## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of April 13 through 19, 2015, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the Holocaust" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, From 1933 to 1945, six million Jews were murdered in
- 4 the Nazi Holocaust as part of a systematic pogrom of genocide,
- 5 and millions of other people perished as victims of Nazism; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should always
- 7 remember the atrocities committed by the Nazis and continually
- 8 rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all
- 9 people so that such horrors are never repeated; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth should remain
- 11 eternally vigilant against all tyranny and recognize that
- 12 bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and
- WHEREAS, April 15, 2015, also recognized as 27 Nisan 5775 in
- 14 the Hebrew calendar, has been designated internationally as a
- 15 Day of Remembrance of Victims of the Nazi Holocaust, known as
- 16 Yom Hashoah; and

- 1 WHEREAS, It is appropriate for the people of this
- 2 Commonwealth to join in the international commemoration;
- 3 therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of April 13
- 5 through 19, 2015, as "Days of Remembrance of the Victims of the
- 6 Holocaust" in Pennsylvania, in memory of the victims of the
- 7 Holocaust in the hope that we may strive to overcome prejudice
- 8 and inhumanity through education, vigilance and resistance.
