## A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of November 29 through December 5, 2015, as "Jewish Community Center Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, The Jewish Community Center Movement started in 1854
4	when the first Hebrew Young Men's Literary Association opened
5	its doors in Baltimore, Maryland, to provide support for Jewish
6	immigrants, help ensure Jewish continuity and provide a place
7	for celebration; and
8	WHEREAS, Similar associations opened soon after, serving as
9	libraries, cultural centers and settlement houses; and
10	WHEREAS, The first Jewish community center in Pennsylvania
11	was founded in 1875 in Philadelphia, now known as the Charles
12	and Elizabeth Gershman Y; and
13	WHEREAS, There are eleven Jewish community centers throughout
14	this Commonwealth that serve Pennsylvanians and their
15	surrounding communities in areas including Allentown, Altoona,
16	Harrisburg, Lancaster, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Scranton,
17	Wyoming Valley and York; and

1 WHEREAS, The eleven Jewish community centers serve more than 2 50,000 Pennsylvanians of all denominations each year; and 3 WHEREAS, Jewish community centers continue to foster the same growth and advancement of its members as it did more than 110 4 5 years ago by offering arts and culture, English as a second language, preschool, summer camps, sports and athletics, 6 programming for older adults and many other programs for all 7 8 ages, backgrounds and interests; and

9 WHEREAS, The year 2015 marks the 100th anniversary of the 10 founding of the Harrisburg Jewish Community Center; and 11 WHEREAS, In the 1840s, Jewish immigrants from Germany and 12 England settled in central Pennsylvania; and

13 WHEREAS, The Jewish settlers regularly met for Sabbath under 14 the leadership of Lazarus Bernhard starting in 1853; and 15 WHEREAS, In 1915, the Harrisburg Jewish Community Center, 16 then known as the Young Men's Hebrew and Kindred Association, 17 was founded by Leon Lowengard; and

18 WHEREAS, The center has been located in the same building 19 since 1956; and

20 WHEREAS, The Harrisburg Jewish Community Center and the 21 Jewish community centers across this Commonwealth provide a 22 central location that promotes unity within the community, as 23 well as the values of Jewish life, and serves as a cultural, 24 financial and physical support system for their organizations 25 and for their members; and

26 WHEREAS, The 100th anniversary celebration of the Harrisburg 27 Jewish Community Center will take place all year with a 28 celebratory event each month; and

29 WHEREAS, The celebration will conclude with the Big Night30 event on Saturday, December 5, 2015; therefore be it
