A RESOLUTION

Recognizing December 1, 2015, as "World AIDS Day," fostering 1 public awareness of the HIV/AIDS pandemic and remembering the 2 millions of individuals diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and the 3 global challenges associated with eradicating this deadly 5 disease. 6 WHEREAS, "World AIDS Day" has been commemorated annually since 1988, and June 5th of this year marked the 34th 7 8 anniversary of the first reported AIDS case; and 9 WHEREAS, The World AIDS Campaign was launched in 1997 by UNAIDS, the joint United Nations program on HIV/AIDS, and the 10 11 mission of UNAIDS is to raise public awareness of HIV/AIDS and 12 to promote nonjudgmental and nondiscriminatory access to HIV prevention, treatment and care for all human beings; and 13 WHEREAS, UNAIDS reports that there were 36.9 million people 14 15 worldwide living with HIV at the end of 2014; and 16 WHEREAS, In 2014, UNAIDS reported 1.2 million AIDS-related 17 deaths, a decrease compared to the 1.8 million AIDS-related 18 deaths reported in 2009; and WHEREAS, The 2015 "World AIDS Day" theme is "The Time to Act 19

- 1 is Now," which signifies that there is no better time than
- 2 "World AIDS Day" to recommit to the goal of achieving an AIDS-
- 3 free generation, to celebrate the tremendous progress that has
- 4 been made in expanding access to HIV prevention, treatment and
- 5 care services and to focus on the potential to achieve
- 6 sustainable epidemic control and end AIDS as a public health
- 7 threat; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 9 Prevention (CDC), nearly 1.2 million people in the United States
- 10 are living with HIV and 12.8% of those people are unaware of
- 11 their infection; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Although African Americans represent approximately
- 13 12% of the United States population, they represented nearly 44%
- 14 of new HIV infections in 2010, while Latinos make up only 16% of
- 15 the United States population but represented 21% of new HIV
- 16 infections in 2010, and men who have sex with men accounted for
- 17 63% of all new HIV infections in 2010 although this group makes
- 18 up only 4% of the United States population; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is ranked 10th highest in the United
- 20 States in cumulative reported AIDS cases, with the percentage of
- 21 new HIV cases being highest among those 20 to 29 years of age;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Department of Health estimated that
- 24 28% of the 35,219 HIV/AIDS patients in this Commonwealth had
- 25 unmet needs for HIV primary medical care in 2009; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The overall number of persons in Pennsylvania living
- 27 with AIDS has been consistently rising, but the overall number
- 28 of AIDS-related deaths in Pennsylvania has been declining
- 29 through 2007, a trend thought to be largely a result of the
- 30 administration of highly active antiretroviral therapy as well

- 1 as other improvements in AIDS survival; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize December 1, 2015, as
- 3 "World AIDS Day" to foster public awareness of the HIV/AIDS
- 4 pandemic and to remember the millions of individuals diagnosed
- 5 with HIV/AIDS and the global challenges associated with
- 6 eradicating this deadly disease.
