1 2 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions relating to operation of vehicles, further providing for obedience to authorized persons directing traffic; and providing for drivers of certified escort vehicles; in other required equipment, further providing for identification of certain vehicles; and, in size, weight and load, further providing for scope and application of chapter, AND for conditions of permits and < security for damages and for permit for movement during < course of manufacture.
11	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
12	hereby enacts as follows:
13	Section 1. Section 3102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
14	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
15	§ 3102. Obedience to authorized persons directing traffic.
16	No person shall willfully fail or refuse to comply with any
17	lawful order or direction of <u>:</u>
18	(1) any uniformed police officer, sheriff or constable
19	or, in an emergency, a railroad or street railway police
20	officer; [or]
21	(2) any appropriately attired person, including an agent
22	or employee of the funeral director during a funeral,

authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic [or an];

2 (3) any employee who has been trained in traffic control 3 by a licensed and insured private security company and who is 4 acting in the scope of employment[.]; or

5 <u>(4) any driver of a certified escort vehicle as defined</u> 6 <u>under section 3108 (relating to drivers of certified escort</u> 7 <u>vehicles) and who is acting in the capacity as a driver of a</u> 8 certified escort vehicle.

9 Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
10 <u>§ 3108</u>. Drivers of certified escort vehicles.

11 (a) General rule.--The driver of a certified escort vehicle

12 that is being operated to escort a super load must be certified

13 and licensed by the department and wear attire that complies

14 with 67 Pa. Code § 101.3(5) (relating to minimum attire).

15 (b) Criteria to be established.--Within one year of the

16 effective date of this section, the department shall establish

17 criteria for certified escort vehicles and for determining

18 certification and licensing of drivers of certified escort_

19 vehicles within this Commonwealth and shall post the criteria on_

20 the department's publicly accessible Internet website.

21 (c) Definitions.--The following words and phrases when used

22 in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this

23 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>

24 "Certified escort vehicle." A vehicle that is operated to

25 escort a super load on a highway of this Commonwealth.

26 <u>"Super load." A vehicle or combination or load having a</u>

27 gross weight exceeding 201,000 pounds, a total length exceeding

28 160 feet or a total width exceeding 16 feet. The term does not

29 <u>include any of the following:</u>

30 (1) A building under 67 Pa. Code § 179.11 (relating to

1 <u>special vehicle-load restrictions).</u>

2 (2) A vehicle or combination moved across the highway 3 under section 4965 (relating to single permits for multiple highway crossings) or 4966 (relating to permit for movement 4 of quarry equipment). 5 (3) A drag line moved across a highway under permit. 6 7 Section 3. Sections 4573 and 4901(c) of Title 75 are amended 8 to read: § 4573. Identification of certain vehicles. 9 10 (a) Commercial tow trucks. -- Any truck which is used commercially to tow other motor vehicles shall have the name of 11 the business, or person, operating [such] the truck displayed on 12 13 signs on both sides of [such] the truck. 14 (b) Certified escort vehicle. -- Any certified escort vehicle which is used to escort a super load as defined in section 3108 15 16 (relating to drivers of certified escort vehicles) shall display the department's certification emblem, may use flashing or 17 18 revolving vellow lights in accordance with sections 4572 19 (relating to visual signals on authorized vehicles) and 6107 (relating to designation of authorized vehicles by department) 20 and shall comply with other department regulations, including 21 those pertaining to pilot cars. 22 23 § 4901. Scope and application of chapter. * * * 24 25 (c) Permit authorizing prohibited movement.--If an 26 overweight or oversize movement cannot be made in any other feasible manner, the permit may authorize the movement to be 27 28 made in contravention to any provision of this title provided 29 that: 30 (1) the department or local authority determines that

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1 the movement is in the public interest; and

(2) the movement is escorted by [the Pennsylvania State
Police, extra-duty Pennsylvania State Police or department
personnel. When the movement is escorted by extra-duty
Pennsylvania State Police or department personnel,] certified
escort vehicles as defined under section 3108 (relating to
drivers of certified escort vehicles) or the Pennsylvania
State Police and the following shall apply:

9 [Approval must be obtained from the Pennsylvania (i) 10 State Police or the department for the use of their 11 respective personnel.] The department, in consultation 12 with the Pennsylvania State Police, shall determine 13 whether a Pennsylvania State Police escort is necessary. 14 (ii) [The] If it is jointly determined by the 15 Pennsylvania State Police and the department that the 16 movement must be escorted by the Pennsylvania State Police, the permittee shall bear the total costs of 17 18 escorting the movement.

20 Section 4. Section 4962(d) of Title 75 is amended and the 21 section is amended by adding a subsection to read: 22 § 4962. Conditions of permits and security for damages. 23 * * *

(d) Special escort services.--The department or local
authorities shall specify what movements require special escort
services of the Pennsylvania State Police, local police or
department personnel <u>as determined under section 4901(c)(2)</u>
<u>(relating to scope and application of chapter)</u>.

30 (f.6) One certified escort vehicle.--

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1	(1) A super load, as defined in section 3108(c)
2	(relating to drivers of certified escort vehicles), shall be
3	required to maintain one certified escort vehicle under
4	section 4573(b) (relating to identification of certain
5	vehicles) unless otherwise determined under section 4901(c)
6	that an additional certified escort vehicle or a Pennsylvania
7	<u>State Police escort is necessary.</u>
8	(2) The requirements of this subsection are in addition
9	to, not in lieu of, all other pilot car requirements for the
10	super load movement.

12	Section 5. Section 4968(a.1)(3) of Title 75 is amended, <
13	subsection (a.2) is amended by adding paragraphs and subsection
14	(b) is amended by adding definitions to read:
15	§ 4968. Permit for movement during course of manufacture.
16	(a.1) General rule. An annual permit may be issued
17	authorizing movement on specified highways of:
18	* * *
19	(3) aircraft refueling vehicles or vehicles and
20	combinations carrying milk, raw coal, flat-rolled steel-
21	coils, steel slabs, hot ingots, a hot box, pulpwood and wood
22	chips, raw water or cryogenic liquid <u>or sugar</u> which exceed
23	the maximum weight specified in Subchapter C while they are
24	in the course of manufacture and under contract with or under-
25	the direct control of the manufacturer, provided that they do-
26	not exceed the maximum height, width or length specified in
27	Subchapter B unless they also qualify under paragraph (1),
28	subject to the provisions in subsection (a.2).
29	(a.2) Specifications
30	* * *

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1	(14) A combination vehicle hauling sugar may be
2	permitted by the department and local authorities to move
3	upon specified highways within their respective jurisdictions
4	a distance not exceeding five miles if the gross weight does
5	not exceed 95,000 pounds and the weight of any nonsteering
6	axle does not exceed 21,000 pounds. No permit may be issued
7	for this type of movement upon an interstate highway.
8	(15) A combination vehicle which is hauling rock salt
9	from a manufacturer may be permitted by the department and
10	local authorities to move upon highways within their
11	respective jurisdictions if the gross weight does not exceed
12	95,000 pounds. No permit may be issued for this type of
13	movement upon an interstate highway. An application to the
14	<u>department for the movement of rock salt shall designate the</u>
15	route the applicant requests to use.
16	(b) Definitions. As used in this section, the following
17	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
18	subsection:

20	"Rock salt." The term shall refer to salt used for de icing
21	and anti-icing of roadways.
22	"Sugar." The term shall refer to granulated raw, semi-
23	refined or refined sugar derived from the processing of sugar
24	cane or sugar beets, requiring further processing and not
25	intended for direct consumption or retail sale.
