AN ACT

Amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), entitled "An act relating to the right to practice medicine and surgery and the right to practice medically related acts; reestablishing the State Board of Medical Education and Licensure as the State Board of Medicine and providing for 5 its composition, powers and duties; providing for the 6 issuance of licenses and certificates and the suspension and revocation of licenses and certificates; providing penalties; and making repeals," providing for visiting team physician. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. The act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), 13 known as the Medical Practice Act of 1985, is amended by adding 14 a section to read: Section 13.6. Visiting team physician. 15 (a) Licensure exemption. -- A physician who is licensed in 16 17 good standing to practice in another state shall be exempt from 18 the licensure requirements of this act while practicing in this Commonwealth if either of the following apply: 19

(1) The physician has a written or oral agreement with a

4	(2) The physician has been invited by a national sport
5	governing body to provide services to team members and
6	coaching staff at a national sport training center in this
7	Commonwealth or to provide services at an event or
8	competition in this Commonwealth which is sanctioned by the
9	national sport governing body so long as:
10	(i) The physician's practice is limited to that
11	required by the national sport governing body.
12	(ii) The services provided by the physician must be
13	within the area of the physician's competence.
14	(b) Limitations A physician who is exempt under subsection
15	(a) from licensure may not:
16	(1) Provide care or consultation to any person residing
17	in this Commonwealth other than a person delineated in
18	subsection (a) or as otherwise provided by State law.
19	(2) Practice at a health care clinic or health care
20	facility, including an acute care facility.
21	(c) Duration An exemption under subsection (a) shall be
22	valid for the following duration:
23	(1) An exemption under subsection (a) (1) shall remain in
24	force while the physician is traveling with the sports team
25	but shall be no longer than ten days in duration per sporting
26	event. A maximum of 20 additional days per sporting event may
27	be granted upon prior request to the board by the physician
28	but may not exceed 30 days total.
29	(2) An exemption under subsection (a)(2) shall remain in
30	force during the time certified by the national sport

- 1 governing body. The exemption may not exceed 30 days.
- 2 (d) Agreements with other states. -- The board may enter into
- 3 agreements with the medical licensing boards of other states to
- 4 implement the provisions of this section. Agreements may include
- 5 procedures for reporting potential medical license violations.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
