AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Establishing the State Apprenticeship and Training Commission; transferring functions of the State Apprenticeship and Training Council; providing for an Executive Director of Apprenticeship and Training and for subjects of transfer; and making repeals.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Short title.
9	This act shall be known and may be cited as the State
10	Apprenticeship and Training Commission Act.
11	Section 2. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
13	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Advisory council." The State Apprenticeship Advisory
16	Council.
17	"Commission." The State Apprenticeship and Training
18	Commission.
19	"Executive director." The Executive Director of

Apprenticeship and Training and the Administrator of the State
 Apprenticeship and Training Commission.

"Subjects of transfer." Powers, duties, personnel,
appropriations, allocations, documents, files, records,
contracts, agreements, equipment, materials, orders and rights
and obligations utilized or accruing in connection with
functions transferred from one entity to another under this act.
Section 3. State Apprenticeship and Training Commission.

9 (a) Establishment.--The State Apprenticeship and Training 10 Commission is established and shall be fully implemented and 11 operational one year from the effective date of this section.

12 (b) Transferred powers and duties.--The following functions 13 of the State Apprenticeship and Training Council are transferred 14 to the commission:

15 (1) Overseeing apprenticeship and training programs in16 this Commonwealth.

17 (2) Establishing standards for apprenticeship in
18 conformity with the provisions of this act and applicable
19 statutes and regulations of the Federal Government, including
20 a description of the standards, criteria and requirements for
21 apprenticeship program registration or approval.

22 Where deemed appropriate, according reciprocal (3) 23 approval for Federal purposes to apprentices, apprenticeship 24 programs and standards that are registered in other states by 25 the Federal Office of Apprenticeship or a federally approved 26 state registration agency if reciprocity is requested by the 27 apprenticeship program sponsor, provided that the state's 28 registration agency grants reciprocity to Pennsylvania 29 programs.

30 (4) Providing for the cancellation or deregistration of 20150SB0280PN0158 - 2 - programs and for temporary suspension, cancellation or
 deregistration of apprenticeship agreements.

(5) Establishing policies, procedures and plans that
demonstrate how this Commonwealth's economic development
strategies and public work force investment system integrate
registered apprenticeship as a critical work-based learning,
postsecondary education, training and employment option
available through the One-Stop Career Center System.

9 (6) Establishing a plan for equal employment opportunity 10 in apprenticeship, incorporating policies and procedures to 11 promote equality of opportunity in apprenticeship programs.

12 (7) Establishing apprentice-to-journeyperson ratios that 13 are uniform and indiscriminate between joint and nonjoint 14 programs. In no instance shall the ratio be stricter than two 15 apprentices to one journeyperson.

16 (8) Acting as and allocating sufficient staff and budget
17 to carry out the functions of a registration agency,
18 including outreach and education, registration of programs
19 and apprentices, provision of technical assistance and
20 monitoring.

(9) Establishing a unique civil service classification
encompassing all the powers and duties enumerated in this
section for the purpose of staffing the commission's
professional level positions.

(10) Serving as a single point of contact for the United
States Department of Labor with respect to the National
Apprenticeship System.

(11) Maintaining close liaison and serving as the single
 point of contact for apprenticeship and training for all
 agencies that carry on work force development programs, work-

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based learning and other activities closely related to the
 purpose of this act.

3 (12) Conducting studies, surveys and investigations of
4 the special problems or the training of unemployed or
5 employed persons in order to improve or modernize work skills
6 and making recommendations to the cooperating entities
7 represented on the advisory council, local community
8 organizations and local school boards, among others.

9 Acting as a convening agency in local communities (13)10 to bring together local representatives of employers, employees, educational agencies and industrial development 11 12 entities in order to promote closer local cooperation in 13 establishing better apprenticeship, work-based learning and 14 other occupational training programs, including programs for 15 employed persons who wish to improve and modernize their work skills. 16

17 (14) Using all appropriate mediums of information and 18 education to acquaint employers, employees and the public at 19 large with the advantages of apprenticeship and other work-20 based learning and occupational training programs.

(15) Studying the effectiveness of apprenticeship
 agreements and making recommendations for their improvement.

23 (16) Report to the General Assembly on or before
24 February 15 of each year, indicating:

(i) the extent of apprenticeship and other
 occupational programs during the previous year;

(ii) trends in employment requiring adjustments in
 apprenticeship training, work-based learning and other
 occupational training programs;

30 (iii) the need for expansion of apprenticeship,

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work-based learning and other occupational training
 programs; and

3 (iv) activities of the commission and such
4 recommendations as are in accord with the purposes of
5 this act.

6 (17) Serving as the recognized State apprenticeship 7 registration entity and register apprenticeship programs and 8 apprentices and provide technical assistance and conduct 9 reviews for compliance and quality assurance assessments.

10 Performing such other duties as may be necessary to (18)give full effect to the provisions of this act. 11 12 Section 4. Executive Director of Apprenticeship and Training. 13 The Governor shall appoint an Executive Director of 14 Apprenticeship and Training who shall be confirmed by the Senate 15 and responsible to the General Assembly in carrying out the 16 provisions of this act. The commission shall appoint, hire and 17 otherwise make available to the executive director the clerical, 18 technical and professional services necessary to the performance 19 of the executive director's duties, including appointments to 20 the advisory council.

21 Section 5. Powers and duties of executive director.

The executive director shall carry out the purposes of this act and shall have the following powers and duties:

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(1) Oversight of the advisory council.

(2) Encouragement and promotion of the standards
established in accordance with this act and with the basic
standards of the Federal Committee on Registered
Apprenticeship.

29 (3) Settlement of differences arising out of30 apprenticeship agreements.

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(4) Supervision of the execution of apprenticeship
 agreements and maintenance of standards.
 (5) Registration of such apprenticeship agreements as
 the commission shall authorize as conforming to the
 established standards.

6 (6) Participation in and utilizing the Federal
7 Registered Apprenticeship Information System Database.

8 (7) Establishment and maintenance of Statewide database 9 for the purpose of keeping a record of the following:

(i) Apprenticeship agreements.

11 (ii) Statistics and demographics about apprentices12 and programs.

13 (iii) Issuance of interim, competence and completion14 certificates.

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(iv) Transfers.

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(v) Program sponsors.

17 (8) Execution of the actions of the commission in all of18 its powers and duties under section 3.

(9) Encouragement of liaison and cooperation among all
Federal, State and other public and private agencies
concerned with apprenticeship work-based learning and
occupational training in industries that have not
traditionally used the registered apprenticeship model as a
viable option for work force development and work force
education.

(10) Promotion of employer, employee, student, parent
 and public awareness of apprenticeship, the apprenticeship
 model, work-based learning and other occupational training.

(11) Expanding apprenticeship opportunities for workers
 in industries that have not traditionally used the registered

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1 apprenticeship model, including, but not limited to, new and 2 emerging occupations and high-technology and green 3 industries. Section 6. State Apprenticeship Advisory Council. 4 5 Composition. -- The advisory council shall be comprised (a) 6 of: (1) Four representatives of employees, two of whom shall 7 8 represent industries other than construction trade 9 industries. Collective bargaining units and open-shop 10 employees shall be equally represented. Four representatives of employers, two of whom shall 11 (2) 12 represent industries other than construction trades 13 industries. Collective bargaining units and open-shop 14 employees shall be equally represented. 15 (3) Two representatives of community colleges. 16 (4) One representative of the general public. 17 The Deputy Secretary for Workforce Development in (5) 18 the Department of Labor and Industry. 19 (6) The Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Workforce 20 Investment Board. 21 One work force development representative from each (7) 22 of the following: 23 (i) Department of Aging. 24 (ii) Department of Education. 25 Department of Community and Economic (iii) 26 Development. 27 Department of Human Services. (iv) 28 (V) Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. 29 The Pennsylvania Council of Chief Juvenile (vi) Probation Officers. 30

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1 (b) Term of membership.--

2 (1) Employer, employee and public members shall be
3 appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the
4 Senate. Members shall be citizens of the United States and
5 residents of this Commonwealth.

6 (2) Members shall serve a term of four years or until a 7 successor has been appointed and qualified, but in no event 8 longer than six months beyond the four-year period.

9 (3) In the event that a member dies or resigns or is 10 otherwise disqualified during the term of office, a successor 11 shall be appointed in the same way and with the same 12 qualifications and shall hold office for the remainder of the 13 unexpired term.

14 (4) An employer, employee or public member shall not be15 eligible to hold more than two consecutive terms.

16 (c) Appointments.--For employer, employee and public members 17 initially appointed to the board under this act, the term of 18 office shall be as follows:

19 (1)Five members shall serve for a term of four years. 20 (2) Two members shall serve for a term of three years. 21 Two members shall serve for a term of two years. (3) 22 (d) Officers.--The advisory council shall organize 23 immediately upon appointment and annually thereafter by the 24 election of one of its members as chairman, one as vice chairman 25 and one as recording secretary.

(e) Meetings.--The advisory council shall conduct meetings
quarterly unless otherwise scheduled by the executive director.
(f) Expenses.--Each member of the advisory council shall
receive actual traveling expenses and per diem at the rate of
\$25 each day for time spent attending advisory council meetings.

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1 (g) Status.--The advisory council shall be ineligible for 2 recognition as the State's registration entity and shall provide 3 recommended advice and guidance to the commission on the 4 operation of the State's apprenticeship system. The advisory 5 council operates at the direction and discretion of the 6 commission.

7 Section 7. Limitation.

8 This act shall apply only to persons, partnerships, 9 associations, corporations, political subdivisions, employer 10 associations or organizations or associations of employees that 11 voluntarily elect to conform with the provisions of this act. 12 Section 8. Subjects of transfer.

13 (a) General rule.--The subjects of transfer from the council 14 are transferred to the commission with the same force and effect 15 as if those subjects of transfer had originally belonged or had 16 been incurred or entered into by the commission.

17 (b) Employees.--The transfer made under this act shall not 18 affect the civil service status of affected employees of the 19 council with the exception that employees without civil service 20 status shall, if qualified, be granted civil service status in 21 their classifications.

22 Section 9. Repeals.

(a) Intent.--The General Assembly declares that the repeal
under subsection (b) is necessary to effectuate the purposes of
this act.

(b) Absolute.--The act of July 14, 1961 (P.L.604, No.304),
known as The Apprenticeship and Training Act, is repealed.

(c) General.--All acts or parts of acts are repealed insofaras they are inconsistent with this act.

30 Section 10. Effective date.

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1 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
