## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in public safety, providing for prescribing opioids to minors; imposing powers and duties on certain Commonwealth agencies and on the Legislative Reference Bureau; and imposing penalties.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter in Part III to read:
10	<u>CHAPTER 52</u>
11	PRESCRIBING OPIOIDS TO MINORS

14	5202. Administration.

18	<u>§ 5201. Definitions.</u>

1	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
2	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
3	context clearly indicates otherwise:
4	"Authorized adult." An adult to whom a minor's parent or
5	guardian has given written LEGAL authorization to consent to the <
6	minor's medical treatment.
7	"Bureau." The Bureau of Professional and Occupational
8	<u>Affairs.</u>
9	"Controlled substance." A drug, substance or immediate
10	precursor included in Schedules # II through V of section 4 of <
11	the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The
12	Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
13	"Licensing agency BOARD." A Commonwealth agency which <
14	licenses, registers or certifies a prescriber.
15	"Medical emergency." A situation which, in a prescriber's
16	good faith professional judgment, creates an immediate threat of
17	serious risk to the life or physical health of a minor.
18	"Minor." An individual under 18 years of age. The term
19	excludes an individual who is emancipated by:
20	(1) marrying;
21	(2) entering the armed forces of the United States;
22	(3) being employed and self-sustaining; or
23	(4) otherwise being independent from the care and
24	control of the individual's parent, guardian or custodian.
25	"Opioid." Any of the following:
26	(1) A preparation or derivative of opium.
27	(2) A synthetic narcotic that has opiate-like effects
28	but is not derived from opium.
29	(3) A group of naturally occurring peptides that bind at
30	or otherwise influence opiate receptors, including opioid

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1	agonist.
2	"Prescriber." An individual who is authorized under the laws
3	of this Commonwealth to distribute, dispense or administer a
4	controlled substance containing an opioid in the course of
5	professional practice in this Commonwealth. The term does not
6	<u>include a veterinarian.</u>
7	<u>§ 5202. Administration.</u>
8	(a) Licensing agencies BOARDSA licensing agency may BOARD <
9	SHALL administer this chapter as to prescribers under its
10	jurisdiction.
11	(b) Bureau
12	(1) The bureau shall, in cooperation with the licensing
13	agencies BOARDS, prescribe the form under section 5204(a)(3) <
14	(relating to procedure).
15	(2) The bureau shall transmit notice of the availability
16	of the form to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
17	publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
18	<u>§ 5203. Prohibition.</u>
19	(a) ProscriptionA prescriber may not do any of the
20	following:
21	(1) Prescribe to a minor a controlled substance
22	containing an opioid unless the prescriber complies with
23	section 5204 (relating to procedure).
24	(2) Except as set forth in subsection (b) and subject to
25	section 5204(c)(1), prescribe to a minor more than a seven-
26	day supply of a controlled substance containing an opioid.
27	(b) ExceptionNotwithstanding subsection (a)(1), a
28	prescriber may prescribe to a minor more than a seven-day supply
29	of a controlled substance containing an opioid if any of the
30	following apply:

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1	(1) In the professional medical judgment of the
2	prescriber, more than a seven-day supply of a controlled
3	substance containing an opioid is required to stabilize the
4	minor's acute medical condition. In order for this paragraph
5	to apply, the prescriber must:
6	(i) document the acute medical condition in the
7	minor's record with the prescriber; and
8	(ii) indicate the reason why a non-opioid
9	alternative is not appropriate to address the acute
10	medical condition.
11	(2) The prescription is for:
12	(i) management of pain associated with cancer;
13	(ii) use in palliative or hospice care; or
14	(iii) management of chronic pain not associated with
15	<u>cancer.</u>
16	<u>§ 5204. Procedure.</u>
17	(a) RequirementsExcept as set forth in subsection (b),
18	before issuing a minor the first prescription in a single course
19	of treatment for a controlled substance containing an opioid,
20	regardless of whether the dosage is modified during that course
21	of treatment, a prescriber shall do all of the following:
22	(1) Assess whether the minor: <
23	(i) has ever suffered or is currently suffering from
24	a mental health or substance abuse disorder; and
25	(ii) has taken or is currently taking prescription
26	drugs for treatment of a SUBSTANCE ABUSE disorder under <
27	<del>subparagraph (i)</del> .
28	(2) Discuss with the minor and the minor's parent or
29	guardian or with an authorized adult all of the following:
30	(i) The risks of addiction and overdose associated

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1	with the controlled substance containing an opioid.
2	(ii) The increased risk of addiction to controlled
3	substances to individuals suffering from mental or
4	<u>substance abuse disorders.</u>
5	(iii) The dangers of taking a controlled substance
6	containing an opioid with benzodiazepines, alcohol or
7	other central nervous system depressants.
8	(iv) Other information in the patient counseling
9	information section of the labeling for controlled
10	substances containing an opioid required under 21 C.F.R.
11	201.57(c)(18) (relating to specific requirements on
12	content and format of labeling for human prescription
13	drug and biological products described in § 201.56(b)
14	<u>(1)).</u>
15	(3) Obtain written consent for the prescription from
16	the minor's parent or guardian or from an authorized adult.
17	The prescriber shall record the consent on the form under
18	section 5202(b)(1) (relating to administration). The
19	following apply:
20	(i) The form must contain all of the following:
21	(A) The BRAND NAME OR GENERIC name and quantity <
22	of the controlled substance containing an opioid
23	being prescribed and the amount of the initial dose.
24	(B) A statement indicating that a controlled
25	substance is a drug or other substance that the
26	United States Drug Enforcement Administration has
27	identified as having a potential for abuse.
28	(C) A statement certifying that the prescriber
29	engaged in the discussion under paragraph (2).
30	(D) The number of refills authorized by the

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1	prescription UNDER SECTION 5203(B) (RELATING TO <
2	PROHIBITION).
3	(E) The signature of the minor's parent or
4	guardian or of an authorized adult and the date of
5	signing.
6	(ii) The form shall be maintained in the minor's
7	record with the prescriber.
8	(b) ExceptionSubsection (a) does not apply if the minor's
9	treatment with a controlled substance containing an opioid meets
10	any of the following criteria:
11	(1) The treatment is associated with or incident to a
12	medical emergency as documented in the minor's medical
13	record.
14	(2) In the prescriber's professional judgment, complying
15	with subsection (a) with respect to the minor's treatment
16	would be detrimental to the minor's health or safety. The
17	prescriber shall document in the minor's medical record the
18	factor or factors which the prescriber believed constituted
19	cause for not fulfilling the requirements of subsection (a).
20	(c) Limited prescriptionIf the individual who signs the
21	<pre>consent form under subsection (a)(3) is an AUTHORIZED adult &lt;</pre>
22	authorized to consent to the minor's medical treatment, the <
23	prescriber:
24	(1) may prescribe not more than a single, 72-hour
25	supply; and
26	(2) shall indicate on the prescription the quantity that
27	is to be dispensed pursuant to the prescription.
28	<u>§ 5205. Penalties.</u>
29	<u>A violation of this chapter subjects a prescriber to </u>
30	administrative sanctions by the provider's licensing agency <
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## 1 BOARD under the applicable statute.

2	Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
3	(1) The following provisions shall take effect
4	immediately:
5	(i) The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. § 5201.
6	(ii) The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. § 5202.
7	(iii) This section.
8	(2) The remainder of this act shall take effect upon
9	publication of the notice under 35 Pa.C.S. § 5202(b)(2).

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
