INTRODUCED BY VOGEL AND RAFFERTY, MAY 6, 2016

REFERRED TO AGRICULTURE AND RURAL AFFAIRS, MAY 6, 2016

AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for the regulation of pari-mutuel 17 18 thoroughbred horse racing and harness horse racing activities, imposing certain taxes and providing for the 19 disposition of funds from pari-mutuel tickets; and 20 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 21 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of 22 certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 23 determined," in horse race industry reform, further providing 24 for Pennsylvania Breeding Fund. 25 26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

27 hereby enacts as follows:

28 Section 1. Section 2836-D of the act of April 9, 1929 29 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, 30 added February 23, 2016 (P.L.15, No.7), is amended to read: 1 Section 2836-D. Pennsylvania Breeding Fund.

2 Establishment.--There is hereby created a restricted (a) 3 account in the State Racing Fund to be known as the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund which shall consist of the money deposited under 4 section 2834-D and any provision of 4 Pa.C.S. Pt. II (relating 5 to gaming) and which shall be distributed by the commission. 6 7 (b) Awards from the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund. -- The 8 commission shall distribute money from the Pennsylvania Breeding 9 Fund as follows:

10 (1) An award of 30% of the purse earned by every 11 Pennsylvania-bred registered thoroughbred racing horse sired 12 in this Commonwealth by a registered Pennsylvania sire at the 13 time of conception of the Pennsylvania-bred registered 14 thoroughbred racing horse sired in this Commonwealth, or an award of 20% of the purse earned by every <u>Pennsylvania-bred</u> 15 registered thoroughbred racing horse [sired] in this 16 17 Commonwealth sired by a nonregistered sire, which finishes 18 first, second or third in any race conducted by a licensed 19 racing entity under this article shall be paid to the breeder 20 of said <u>Pennsylvania-bred</u> registered thoroughbred racing 21 horse [sired] in this Commonwealth. A single award under this 22 paragraph may not exceed 1% of the total annual fund money.

23 (2)An award of 10% of the purse earned by any 24 Pennsylvania-bred registered thoroughbred racing horse sired 25 in this Commonwealth which finishes first, second or third in 26 any race conducted by a licensed racing entity under this 27 article shall be paid to the owner of the registered 28 Pennsylvania sire which regularly stood in Pennsylvania at 29 the time of conception of the Pennsylvania-bred thoroughbred 30 racing horse sired in this Commonwealth. A single award under

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1 this paragraph may not exceed 0.5% of the total annual fund 2 money.

3 (3)An award of 10% of the purse earned by any Pennsylvania-bred registered thoroughbred racing horse 4 5 [sired] in this Commonwealth which finishes first in any race 6 conducted by a licensed racing entity under this article not 7 restricting entry to <u>a Pennsylvania-bred</u> registered 8 [thoroughbreds] thoroughbred racing horse [sired] in this 9 Commonwealth shall be paid to the licensed owner of said Pennsylvania-bred registered thoroughbred horse [sired] in 10 this Commonwealth at the time of winning. A single award 11 12 under this paragraph may not exceed 0.5% of the total annual 13 fund money.

14 Purses from Pennsylvania Breeding Fund.--Up to one-fifth (C) 15 of the total of the estimated Pennsylvania Breeding Fund money 16 remaining each year after the deduction of expenses related to 17 the administration and development of the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund program and the payment of breeder, stallion and owner 18 19 awards, shall be divided among the licensed racing entities that 20 conduct thoroughbred horse race meetings in direct proportion to 21 the rate by which each licensed racing entity generated the fund 22 money during the previous year to be used solely for purses for 23 Pennsylvania Breeding Fund stakes races which restrict entry to 24 a Pennsylvania-bred registered thoroughbred racing horse [sired] 25 in this Commonwealth.

(d) Remaining funds.--The Pennsylvania Breeding Fund money
remaining following disbursements as directed in subsections (b)
(1), (2) and (3) and (c) shall be divided among the licensed
racing entities that conduct thoroughbred horse race meetings in
direct proportion to the rate by which each licensed racing

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1 entity generated the fund money during the previous year to be 2 used for purses as follows:

3 (1) Claiming and nonclaiming Pennsylvania Breeding Fund
4 races which restrict entry to <u>Pennsylvania-bred</u> registered
5 thoroughbred racing horses [sired] in this Commonwealth.

6 Claiming and nonclaiming Pennsylvania Breeding Fund (2) 7 races which prefer Pennsylvania-bred registered thoroughbred 8 racing horses [sired] in this Commonwealth as starters. In 9 these races, should eight or more Pennsylvania-bred 10 registered thoroughbred racing horses [sired] in this 11 Commonwealth pass the entry box, the race shall be considered 12 closed to horses other than <u>Pennsylvania-bred</u> registered 13 thoroughbred racing horses [sired] in this Commonwealth. 14 Funds not expended. -- Pennsylvania Breeding Fund money (e) due to licensed racing entities, as outlined in subsections (c) 15 16 and (d), but not expended during the calendar year may be 17 carried forth in the fund on the accounts of the licensed racing 18 entities to be expended during the succeeding year in addition 19 to the racing entities' fund money annually due to them for 20 purses.

21 (e.1) Committee.--There is hereby established the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund Advisory Committee within the 22 23 commission. The committee shall consist of five individuals, who 24 are residents of this Commonwealth, to be appointed by the 25 commission by June 1 of each year based on the recommendation of 26 the groups identified in this subsection. If a member other than a commissioner has not been recommended by June 1 of each year, 27 28 the commission shall make an appointment for the organization 29 failing to so recommend a member of the committee. The committee shall assist and advise the commission on the regulation of 30

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horse racing breeding issues under this article but shall have 1 2 no power in administering the fund. Members of the advisory 3 committee shall not receive compensation or reimbursements for participation on the committee. The committee shall consist of 4 the following members: 5

6 Two members representing the Pennsylvania Horse (1)7 Breeders' Association.

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(2)One member representing licensed racing entities. 9 One member representing the association representing (3) horsemen racing in Pennsylvania. 10

One member of the commission. (4)

12 (f) Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association.--The 13 commission shall contract with the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' 14 Association as the organization responsible for the registration 15 and records of Pennsylvania-bred thoroughbred racing horses 16 [sired] in this Commonwealth. The Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' 17 Association shall advise the commission when called upon and 18 shall determine the qualifications for Pennsylvania-bred 19 thoroughbred racing horses [sired] in this Commonwealth and 20 Pennsylvania sires. Registration and records of the association shall be official records of the Commonwealth and shall be 21 22 subject to the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as 23 the Right-to-Know Law. At the close of each calendar year, the 24 Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association shall submit to the 25 commission for its approval an itemized budget of projected 26 expenses for the ensuing year relating to the administration and 27 development of the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund Program. The 28 commission shall reimburse the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' 29 Association for those expenses actually incurred in the administration and development of the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund 30

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Program from the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund, no more than on a
 quarterly basis.
 Section 2. The amendment of section 2836-D of the act shall
 apply retroactively to January 1, 2016.

5 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
