history and
- 29 economic benefits of the conventional oil and gas
- industry in this Commonwealth.

- 1 (vi) One representative of academia who is a
- 2 geologist with an expertise in petroleum geology.
- 3 (vii) One representative of academia who is a
- 4 hydrologist.
- 5 (c) Chairperson. -- The council shall elect a chairperson from
- 6 among its members.
- 7 (d) Meetings. -- The council shall meet upon the call of the
- 8 chairperson, but not less than semiannually. A simple majority
- 9 of the members shall constitute a quorum.
- 10 (e) Terms.--
- 11 (1) Except as set forth in paragraph (2), the
- 12 legislative members of the council shall serve two-year terms
- commencing with the first Tuesday in January of odd-numbered
- 14 years and may be reappointed upon reelection to office.
- 15 (2) Of the initial members appointed by the President
- pro tempore of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate,
- 17 the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Minority
- 18 Leader of the House of Representatives, members shall serve
- 19 until the first Tuesday in January of the first odd-numbered
- year after the end of the year during which this section
- 21 takes effect.
- 22 (3) Of the initial members appointed by the Governor:
- 23 (i) Four members shall serve initial terms of one
- 24 year.
- 25 (ii) Four members shall serve initial terms of two
- years.
- 27 (iii) Three members shall serve initial terms of
- three years.
- 29 (4) After the initial terms, individuals appointed by
- 30 the Governor shall serve for a term of three years.

- 1 (5) Individuals appointed by the Governor may be
- 2 appointed to successive terms.
- 3 (f) Vacancies.--Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder
- 4 of an unexpired term in the same manner as original
- 5 appointments. A member, upon expiration of the term, shall
- 6 continue to hold office until a successor is appointed.
- 7 (g) Quorum. -- A majority of the membership of the council
- 8 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 9 Action may be taken on a matter before the council by a majority
- 10 vote of the full membership of the council.
- 11 (h) Compensation. -- Council members may not receive
- 12 compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for all
- 13 necessary travel and other reasonable expenses incurred in
- 14 connection with the performance of their duties as members.
- 15 Section 4. Duties of council.
- 16 (a) Duties. -- The council shall:
- 17 (1) Examine and make recommendations regarding existing
- technical regulations promulgated under 58 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 19 to oil and gas) and policies implemented by the department
- that impact the conventional oil and gas industry of this
- 21 Commonwealth.
- 22 (2) Explore the development of a regulatory scheme that
- 23 provides for environmental oversight and enforcement
- specifically applicable to the conventional oil and gas
- 25 industry.
- 26 (3) Promote the long-term viability of the conventional
- oil and gas industry.
- 28 (4) Assist the Secretary of Environmental Protection
- 29 with and provide written comments on new departmental policy
- 30 that will impact the conventional oil and gas industry of

- this Commonwealth, including economic consequences.
- 2 (5) Review and comment on the formulation and drafting 3 of all technical regulations proposed under 58 Pa.C.S.
- 4 (6) Provide institutional support for the conventional 5 oil and gas industry of this Commonwealth by ensuring 6 effective cooperation and communication among governmental 7 agencies and the academic and research community.
 - (7) Recommend appropriate measures relating to the promotion and development of the conventional oil and gas industry of this Commonwealth.
- 11 (8) Develop a plan to increase Pennsylvania grade crude 12 oil production in an environmentally responsible way to more 13 adequately supply the refineries which depend on Pennsylvania 14 grade crude oil.
- 15 (9) Develop a joint working group with the department to
 16 explore and develop an environmentally responsible and
 17 economically viable production water management option.
- 18 (10) Perform other duties as necessary or appropriate to 19 effect the intent and purposes of this act.
- 20 (b) Report.--The council shall annually issue a report of 21 its activities and recommendations under subsection (a) to all 22 of the following:
- 23 (1) The Governor.
- 24 (2) The President pro tempore of the Senate.
- 25 (3) The Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 26 (4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the 27 Environmental Resources and Energy Committee of the Senate.
- 28 (5) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 29 (6) The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 30 (7) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the

- 3 (8) THE SECRETARY OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

- 4 Section 5. Duties of department.
- 5 The department shall have the following duties:
- 6 (1) To consult with the council on all policies and
- 7 technical regulations promulgated under 58 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 8 to oil and gas).
- 9 (2) To include any written comments of the council
- 10 received before the department's submission of a proposed
- 11 rulemaking package of technical regulations under 58 Pa.C.S.
- 12 to the Environmental Quality Board, as part of its submission
- to the Environmental Quality Board.
- 14 (3) To provide technical assistance required by the
- 15 council to carry out its duties under this act.
- 16 Section 6. Administrative support.
- 17 The Department of Community and Economic Development shall
- 18 provide administrative support, office space and any other
- 19 technical assistance required by the council to carry out its
- 20 duties under this act.
- 21 Section 7. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect immediately.
