AS REPORTED FROM COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES AND ENERGY, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AS AMENDED, JUNE 29, 2015

AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," in organization of 20 21 departmental administrative boards and commissions and of 22 advisory boards and commissions, further providing for the 23 Environmental Quality Board. 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 26 Section 1. Section 471 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,

No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, amended

- 1 November 1, 1979 (P.L.251, No.83), is amended to read:
- 2 Section 471. Environmental Quality Board. -- (a) The
- 3 Environmental Quality Board shall consist of the Secretary of
- 4 Environmental [Resources] <u>Protection</u>, who shall be chairman
- 5 thereof, the Secretary of Health, the Secretary of [Commerce]
- 6 Community and Economic Development, the Secretary of
- 7 Transportation, the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of
- 8 Labor and Industry, [the Secretary of Community Affairs,] the
- 9 Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission,
- 10 the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Game Commission, the
- 11 Chairman of the <u>Pennsylvania</u> Public [Utilities] <u>Utility</u>
- 12 Commission, the Executive Director of the State Planning Board,
- 13 the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum
- 14 Commission, five members of the Citizens Advisory Council, and
- 15 four members of the General Assembly. The Citizens Advisory
- 16 Council members shall be designated by, and serve at the
- 17 pleasure of, the Citizens Advisory Council. One of the General
- 18 Assembly members shall be designated by, and serve at the
- 19 pleasure of, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, one by the
- 20 Minority Leader of the Senate, one by the Speaker of the House
- 21 of Representatives and one by the Minority Leader of the House
- 22 of Representatives. In addition to the heads of the various
- 23 departments as elsewhere in this act provided, the other members
- 24 of the board may have named alternates to serve in their stead,
- 25 the alternates for the members of the board from the Citizens
- 26 Advisory Council to be selected by that council from members of
- 27 the council and each other alternate to be selected by that
- 28 particular member of the board in whose stead he is to serve. No
- 29 person will serve as alternate for more than one board member.
- 30 (b) Eight members of the board shall constitute a quorum.

- 1 (c) The Department of Environmental Protection shall appoint
- 2 <u>a counsel to the board, who shall also serve as an independent</u>
- 3 <u>counsel to members of the board ON ANY MATTER WITHIN THE</u>
- 4 JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD. The independent counsel shall be
- 5 compensated from the appropriation for the general government
- 6 operations of the Department of Environmental Protection. At the
- 7 <u>discretion of the board, the independent counsel shall assist</u>
- 8 members on all matters before the board, including, but not
- 9 <u>limited to, the review of rulemaking petitions submitted to the</u>
- 10 board, the drafting and development of amendments to proposed
- 11 and final rulemaking and advice relating to procedural matters.
- 12 All communication between the independent counsel and a board
- 13 <u>member or the board shall be considered privileged and</u> <--
- 14 <u>confidential</u>, and such privilege may be waived only by the board
- 15 SUBJECT TO THE ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE CONSISTENT WITH THE <--
- 16 RULES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT.
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
