- Amending the act of March 28, 1984 (P.L.150, No.28), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the rights of purchasers and
- lessees of defective new motor vehicles," further providing
- for presumption of a reasonable number of attempts.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 6(a) of the act of March 28, 1984
- 8 (P.L.150, No.28), known as the Automobile Lemon Law, amended
- 9 April 12, 2012 (P.L.245, No.33), is amended to read:
- 10 Section 6. Presumption of a reasonable number of attempts.
- 11 (a) General rule. -- It shall be presumed that a reasonable
- 12 number of attempts have been undertaken to repair or correct a
- 13 nonconformity if:
- 14 (1) the same nonconformity has been subject to repair
- 15 three times by the manufacturer, its agents or authorized
- dealers and the nonconformity still exists[; or], other than
- 17 <u>a nonconformity subject to examination or repair pursuant to</u>
- 18 paragraph (3) because it is likely to cause death or serious

- 1 <u>bodily injury if the vehicle is driven and the nonconformity</u>
- 2 still exists;
- 3 (2) the vehicle is out-of-service by reason of any
- 4 nonconformity for a cumulative total of 30 or more calendar
- 5 days[.]; or
- 6 (3) the nonconformity is likely to cause death or
- 7 serious bodily injury if the vehicle is driven, the
- 8 <u>nonconformity has been subject to examination or repair at</u>
- 9 <u>least once by the manufacturer, its agents or authorized</u>
- dealers and the nonconformity still exists.

- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
