AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 5, 2012 (P.L.1102, No.132), entitled  
2 "An act authorizing the State System of Higher Education and  
3 its employees to enter into certain economic development  
4 agreements; providing for approval and notice, for reports  
5 and for limitations; and making an inconsistent repeal,"  
6 further providing for title of act, for short title, for  
7 definitions and for repeal.

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. The title and sections 1 and 8 of the act of July  
11 5, 2012 (P.L.1102, No.132), known as the State System of Higher  
12 Education Intellectual Property Act, are amended to read:

14 Authorizing [the State System of Higher Education and its]  
15 State-owned universities and employees of State-owned  
16 universities to enter into certain economic development  
17 agreements; providing for approval and notice, for reports  
18 and for limitations; and making [an] inconsistent [repeal]  
19 repeals.

20 Section 1. Short title.

1        This act shall be known and may be cited as the [State System  
2 of Higher Education] State-owned University Intellectual  
3 Property Act.

4 Section 8. [Repeal] Repeals.

5        Repeals are as follows:

6            (1) The General Assembly declares that the [repeal]  
7 repeals under [paragraph (2) is] paragraphs (2) and (3) are  
8 necessary to effectuate this act.

9            (2) The act of July 19, 1957 (P.L.1017, No.451), known  
10 as the State Adverse Interest Act, is repealed insofar as it  
11 is inconsistent with this act.

12            (3) 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 11 (relating to ethics standards and  
13 financial disclosure) is repealed insofar as it is  
14 inconsistent with this act.

15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
